AN ACT

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relative to emergency generators in certain senior housing.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 New Section; Senior Housing; Emergency Power Generator. Amend RSA 161-M by inserting after section 4 the following new section:

  161-M:4-a Emergency Power Generator. Any facility as defined in RSA 161-M:2 which receives any state, county, or federal funding for services to its residents shall install and maintain at least one emergency power generator capable of providing a minimum of 48 hours of sufficient electrical power to a designated and accessible common area in the facility for use in heating, cooling, water, lighting, communications, mobility equipment, and medical equipment.
  - 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

#### METHODOLOGY:

This bill requires that senior housing receiving public funding be equipped with emergency power generator service in a common area. The Department of Health and Human Services states the bill will have no impact on Department revenue or expenditures.

Because of its location in RSA 161, which references penalties found in RSA 358-A:6, this bill contains penalties that may have an impact on the New Hampshire judicial and correctional systems. There is no method to determine how many charges would be brought as a result of the changes contained in this bill to determine the fiscal impact on expenditures. However, the entities impacted have provided the potential costs associated with these penalties below.

It should be noted that average case cost estimates for FY 2020 and FY 2021 are based on data that is more than ten years old and does not reflect changes to the courts over that same period of time or the impact these changes may have on processing the various case types. An unspecified misdemeanor can be either class A or class B, with the presumption being a class B misdemeanor.

It should be noted that a person needs to be found indigent and have the potential of being incarcerated to be eligible for indigent defense services. The majority of indigent cases (approximately 85%) are handled by the public defender program, with the remaining cases going to contract attorneys (14%) or assigned counsel (1%).

### Summary of testimony presented in support: Senator Morgan

- This is a small but impactful bill.
- A constituent shared a concern that there are senior housing facilities that have no ability to have heat on, power medical equipment, or allow individuals to charge their cellphones if they lose power.
- This bill will require that any facility that accepts state or federal funds for senior housing have the capability to provide at least 48 hours of generator power for a common area that residents can access.
- Senator Carson asked how these facilities will pay for these generators.
  - Thinks that if these facilities are accepting state funds it is reasonable to require they have the capability of paying for an emergency generator.
     Does not think it is an overwhelming burden to ensure these people have access to heat and emergency power.
- Senator Carson pointed out that many of these facilities get grants and they may not be able to use those funds for a generator. It does become a 28-A issue, where if the state mandates something, the state must pay. Supports the

concept, as these storms can knock out the power for even week. Also raised the concern that there is no definition for senior housing in the bill. Would be willing to work on the bill.

o Would be happy to consider an amendment in terms of the funding and definitions and to work on the bill.
