Summary of testimony presented:

#### Representative Kermit Williams, Hills. 4:

- Representative Williams stated that in the past few years the legislature has
  made accommodations to the law to help local businesses who make spirits,
  beer, and wine. He said a lot of these businesses are doing well, but still
  struggle with promotion, and lack the marketing to promote tourism.
- He stated that this bill looks at the next step for alcohol tourism, as NY and PA
  have taken similar steps. He said for example, on highways in NY there are big
  signs that state a winery or brewery is ahead.
- He believes that by promoting wineries, breweries, and distilleries it will help to promote other industries like hotels and restaurants.
- He said that the commission will consist of multiple stakeholders and will look at possible statewide promotions like highway signs.
