#### STATEMENT OF INTENT

This bill is similar to several other bills that have been considered and rejected over the past several years. This bill would create a civil process to address potential elder or vulnerable adult abuse. Many concerns were raised about financial abuse of adults and "that the money was gone" before someone could act. Stealing someone's retirement funds is already a crime under the criminal statutes as is physical abuse and neglect. The committee heard from numerous citizens expressing concerns about due process violations and use of civil processes when there is evidence that criminal activity had occurred. Specific issues were raised about the phrase, "...the court shall not be bound by the technical rules of evidence..." which would allow for 'evidence' that might be hearsay or double and even triple hearsay. The language in the proposed statue would allow the confiscation of personal property, including animals. The language would also kick in federal law that would allow for confiscation of firearms from the accused without a trial where the accused was found guilty. This bill also included an indefinite look back in time whereby an incident that had occurred decades ago could be used as evidence of abuse. This is a significant departure from traditional, American, jurisprudence. As a society, we have been careful to ensure that the accused is presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law. The committee heard significant concerns that this civil process would do away with those protections. Numerous suggestions were made to correct the flaws brought up in the public hearing but nothing was agreed to during the executive session. Members considered retaining the bill to work on it, however the committee decided that this bill was unworkable.

This is a significant departure from traditional, American, jurisprudence. As a society, we have been careful to ensure that the accused is presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law. The committee heard significant concerns that this civil process would do away with those protections. Numerous suggestions were made to correct the flaws brought up in the public hearing but nothing was agreed to during the executive session. As a senior citizen I have witnessed acts of abuse aimed at seniors on two occasions. One caused serious increase to an already life threatening issue. A grandchild of a man who had been given power of attorney to allegedly

help him through his senior years and his recurring epilepsy seizures was withholding medication and income from retirement funds and would use the practice to get cash from him.

A short time later she spiked one of his drinks causing him to fall twice in one evening. The 2nd time he opened a large cut on his forehead. The EMT arrived and took him to the hospital. The police were notified and were given the information.

During a search of her apt

a large amount of the meds she was withholding was discovered along with cash.

I don't know how she managed it but her punishment was a restraining order keeping her no less than 200 feet from his apt. He was sent home but passed away a month later. A few days later I asked one of the police officers what would happened to her? He told me they did all they could.

The second instance is not so damaging but still had a negative effect on the senior. Without verbal or written permission a senior woman's son decided on his own to take her car and give it to his teen son to drive. She hasn't had a moving violation or accident in 12 yrs. She reported the car stolen to her local police department. The officer questioned her about her health and age. He also made remarks inferring to the idea that she is old and forgetful. There is no public transportation so she depends on neighbors to take her to market and medical appts.

Senior abuse isn't just referring to physical damage, which does happen it refers to larceny, using meds and money as a method of blackmail.

Forging checks and illegal use of credit cars.




Sir, I had, unfortunately, not been accorded the opportunity for which I had duly registered on the State of New Hampshire's official website.


Sincerely would appreciate your special attention to my applications to testify before your Committee in opposition to HB246.



I am Michael E. Thornton, 561 North River Road, Milford, 03055. A New Hampshire citizen since August, 1993.

