Summary of testimony presented:

Sen. Birdsell said this bill clarifies who is required to obtain a certificate of boating safety prior to operating certain boats on public waters.

Captain Tim Dunleavy of the State Police Marine Patrol supports the bill. He said it was a request of the Dept. of Safety. This is a housekeeping matter. He explained that in 2001, the legislature passed a law requiring a phase-in for motor boaters requiring anyone operating a boat over 25 horsepower to take safe boating course. It's a nationally approved course and reciprocal with other states. The NH course has certified just under 200,000 boaters. The phase-in was stretched out based on one's date of birth. The current statute is confusing. In reality, everyone needs to complete the course because the phase-in period has come to a conclusion.

Sen. Hennessey asked how one takes the test.

Captain Dunleavy said there are options. One could take a course in person. One can also take the course online, print out a test admittance ticket, and then go to a proctored exam at one of 29 locations around the state. You can register for a time and location, take the test, and get a lifetime card.

Another option for an impulse boat renter from out of state is a 14-day temporary certificate option that can be acquired at 19 different locations. One can go to a marine or to the Dept. and take a 20-minute process to read through the most important laws and then complete a 25 question exam. If the person gets 80% or better, they get a temporary certificate for 14 days. You can only exercise that option once in your lifetime. After that, one needs the full blown certification.
