**Summary of testimony presented in support:**

**Representative Le**

- This gives Greenland a vote on the Executive Board of the Pease Development Commission.
- Greenland abuts Pease, which is now a regional economic zone.
- All of the representatives and senators serving these communities are aligned in support of this.
- Pease has developed into a powerful economic zone.
- In 1993 the Pease Development Commission was enacted by the legislature with representatives appointed from Portsmouth, Newington, and Strafford County.
- Pease now has over 200 tenants from a variety of industries including restaurants, air ports, harbors, law firms, and more.
- In the early 1990s Greenland was largely agrarian, but the recent census shows their population has grown by 35%.



- The town has changed significantly.
- Having members present and voting at the Board is important to Greenland.

**Representative Malloy (provided written testimony)**

- Greenland is interested in having a voice in what is going on in Pease.
- They would like to help and be involved in the development.
- Greenland has the intention to be involved in other regional efforts.

**Senator Fuller Clark and Senator Sherman (provided written testimony)**

- Provided an amendment.
- The bill started out adding one member to the Board from Greenland.
- This is currently a seven-person Board that has been incredibly effective.
- The growth of Pease has been remarkable, and this is in part due to the work of the Board.
- Adding one member of the Board results in an even number.
- The proposal coming from the House would bring the number of Board members to nine.
- After speaking with members of the Board, they came up with this amendment to give Greenland half a vote.
- The amendment still gives Greenland a voice and representation.
- Greenland is a smaller abutter in terms of land it represents than Newington and Portsmouth.
- This half of a vote could be seen as being proportional.
- The smoothest way to dovetail this transition would be to enact this change when Peter Loughlin's term expires, which is the same as effective date.
- Mr. Loughlin has served in the past as Greenland's attorney and currently represents half Portsmouth and half Newington on the Board.
- This would keep the Board's members at seven while still giving Greenland representation.
- This amendment is supported by the Board and the Greenland board of selectmen.
- In section 'f' it says one member appointed jointly. The original reason for giving Portsmouth a seat and a half was because two thirds of the land that makes up Pease is in Portsmouth.
- Most of Pease that has been built out is in the Portsmouth section.
- Portsmouth is willing to give up half a seat.
- Pease's success has been used as a model across the country and it is continuing to expand.
- This growth has had an impact on the surrounding area, including Greenland and therefore they need to be able to work with the Board.
- Senator Reagan asked about Newington having a disproportionate number of votes on the Board.
  - Senator Sherman answered that the rationale for that is that Newington has the major proportion that is still to be developed. The Portsmouth component has already been developed.
- Senator Rosenwald asked if we can bind a future legislature with the effective date.

- Senator Fuller Clark responded that we can as long as it does not impact the budget.
- Senator Chandley pointed out that Greenland could still be without a member.
  - Senator Sherman responded that the representative would have to be someone who would be willing to represent both Newington and Greenland. In general, these people have expertise in the field and do not necessarily come from the town they represent.
  - Senator Fuller Clark answered that the Board was unhappy with expanding the membership, so this was a compromise. The Board has been so successful that they do not want to disrupt that.

**Matt Scruton (Greenland)**

- The board of selectman and the town are in full support of this bill.
- Greenland is concerned about PFAs chemicals from Pease which is an additional reason for why they want to have a seat.

**Vaughn Morgan (provided written testimony)**

- Greenland embraces the growth of Pease and it has had a regional impact on the surrounding towns.
- There are 3,223 resident voters in Greenland who abut Pease and are impacted by its development.
- This will give those voters a voice on the Board.