- Speaking today as a private citizen and, on this occasion, with this statement, a representative of the New Hampshire Firearms Coalition. [was NOT recognized to speak, 26 January 2021 despite receipted electronic request. Please see electronic request, attached]
- I am, opposed to HB246, and the Coalition is also OPPOSED to HB246. We ask you to find it ITL.
- Earlier, similar, legislation could have also immediately deprived any accused of their Rights [compared those to Criminal Codes], subject them to immediate seizure of property, and seizure of essential financial assets upon the 'prophylactic presumption of guilt.' Then, only after a delay of some time before adjudication (30 days with 10 day extension plus unaccountable other delays), at considerable expense, the accused (defendant) arguably... could be found guilty upon only "the preponderance of evidence." No mention of a jury of their peers.
- in response to the Representative and the attorney who maintained that "firearms are NOT mentioned in the proposed legislation." The official PDF, which I read online at 2:43, the morning of 26 January 2021 specifically does call out "firearms." Please refer to, I believe Page 3, lines 20 & 21: "order defendant to hand over firearms or deadly weapons...". This would not allow a legally armed citizen to tender their property into adequately trustworthy, accountable, private safekeeping. Must the accused, thereafter, file a writ of recoven, to the appropriate authority, at additional expense, in order to regain their property? At what additional expense and who shall be accountable for accurate receipting for and the adequate care for their seized property? How would damage to a citizen's property be compensated?

- The enabling language requires a plaintiff to attest that they realize they are accountable for bearing false witness. An "incompetent" cannot provide such attestation, by law. Therefore, the possible accused would have no protections whatsoever under the law.
- Hardened career criminals are accorded far greater protections; they are only convicted under protection of a trial by a jury of their peers, provided free legal counsel if necessary, and are found guilty only upon government proof "beyond reasonable doubt." Evidence gathered from the fruit of the poisoned tree cannot be used against hardened career criminals. Seemingly the same protection does not obtain for 'caregivers.' Certainly I can not allow my children, to 'care for me' as I age; they can ill afford the risk of being my 'caregiver' under this legislation. Even were the strictures 'only financial,' the threatened consequences are far too dire for almost any family. Therefore, my fate may be of a Veteran, exiled from his own caring comfortable home; thereafter to be warehoused in a disease laden charnel house. Please refer to the mortality at the State Veteran's Home of late. Must I be compelled to await death amongst strangers, at the mercy of people I neither know nor have reason to trust?

Does a son have the "legal obligation" to forego his own family's physical safety & care, travel to a far distant state, and pay for his father's terminal care? Your legislation does not seem to address such issues. Sadly, one of several serious potential flaws. I relocated to Ohio, during my father's very challenging last six months of life. I was, unknowingly under the risk of similar laws enacted in Ohio. Had I been aware of their legal 'protections for elders' I could not have so hazarded my own family. Clarence Eugene Thornton, SFC, United States us Army would have died alone, a stranger in a Veteran's warehouse.

- Your intent, on face value, is laudable. As a "Senior" I appreciate your concerns. Please, do NOT so 'protect' me. Thus 'protected,' I'd be a defenseless elder in a world of far younger and far stronger criminals.
- HB246 would place \_any\_ potential caregiver's liberty, property, and life savings at grave risk were they to care for an "at risk, emotionally, or mentally challenged elder" under these proposals.
- Where is the evidence of the extreme need for HB246? Please provide, at least, metadata, absent identifying information supporting assertion of extreme & immediate need.
- Why are not the existing criminal codes adequate to enforce existing laws? Why do these 'presumptive' codes continue to be proposed? Each seems to threaten deprivation of "firearms or other dangerous weapons," despite pointed and explicit assertions to the contrary.
- \* please note that no negligent or harmful action(s) need have been committed, no harm whatsoever suffered, before the crushing power of the State, hanging over the head of any citizen/caregiver would be able to strike. Only a person intent upon self-destruction would ever risk caring for any elder or 'at. risk' fellow citizen, the potential downside is too great.

## Conclusion

• Who will provide 'Elder Care' If the burden and risk of caring for these fellow citizens comes at the grave danger of HB246's threats?

Indeed, despite direct, incorrect, testimony otherwise, the confiscatory enabling language concerning "firearms and deadly weapons" remains in the enabling language proposed.

There are many military veterans in your ranks, they will attest that their training makes anything "a dangerous weapon". Indeed, any single word is capable of being misinterpreted as inducing emotional damage to an 'at risk elder.'

Dear Representative Pearson and members of the Committee:

On January 26th, the HHSEA Committee heard testimony on HB 246.

