AMENDED ANALYSIS

This bill requires certain places of public accommodation to install and maintain at least one diaper changing station that is accessible to all genders when the facility is open to the public. Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 New Section; Places of Public Accommodation; Diaper Changing Station Required. Amend 2 RSA 155 by inserting after section 39-d the following new section:
- 3 155:39-e Public Accommodations Constructed After January 1, 2021; Diaper Changing 4 Stations.
 - I. This section applies to any new building or facility proposed to be constructed specifically as a place of public accommodation on or after January 1, 2021. This section also applies to any single renovation of an existing building or facility which is proposed to be constructed on or after January 1, 2021, if the cost of such renovation exceeds \$50,000.
 - II. A person, private firm, organization, or corporation that owns or manages a commercial place of public accommodation subject to this section shall install and maintain at least one diaper changing station that is accessible to all genders when the facility is open to the public.
 - III. A facility shall ensure that the entrance to each diaper changing station has conspicuous signage indicating the location of the station, and, if the facility has a central directory, shall ensure that the central directory indicates the location of the diaper changing station.
 - IV. For purposes of this section "diaper changing station" means a table or other device suitable for changing the diaper of a child 3 years of age or younger.
- V. This section shall also be enforced by the building inspector as provided in RSA 676:11-18 13.
- 2 Repeal. RSA 155:39-e, relative to diaper changing stations in places of public accommodation, is repealed.
 - 3 Contingency. Section 2 of this act shall take effect on the date that the chairperson of the building code review board certifies to the director of the office of legislative services that, pursuant to RSA 155-A:10, V, the state building code review board has adopted, and the legislature has
- 24 ratified, a rule to amend the state building code that incorporates the requirements of RSA 155:39-e.
- If the board does not adopt such a rule, or such a rule is not ratified by the legislature, section 2 of this act shall not take effect.
- 27 4 Effective Date.
 - I. Section 2 of this act shall take effect as provided in section 3 of this act.
- 29 II. The remainder of this act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

Summary of testimony presented in support: Representative Fenton

- This is a basic needs bill.
- In 2016 the Bathrooms Accessible in Every Situation (BABIES) Act was passed requiring that all federal buildings have baby changing stations in men's and women's restrooms.

- New York has recently passed a similar law requiring new buildings to have equal access to changing stations.
- This bill requires one diaper changing station to be used by any gender in certain public accommodations.
- This will not hamper the existing building code because they are currently going through the amending process.
- This will be for buildings being built starting in 2021 and those buildings undergoing a \$50,000+ renovation.
- If the Building Code Review Board adopts the amendment to the building code, then this statute will be repealed.
- There is a question as to whether or not the amendment will be adopted to the building code, so this bill will ensure it is law either way.
- A diaper changing station costs \$130 on Amazon and takes about 20minutes to install.
- Female only stations may have made sense 60 years ago, but they do not anymore.
- No mom or dad should have to worry about finding a safe and sanitary place to change their child.

Summary of testimony presented in opposition:

Henry Veilleux (NH Lodging and Restaurant Association)

- Does not have an issue with the policy or the goal of this legislation.
- Does have an issue with the process.
- Typically, changes to the building code go first before the Building Code Review Board to ensure they do not conflict with other codes.
- There are space requirements in bathrooms for accessibility.
- This bill side steps that process and puts it directly into statute.
- The House put in a contingency aspect to repeal this if the Building Code Review Board adopts it.
- Asks the Committee re-refers this bill instead and use the bill as pressure on the Building Code Review Board.
- If the Board does not address this issue, then the bill can be moved forward in January.
- This makes sense because the bill does not affect buildings until 2021.

Neutral Information Presented:

William McKinney (NH Building Officials Association)

- Concerned this bill is side stepping the Building Code Review Board.
- Believes amendments to the building code should go through the Building Code Review Board to ensure they do not conflict with other code requirements.
- Feels that putting a dollar value on the renovation requirement is not appropriate.
- Would suggest using 'aggregate area' which is what is currently used in the building code. That states that if someone is doing a certain amount of square footage of a building than that is when this would come into play.

- This bill addresses existing buildings and putting in permanent structures or stationary tables raises concerns about accessibility, egress, and added costs for renovations.
- Senator Rosenwald asked when the Building Code Review Board will take this up.
 - o Representative Fenton submitted his amendment to the Board and it will be introduced this Friday. It will be taken up in the main public hearing of the Board. Typically, they will make the decision at the public hearing and then it would be forwarded on to the legislative body.
- Senator Carson asked if they will have an answer next month
 - o Yes.
- Senator Carson asked for information regarding their decision before June 6th.
 - o Will do.
