# REYNOLDS AMERICAN TESTIMONY ON HB 1624-FN HOUSE COMMERCE AND CONSUMER AFFAIRS COMMITTEE JANUARY 15, 2020

Good morning, Mr. Chairman and members of the committee. Thank you for the opportunity to provide industry input on HB 1624-FN.

Earlier this week in a hearing on HB 1662, you heard from numerous witnesses about the benefits of ensuring that New Hampshire state law and regulations are kept consistent with changes in federal law. In the case of HB 1662, which involves the legal age for purchase of tobacco products and e-cigarettes, the testimony of state agencies and other stakeholders was strongly in favor of raising the state age from 19 years of age to the new federal floor of 21, in order to make sure that businesses, patrons and law enforcement avoid serious confusion over the issue.

Passing the state's own blanket moratorium, as this legislation proposes and as other states have demonstrated, runs the risk of imposing an ineffective solution. Such a moratorium will likely expand the black-market sales of unsafe products, products which are now recognized as being at the root of the recent widespread health problems related to vaping.

Respectfully, we would request that the committee consider amending HB 1624-FN to be consistent with federal procedures and guidelines on this matter. Currently, the Federal Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has issued guidelines for a Pre-Market Tobacco Application (PMTA) process. The process states that virtually all cartridge-based products except tobacco and menthol will be off the market as of Feb. 8, 2020, pending submission of new PMTA requests by a May 11, 2020, deadline. The FDA will review all applications, and only products that have been found to be safe can fully re-enter the market following federal certification. HB 1624-FN relies on the commissioner of the state Department of Health and Human Services to determine product safety, with certification by the secretary of state and the director of legislative services. We believe these duties are best assigned to the FDA, which has both the resources and expertise to more effectively carry out the process and guarantee public safety.

We stand ready and willing to work with the committee on amendments to HB 1624-FN that will provide appropriate and meaningful solutions.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 Moratorium on the Sale of E-Cigarettes. There shall be a moratorium on the sale of e2 cigarettes until the commissioner of the department of health and human services determines that
3 they are not a cause of illness or death as certified by the commissioner to the secretary of state and
4 the director of legislative services. For the purposes of this section, "e-cigarette" means any
5 electronic smoking device composed of a mouthpiece, a heating element, a battery, and electronic
6 circuits that may or may not contain nicotine. This term shall include such devices whether they are
7 manufactured as e-cigarettes, e-cigars, or e-pipes, or under any other product name.

2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

### METHODOLOGY:

This bill establishes a moratorium on the sale of e-cigarettes until the commissioner of the Department of Health and Human Services determines that they are not a cause of illness or death. The Department of Health and Human Services states that the proposed moratorium may result in increased demand for the Tobacco Quitline Program, as individuals previously using e-cigarettes as a transitional measure may try to quit smoking via other means. Based on moratoriums in other states, the Department anticipates a 24 percent increase in demand for Quitline services during the first year of the moratorium. Based on anticipated Quitline costs of \$156,526, this would result in a \$37,566 increase in the first year of the moratorium. Additionally, based on anticipated annual costs of \$133,268 for approved tobacco cessation medication for the uninsured, Medicare, and Medicaid populations, the Department expects an increase of \$31,984 in costs for these services. These costs would be paid for with a combination of state and federal Medicaid funds. The combined total of \$69,550 per year (shown in the table above) assumes the moratorium will take effect in the beginning of FY 2021 and remain in effect through FY 2023.

The Department of Revenue Administration notes that the moratorium may result in a revenue decrease, as the State's tobacco tax is scheduled to apply to e-cigarettes as of January 1, 2020. For informational purposes, the current FY 2020/21 operating budget assumes that the tobacco tax applied to e-cigarettes will generate a total of \$5.7 million in FY 2021 (\$3.2 million for the state general fund, and \$2.5 million for the education trust fund).
