Summary of testimony presented in support:

Representative Long

- Every year there are arguments between the Aldermen and the School Board in Manchester over the school budget.
- Now that he is a School Board member he sees their real funding needs.
- Currently there is no accountability about budget matters.
- It is time to let the citizens of Manchester decide if they would like the School Board to be autonomous where the budget is concerned.
- This bill will allow them to come up with a charter commission on how they will arrange this process and then the voters will decide at the polls.
- This bill addresses only the school district and not other departments in the town.
- Senator Levesque asked what the Aldermen are saying about this plan.
 Representative Long answered that they are on board with this. There are some that are concerned that the School Board will tax them out of their house. In other places where this has happened it took a couple of budget cycles before the people were comfortable with it.
- Senator Birdsell commented that the school budgets keep going up and the town has no control wouldn't this be the same situation if you remove the Aldermen from the budget process. Representative Long replied that currently it looks like both the Aldermen and the School Board are incompetent for fighting over the budget. Changing the process gives the voters the choice to implement it and still have the option of voting out any School Board member who may be negligent with the responsibility. They are not accountable right now this legislation would hold them accountable to the voters.
- Senator Gray commented that currently the city of Manchester has a charter and passing this would seem like the legislators are taking away local control.

Representative Long answered that every time they fight over the budget a Representative has to draft a bill to help the situation. This will give more local control by not having to ask the state house for permission to deal with the school budget the way the voters want.

- Senator Gray asked if it would make sense to make some way for the people to petition for what they want this bill allows the voters to decide who has autonomy over the budget this allows the voters to decide
- Senator Levesque asked if other towns have done this there are some, Concord and Keene in some ways
- Senator Levesque clarified that currently the Alderman have to approve the school board budget. Representative Long replied ves.
- Senator Levesque also clarified that this bill will allow the school board to be autonomous and it is enabling legislation. Representative Long answered that was correct.
- Senator Levesque asked if currently, if the School Board does not give the Aldermen a budget that fits what they have approved they have to cut programs. He answered that was correct also.
- Senator Levesque asked if that has put Manchester is a negative situation.
 Representative Long stated that yes, it causes them to struggle over cuts and increases.
- Senator Levesque asked when the vote would be to enable this legislation.

 Representative Long answered in November of 2020 the voters would decide.

Bradford Cook - NH Ballot Law Commission, Chairman

- If this Legislation went before the voters, it would be letting them decide if the School Board could be autonomous and not telling them.
- Senator Gray commented that his objection is that he could do charter changes in his town and it would go before the citizens and asked if Manchester could do the same thing. Mr. Cook explained that when he was in office the School Board of Manchester had to take the city to court to make changes. With this legislation the voters would be voting on a new process.