Legislative bodies must tread cautiously when enacting laws that would restrict the rights of citizens. Both the US Constitution and the NH Constitution (Article 15) provide for due process. People are presumed innocent until proven guilty.

HB 246 does not provide adequate due process for the "defendant". The bedrock principal of due process dates back centuries from English law and the Magna Carta. The Fourth and Fifth Amendments of the Constitution are no less important than any of the others. I listened to some Representatives say that this bill is not an attack on gun ownership and does not mention firearms. If fact, the term "firearms" does appear on Page 3, Line 20, although in what would initially seem a benign way.

Unfortunately I had to leave the meeting for a medical appointment and therefore was not able to hear if additional testimony addressed that issue. If enacted into law, this bill would allow action to be taken against a defendant without their prior knowledge a judgement has been rendered. The "Relief", "Protective Orders" and "Other relief including but not limited to" language in this bill is troubling. It permits courts great leeway in determining what action can be taken against the defendant including confiscation of property. Judges will be pressured to err on the side of caution and said confiscation could include taking away a defendant's firearms. Now the Second Amendment has been violated. All this without a crime being committed. The corrective process for the defendant in this situation is burdensome and costly.

Legislation with good intentions but poorly written so as to violate someone else's constitutionally guaranteed rights is bad policy. I respectfully ask that HB 246 be voted out of Committee Inexpedient to Legislate.

#### Dear Committee Members:

I joined the Zoom audience today, Tuesday, January 26, 2021, for the hearing on HB 246, "AN ACT establishing a protective order for vulnerable adults." I considered testifying, but I am not a cosponsor & you heard plenty of testimony already. I would be happy to have my comments included in the bill file, if possible. I probably will not attempt to speak at the continued hearing, even if the rules allow.

You were visited by several of the leading pro-gun lobbyists. Actually, I should say "pro-gun advocates." Rep. Burt obviously is not a lobbyist, and at least one of the other advocates you heard from today is (supposedly) for technical reasons not a lobbyist, since he is not specifically paid for his advocacy, even though for many years he has headed a anti-gun-safety advocacy group and he has testified against dozens (maybe hundreds) of gun-safety bills dating back to the early 2000's.

The pro-gunners' basic point abut HB 246 is actually at least somewhat accurate (unlike many of their claims.) If the court finds, by a preponderance of the evidence (which is a very high standard) that the defendant is abusing a vulnerable adult, then that defendant could theoretically be barred from having firearm (the way I read the bill.) Certainly, the defendant will get in even more trouble if he or she threatens the vulnerable adult with a firearm.

I would advise the committee not to waste any time trying to reach a compromise with the anti-gun-safety crowd. These pro-gun advocates are not interested in compromise (unless possibly if you put in language explicitly allowing defendants to keep carrying guns even after they lose in court, but that would make a mockery of this bill.) In fact, the pro-gun crowd are not interested in anything besides their guns. Guns are relevant to your committee, but only because gun violence is a major health issue. I recommend leaving gun-related issues to the Criminal Justice Committee.

I would like to mention the flip side of the issue which inspired HB 246. Guns and other weapons are popular targets of thieves, including those thieves who use emotional and financial abuse rather than brute force to steal. I saw this in my own family: I had an uncle who lived in a small town in Grafton County. He was exploited by more than a few of his many so-called "friends," who ripped him off in a wide variety of ways— including stealing his guns and antique swords. My uncle was by no means a gun nut, and he would never have deliberately aimed a gun at another human being. But, he was a retired military officer and he enjoyed shooting sports and he also enjoyed collecting just about anything which can be collected, guns included. For over 20 years (before and after my uncle's death in 1996 at the age of 90) my late father and my sister and other family members worked many long hours

trying to make order out of the financial chaos he left behind. This included trying to figure out what happened to his guns. HB 246, if passed as is, will protect many vulnerable adults from having their guns and other weapons stolen by people they mistakenly trusted.

