Summary of testimony presented:

### Senator David Watters, District 4:

- Senator Watters explained that this bill is about fundamental liberties, and how the state needs to ensure that low wage employees have a right to their own labor.
- Senator Watters said the practice of non-compete agreements puts a restraint on the free flow of labor.
- He also cited the suit against Jimmy Johns in New York in which the NY Attorney General said that non-compete agreements hurt vulnerable workers.
- Senator Watters further explained that this bill is limited to a certain set of employees that make 200% of the federal minimum wage or lower.

- Senator Watters also mentioned that there are provisions in law to protect trade secrets, but he finds it hard to imagine that if someone only pays a worker twice the minimum wage that the worker has a lot of trade secrets.
- Finally, Senator Watters stated that there is a similar bill in the House and that he spoke to Republican leaders in the House and they seemed more inclined to support the Senate version.

Senator French then asked if Senator Watters knew of any companies that require employees to sign non-compete agreements.

• Senator Watters said companies such as Jimmy Johns, salons, title loan companies do and that overall he's seen that non-competes are quite common.