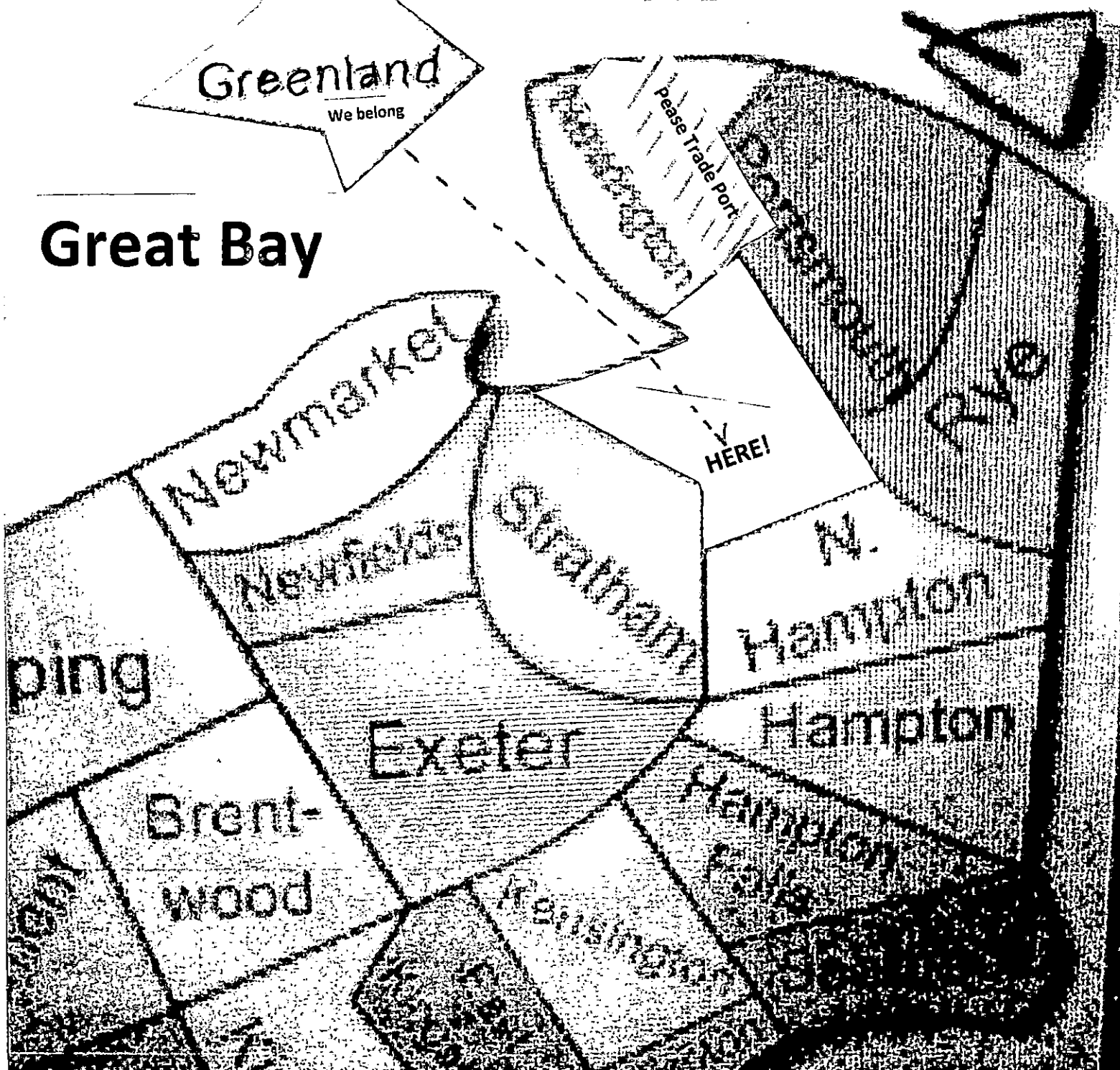

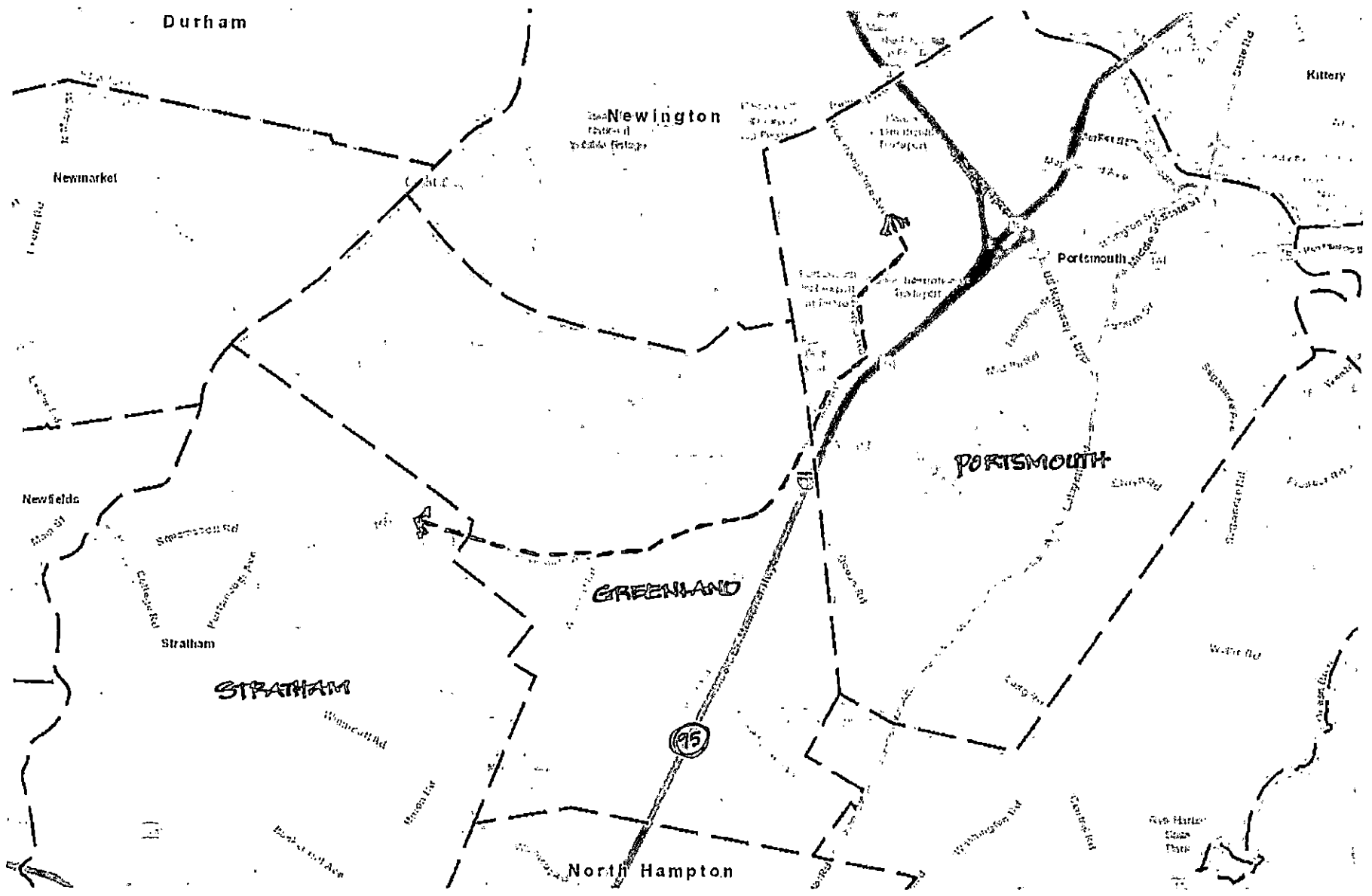