**Dear Committee Members:** 

My name is Michael Earl Hammond. I have been a resident of Dunbarton, New Hampshire, for 29 years, although, at 71, I am a "snowbird."

I serve as Legislative Counsel to Gun Owners of America and I am writing in opposition to House Bill 246, which would expand the ability of government bureaucrats to go after the families of seniors in New Hampshire. I write as both GOA's counsel and as a state resident.

In September, 1996, my ailing mother, with Alzheimer's, moved from Kansas City to Dunbarton, so that I could take care of her. To do so, I terminated my political career, worked half-time in a semi-retired status, spent virtually all of my income, went into debt, and suspended unnecessary activities. Despite the difficulties created by my part-time work, my mother's consistently expressed wish was to live with me. And yet, government bureaucrats spent two years working to transfer my mother to a nursing home, contrary to her wishes and mine.

In 1998, those bureaucrats illegally entered my house while I was at the grocery store. They dragged my mother out of my house, screaming. They took away all of her rights and put under the control of a guardian with no due process in a star chamber telephone proceeding in the basement of Concord Hospital, in which neither my mother nor I was represented, contrary to law. And, when my mother would not stop screaming my name, Concord Hospital injected her with Haldol, an animal tranquilizer used in the Soviet gulag. After 4 weeks, we were able to get a Probate Court hearing, where our mother was returned to her family. By this time, the Haldol had reduced her to a vegetable -- and she died within months.

My case was not isolated. My understanding is that the proud elderly man down the road from me was similarly victimized.

From my standpoint, the problem with New Hampshire law is that the government has too much power to interfere in people's families and take away their rights with no due process.

House Bill 246 would exacerbate that problem.

It applies to "abusers." But "abuse" is defined as "the misuse of power, authority, or both, verbal harassment, or unreasonable confinement which results or could result in the mental anguish or

emotional distress of the vulnerable adult." So, when Concord Hospital refused to allow my mother's friends and family to take her outside to sit in the sun, was that "emotional abuse"?

Under the bill, a guardian, or even a department bureaucrat, can bring charges against a family member. They can bring these charges in an ex-parte proceeding, with no due process. And the remedies allowed by the bill has virtually no limits, but certainly include the removal of the family member's constitutional right to keep and bear arms.

Advocates of this bill claim that "elder abuse is a major problem" and moan that the current criminal sanctions are not nearly draconian enough to deal with the problem.

I would argue that an even bigger problem is that senior citizens, like me, have no family to take care of them. And the last thing we want is for the government to strip away our rights without due process.

In New Hampshire, we still care about individual liberty. And we still care about constitutional rights. And the last thing we need is for this New York-crafted boilerplate bill to bring other states' repressive policies to the Granite State.

Chairman Pearson and Honorable Members of the Health, Human Services, and Elderly Affairs Committee,

We write today in opposition to House Bill 246, establishing a protective order for vulnerable adults, a bill we refer to as 'Elder Care Gun Confiscation'.

As the Representative from Hampton, Renny Cushing, told you while introducing the bill, this idea is not new. Many iterations have been deliberated by the very body you represent today. None of them have succeeded, and for good reason.

Just last summer, Governor Chris Sununu vetoed this exact legislation. The governor cited several concerns, but notable among them were infringements to citizens 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>, and 14<sup>th</sup> amendment rights under the United States Constitution – as well as the applicable related Articles in the New Hampshire Constitution. As elected officials, you have all taken an oath to protect and defend those very documents in your service to your constituents.

The New Hampshire Firearms Coalition has deep and unwavering opposition to HB246 as introduced, and we appreciate you taking the time to understand our concerns.

Even the proponents of the bill appear to recognize the constitutional problems of HB246 but seek to push it forward anyways. During original testimony on this bill, Rep. Weber from Walpole told you that "If the law errs on one side or another, I would hope that the law errs on the side of protecting the vulnerable adult and possibly overstepping on the rights of their abuser." Such a blatant outfacing statement exposes the lack of regard for the constitutional rights it will infringe on is troubling, to say the least.

