#### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Nineteen

AN ACT repealing the moorings appeals board.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Mooring of Boats on Public Waters; Removal of Moorings; Appeals. Amend RSA 270:66, II to 2 read as follows:

II. The director or his agents shall remove or cause the removal of a mooring and any boat attached to it when the removal of the mooring, mooring component, or boat is authorized under paragraph I. The person who [owns or] controls the mooring shall have the right to request a hearing before the [appeals board as established in] commissioner of the department of safety pursuant to RSA 270:69.

8 2 Mooring of Boats on Public Waters; Appeals of Moorings Decisions. Amend RSA 270:69 to 9 read as follows:

10 270:69 Appeals [Board-Established]. [There is hereby established a moorings appeals board 11 which] The commissioner of the department of safety shall hear and decide appeals of any 12 decisions made under this subdivision. The [moorings appeals board] commissioner shall conduct 13 [its] appeals hearings according to the provisions of RSA 541-A for adjudicative proceedings. [The 14 board shall consist of 3 persons to be nominated by the governor with approval of the council for 15 terms of 3 years each. The initial appointments to the board shall be in staggered terms as 16 determined by the governor and council.]

17 3 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

- There are eight lakes in NH where property owners are required to get a permit in order to get a mooring.
- A mooring is a different way to keep a boat from moving instead of a dock.
- There is a moorings application permit process where the property owner applies for a permit.
- The appeals board is only designated to hear appeals of denials.
- Over the past 15years there has only been one request of the board and it was not heard by them because it was on a revocation and not a denial.
- All three members of the board are deceased, and the governor has not nominated anyone to replace them.
- Under this bill, appeals would go through the Department of Safety's hearings process as established by RSA 541-A, where appeals would be heard by an attorney.

RE: HB 244 An act repealing the moorings appeals board.

Dear Chair Carson and Members of the Committee:

The Lakes Management Advisory Committee (LMAC) appreciates the opportunity to comment on House Bill 244, which eliminates the current moorings appeals board and instead assigns mooring appeals directly to the commissioner of the department of safety. The LMAC supports this bill with the following comments and concerns.

The LMAC understands that there has not been an appeal to the moorings appeals board in 12 years and that all three members of the moorings board are now deceased. Based on testimony presented at the January 16 LMAC meeting from persons believed to be knowledgeable of the bill's language and intent, it was the LMAC's understanding that HB 244 would assign mooring appeals to the Department of Safety's adjudicative appeals board. In this context the LMAC members voted for, and previously issued a letter in support of HB244.

The LMAC supports language in HB 244 to eliminate an inactive board. The LMAC supports replacing that board with an appeals process that recognizes and considers the wide range of issues that play a role in the safe, equitable, and potentially environmentally sensitive conditions associated with mooring fields. To this end, the LMAC understands that a mechanism for moorings permits, hearings, and appeals already exists at the Department of Safety which conducts its hearings according to provisions of RSA 541-A for adjudicative hearings.

The LMAC is a legislatively created body charged to work with the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) to administer RSA 483-A, the Lakes Management and Protection Program. The Governor and Council appointed Committee is comprised of 19 members representing academia, business, conservation organizations, lake associations, tourism, fish and game commission, marine trades, realtors, municipal government as well as several state agencies. Among its other responsibilities, the LMAC reviews legislation relevant to the Program and the state's lakes and ponds, and advises the NHDES Commissioner on the merits of such legislation. In conclusion, the LMAC supports language in HB 244 to eliminate an inactive board, and requests that HB 244 clearly delegate the appeals process to the Department of Safety adjudicative hearings process.
