STATEMENT OF INTENT

The committee is sympathetic to the plight of the residents of Teaberry Lane, but cannot support the request contained in this bill to construct a sound wall along the F.E. Everett Turnpike adjacent to their neighborhood. There is an established criterion for the construction of sound walls across the state and this project does not meet that criterion. While it does exceed the noise, measured in decibels, it does not meet other criteria in the guidelines. The Department of Transportation estimated that to address all locations in the state that are similar to Teaberry Lane the cost would exceed \$400 million. The committee was also cognizant that there is an equity issue if this bill were to be approved outside of the Ten-year Transportation Plan process. Would the General Court be opening itself to a deluge of separate bills from members requesting a sound wall for their constituents? For these reasons the committee recommends this bill be found Inexpedient to Legislate.

Dear Committee Members,

Approximately one year ago, I appeared at your committee to propose a bill that would both raise in a fair manner a significant amount of money for the NH Highway fund, but would also set aside an annual amount for the remediation of the 49 areas in our state that are certified by the DOT as qualified to receive noise abatement measures under their Type II designation.

I was hoping to bring some of the funding to bear for a neighborhood in Portsmouth, the Pannaway Manor, that in the 1980s had been promised noise abatement as part of the widening of the Rt. 95 highway. Even though that blue-collar neighborhood must put up with significant amounts of traffic on a partially

12 lane roadway, and that because of the proximity to the Hampton toll booth is sacrificing so that NH can reap the highest toll revenues of any toll booth, there still is no funding in sight for them.

However, now HB 114 is proposing to legislate noise abatement for a likely relatively well-to-do neighborhood, even though they are most likely not qualified under Type II, and even though no funding for these measures has been identified.

This seems to me to be fiscally irresponsible, and should not be supported unless funding has been identified, e.g. by way of some revenue raising mechanism such as the road usage and registration fee bill that I proposed in 2020. I urge you to oppose this bill, unless it is funded.