Proponents claim that firearm language has been stripped from the bill – which is not true (page 3 line 20). The bill would allow courts to remand firearms from the accused. On top of that, any person for which an order is entered will be placed in the State Police database, which precludes them from purchasing or possessing firearms under existing state law. The

Permits and Licensing bureau references this list every time a background check is run through the "gun line."

Courts can issue these orders in an ex-parte fashion, which deprives defendants proper due process under the Constitution. Proponents of the bill tell you this is necessary to protect abused adults, but in reality, this is not true. Abused adults have a variety of existing RSAs that police can use to charge criminal abusers.

Under this proposal, judges can allow evidence outside the normal rules of evidentiary proceedings in hearings for protective orders. This means they can allow hearsay testimony, or anything else they deem relevant.

Worse yet, the burden of proof is simply a preponderance of the evidence, the lowest evidentiary standard in the law. If a judge finds that "more likely than not," something MAY happen, their orders will be issued – with or without the defendant having an opportunity to defend his or her innocence.

Frankly, this bill has great potential for abuse itself.

Any bill that purports to protect one class of citizen by trampling on the rights of everyone else has failed its most basic threshold – to uphold our system of jurisprudence and defend the constitutional rights we are all afforded.

For the reasons stated above, we urge this committee to vote this bill Inexpedient to Legislate.

### **TESTIMONY IN OPPOSITION TO HB 246**

January 26, 2021 -- New Hampshire House Health, Human Services and Elderly Affairs Committee

Good afternoon, for the record, my name is Alan Rice; I am resident of Bedford, NH and I am here today as the New Hampshire State Director for Gun Owners of America, a national organization with close to 2 million individual members. **We strongly oppose HB 246.** 

HB 246 is a long, complex bill which is not much different than other bills that this body has heard and rejected over the past four years. HB 246 will allow the "guardian-in-fact" of a "vulnerable adult" to strip a Granite Stater of his Second, Fourth, Fifth, and Fourteenth Amendment rights through a "secret" telephone call -- with no hearing whatsoever -- and no chance for the accused to defend himself or to state his point of view before guns are confiscated. Guilty until proven innocent is not the American way.

We believe that HB 246 is another, brazen attempt at injecting government into every aspect of people's private lives through the use of court appointed, court ordered guardians and fiduciaries who, if HB 246 is adopted, will be given the authority to have their guns confiscated. HB 246 describes vulnerable adults as:

"Vulnerable" means that the physical, mental, or emotional ability of a person is such that he or she is unable to manage personal, home, or financial affairs in his or her own best interest, or he or she is unable to act or unable to delegate responsibility to a responsible caretaker or caregiver.

But HB 246 goes on to state that: the "vulnerable adult" can authorize the Department of Health and Human Services to act on their behalf. This seems contradictory. If the vulnerable adult is "unable to manage personal, home, or financial affairs in his or her own best interest," how then, would that person have the presence of mind to delegate these affairs to a state agency?

This conflict shows that HB 246 was not drafted to help anyone, but rather its intention is to provide another way for disgruntled family members to retaliate against someone who has probably not done anything wrong.

Another aspect of HB 246 that places the unsuspecting in legal peril is that it allows the courts to look back in time indefinitely:

The court shall not deny the plaintiff protective orders based solely on a lapse of time between an act of abuse, exploitation, or neglect and the filing of a petition, provided that the underlying act

presents a credible threat to the plaintiff's current safety or physical, mental, or financial well-being.

Who can request such a protection order? Pretty much anyone: a disgruntled child, sibling, niece, nephew, spurned lover, visiting nurse, police officers, anti-gun conservation officers. The list of potential plaintiffs is endless and they can request such an order over the telephone.

