### Testimony

### January 29, 2021

To the State-Federal Veterans Affairs Committee,

I am writing in support of House Bill 117 that, when passed, will bring RSA 110-B:28 into realignment with the intent of that statute concerning the Rules for the Use of Force (RUF). In relevant part, RSA 110-B:28(I) states:

Use of force by any member of the New Hampshire national guard [sic] in duty status, shall be in accordance with the applicable Department of Defense, United States Army, and United States Air Force directives and instructions on rules of engagement and use of force. If mission specific rules of engagement are issued, the specific rules shall be followed, to the degree they deviate from the existing rules, for as long as military members are carrying out duties related to the mission for which the specific rules were issued.

A plain reading of this statute shows its intent is for our state military forces to follow the same RUF as federal military forces. Due the particular specificity of the listed references (e.g. United Air Force directives and instructions), it would be a reasonable conclusion that the RUF for federal military forces were detailed in the specified directives or regulations at the time that the statute was enacted. At the present time, the U.S. Air Force does have a published regulation on this subject; however, the U.S. Army and the Department of Defense do not. Instead, the U.S. Army follows the RUF from a Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Instruction, which is not one of the regulations listed in the original language of RSA 110-B:28. The end result is that state military forces would follow two different RUF during a domestic operation. House Bill 117, when passed, would ensure that state military forces follow the same RUF. To provide further alignment of force protections measures, this bill also provides that state employees and contractor personnel will also follow the same RUF when conducting security functions at National Guard facilities. In sum, House Bill 117, when passed, will have positive impact on the operations of state military forces in our state.

In closing, the Department of Military Affairs and Veterans Services fully supports the House Bill 117.

### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

### In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty One

AN ACT

relative to the use of force at New Hampshire national guard facilities.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 The Militia; National Guard Facilities. Amend RSA 110-B:28, I to read as follows:

I. All armories, arsenals, camps, ranges, bases, airports, and other facilities owned, leased, licensed, or maintained by the state or by the United States for the use of the New Hampshire national guard and all activities conducted therein shall be under the general charge, control of, and regulated by the adjutant general and no political subdivision of the state shall interfere with or regulate such activities. The adjutant general may use the means necessary and required, including the arming of trained personnel, to protect, guard, secure and defend and maintain all such facilities. [Use of force by any member of the New Hampshire national guard in duty status, shall be in accordance with the applicable Department of Defense, United States Army, and United States Air Force directives and instructions on rules of engagement and use of force. If mission specific rules of engagement are issued, the specific rules shall be followed, to the degree they deviate from the existing rules, for as long as military members are carrying out duties related to the mission for which the specific rules were issued.]

2 New Section; The Militia; Rules for the Use of Force. Amend RSA 110-B by inserting after section 28 the following new section:

110-B:28-a Rules for the Use of Force. Use of force by personnel, to include state employees and contractor personnel while conducting security functions at National Guard facilities; and any employee and member of the New Hampshire National Guard, in a duty status, shall be in accordance with adjutant general issued guidance and procedures, which, except for mission specific rules for the use of force, shall be consistent with applicable United States Department of Defense, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, United States Army, or United States Air Force unclassified directives and instructions on the standing rules for use of force.

- 3 The Militia; Trespassers and Disturbers; Camp Regulations. Amend RSA 110-B:68, II to read as follows:
- II. The adjutant general or commanding officer of any armory, arsenal, camp, range, base, or other facility of the New Hampshire national guard, or any place where any unit is performing military duty, has the authority to limit access and activities in that place. This includes the authority to take action necessary to protect, guard, secure, and defend the armory, arsenal, camp, range, base, or other facility in accordance with RSA 110-B:28 and RSA 110-B:28-a.
  - 4 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