HB 246 includes language that appears to allow the defendant to demand a hearing at his own expense. He can expect the cost of said hearing to be tens of thousands of dollars. What is particularly galling is that the complainant is not bound by rules of evidence; and he, she, or the bureaucrat can throw in any accusation they wish into evidence – without incontrovertible proof!

In the meantime, while the accused and defendant are waiting for a hearing, the police can take any action they wish to "protect the complainant." This will almost certainly include gun confiscation. In accordance with standard protocol, under HB 246, the police can arrive at an individual's door in the middle of the night to ransack his house and, if he resisted, to arrest and shoot him.

This is exactly what happened in Ferndale, Maryland, to 60-year-old Gary Willis, a "gentle" man who was targeted by a vindictive relative, and who was shot to death when police arrived at his darkened house at 5:17 AM because he answered the door with a gun. Which, at 5:17AM is a prudent way to answer the door.

Sure, after the order is entered and the guns are confiscated, you can spend thousands of dollars on attorneys and experts to attempt to convince a judge to return your property. That is NOT due process; true due process occurs when the presumption of innocence remains and the accused has an opportunity to be heard in court before their property is taken.

So even if the gun owner survives the "knock-on-the-door" in the middle of the night, it is unlikely that he will be able to summon the resources to defend his constitutional rights in court.

If the sponsors of HB 246 truly wish to protect "vulnerable adults", they should read:

R.S.A. 631:8 Criminal Neglect of Elderly, Disabled, or Impaired Adults – which provides that purposeful causing serious bodily injury to an elderly, disabled, or impaired adult is a Class A Felony and knowingly or recklessly causing serious bodily injury is a Class B Felony;

R.S.A. 631:9 Financial Exploitation of an Elderly, Disabled, or Impaired Adult, and;

R.S.A. 631:10 provides that those who financially exploit those vulnerable members of society, can be convicted of at the least a misdemeanor and at worst, if the exploitation is \$1500 or more, a Class A Felony.

These laws already protect the most vulnerable members of society -- HB 246 is not even needed.

On behalf of almost two million members of Gun Owners of America, I'm urging you to vote HB 246 "inexpedient to legislate."

Thank you.

It is my belief that HB-246 creates a class of people (elderly, seniors) and assumes that those belonging to that group should loose their constitutional rights under the law. This bill revokes the second amendment for the "class", revokes the right to due process for the "class", eliminates the right for this "class" face the accuser.

<u>Creating this "class" of people is bigoted and demeaning</u>. It assumes that only this class of people should not have the same rights as younger folks. This is plainly age discrimination.

The bill also potentially subjects the "class" to abuse by making them a target for other who may have ill intentioned ulterior motives. It takes away the right to defending oneself particularly in remote areas of the state where law enforcement would not be able to get there in time.

There are no guidelines under which an accuser can be screened for criminal intent or mental illness. So the accuser could conceivably be a paranoid schizophrenic and be making a frivolous complaint which endangers all parties involved. Because the bill guards the identity of the accuser, harassing repeat accusations could potentially occur.

If there is suspicion of an individual doing themselves or anyone else harm there already are mechanisms in place to get that person help without creating and penalizing an entire class of people.

Please do not sign a bigoted law that endangers our seniors and the police who would have to confiscate property.

Julie Taves Hollis, NH. Thanks the opportunity to speak on this bill. First I must say that I fortunate to have loving children and grandchildren.

As a senior citizen I have witnessed acts of abuse aimed at seniors on two occasions. One caused serious increase to an already life threatening issue. A grandchild of a man who had been given power of attorney to allegedly help him through his senior years and his recurring epilepsy seizures was withholding medication and income from retirement funds and would use the practice to get cash from him.

As a result he had a seizure and fell hitting his head on the corner of a table. When EMT arrived he withheld info regarding her practice. A short time later she spiked one of his drinks causing him to fall twice in one evening. The 2nd time he opened a large cut on his forehead. The EMT arrived and took him to the hospital. The police were notified and were given the information.

During a search of her apt

a large amount of the meds she was withholding was discovered along with cash.

I don't know how she managed it but her punishment was a restraining order keeping her no less than 200 feet from his apt. He was sent home but passed away a month later. A few days later I asked one of the police officers what would happened to her? He told me they did all they could.

The second instance is not so damaging but still had a negative effect on the senior. Without verbal or written permission a senior woman's son decided on his own to take her car and give it to his teen son to drive. She hasn't had a moving violation or accident in 12 yrs. She reported the car stolen to her local police department. The officer questioned her about her health and age. He also made remarks inferring to the idea that she is old and forgetful. There is no public transportation so she depends on neighbors to take her to market and medical appts.

Senior abuse isn't just referring to physical damage, which does happen it refers to larceny, using meds and money as a method of blackmail.

Forging checks and illegal use of credit cars.

The laws regarding what actions could be taken by the victims or law enforcement must be and should be tightened so alleged perpetrators wouldn't be so quick to commit the deeds Thank you all for listening to my message. I urge you to vote in favor of HB 246

Dear Members of the House Health, Human Services and Elderly Affairs Committee,

Hello, my name is Ryan Donnelly. I am writing to you today on my own behalf, as well as that of Granite State Independent Living. GSIL is a state-wide non-profit organization that advocates and provides services for seniors and people with disabilities who wish to remain independent in their homes and communities. I am writing to you today in support of HB246.

I myself am a person with a severe physical disability. I live with a condition called Osteogenesis Imperfecta. My bones break and fracture easily, I am unable to walk, and I am also short in stature. I value my independence, which includes driving my own van, holding a job, and being a part of my community. However, because of my condition, I rely on others for my personal day to day care.

There is a great deal of trust that comes in taking someone on to provide that day to day care. Unfortunately there can be times when that trust is broken. I myself was once a victim of serious emotional abuse and an instance of unwanted physical contact at the hands of a live-in caregiver. It was a traumatic, painful, and frightening ordeal for me and for my family.

As it stands right now, even for a vulnerable adult such as myself, the definition of abuse can prove to be narrow. Because the nature of the abuse I was subjected to was primarily emotional, I was successful in receiving only a temporary protective order against my former caregiver. While my personal situation was ultimately resolved in a satisfactory manner, I wish that more could have been done at the beginning of my ordeal.

That is precisely where this bill comes into play. For people with disabilities like myself as well as other vulnerable adults, HB246 reasonably broadens the definition of abuse. This will allow the law to protect those individuals who cannot protect themselves. This encompasses a whole slew of people. It includes not only older citizens who might be taken advantage of financially, but also those of us of sound mind who live with physical disabilities who face abuse or exploitation at the hands of those who are supposed to be caring for our needs.

With this in mind, I hope the members of this committee will choose to support HB246. Thank you for the opportunity to testify to you today, and for all of the hard work you perform on the behalf of all New Hampshire citizens.

Orders shall clearly state how any party can request a further hearing and how the plaintiff may bring a criminal complaint or a petition for contempt if there is a violation of any court order.
  - VII.(a) No order issued under this chapter shall be modified other than by the court.

When the defendant violates either a temporary or permanent protective order issued or enforced under this chapter, peace officers shall arrest the defendant and ensure that the defendant is detained until arraignment, provided that in extreme circumstances, such as when the health of the defendant would be jeopardized by the temporary detention, a judge in response to a request by the arresting law enforcement officer or agency, may order an alternative to detention pending arraignment. Such arrests may be made within 12 hours without a warrant upon probable cause, whether or not the violation is committed in the presence of a peace officer.
- II. The prosecution and sentencing for criminal contempt for a violation of a protective order shall not preclude the prosecution of or sentencing for other criminal charges underlying the contempt.
