STATEMENT OF INTENT

This bill adds a Londonderry local official and resident to the HB 737 (2019) commission, the Commission on the Environmental and Public Health Impacts of Perfluorinated Chemicals, established in 2019 to study the environmental and public health impacts relating to PFAS (per and poly fluoroalkyl substances) released in Merrimack, Bedford, and Litchfield. In addition to agency and state environmental and health specialists, the Commission includes representation from each affected town. Since the passage of HB737 (2019), related PFAS contamination has been found in parts of Londonderry, thus in its 2020 interim report, the HB737 commission recommended legislation to expand to include Londonderry representation. This recommendation is supported by the NH Department of Environmental Services. This bill implements the commission recommendation.

Rep. Rosemarie Rung Please consider this my public testimony, which I will make on January 27 when I introduce HB256 to the Resources committee:

Two years ago, Governor Sununu signed into law, HB737, which established a commission to study the health and environmental impacts of PFAS contamination resulting from the Merrimack operations of Saint-Gobain Performance Plastics. The commission is represented by five state representatives, two state senators, officials from NHDES, NHDHHS, USGS, UNH, an environmental scientist, and residents and local officials from the three communities impacted by SGPP's contamination: Bedford, Litchfield, and Merrimack. The commission has been very successful in gathering research and data, recommending actions and communicating to stakeholders on this subject. I am currently serving as its Chair.

Unfortunately, Londonderry has also been shown to have groundwater contamination from Saint-Goblin's operations. In our interim report issued in November 2020, the Commission recommended unanimously to introduce legislation to add Londonderry to the Commission membership. Thus, I am before you with this bill. It is vital as the Commission moves forward that Londonderry have an equal voice along with the three other communities.

If possible, I ask that you take action on this bill as soon as you are able. Several public information initiatives are underway and Londonderry needs to be part of these.

Recently I was advised by the NHDES, after they had tested my water on two separate occasions, that the water from my well is above the level recommended by the NHDES and advised that I should not use our water for drinking or cooking. Since that time I have had to purchase water at the store for all of my drinking and cooking needs.

I am very concerning and do believe Londonderry should be included as an interested party to this commission. This is much more wide spread through the town of Londonderry then what we were originally told. Some residents receive water from St. Gobain, but my home and well are just on the edge of the boundary that was outlined in the lawsuit. Personally, I think St. Gobain should be shut down until all of these issues are remedied.

My name is Maureen Mooney, a State Representative for the Town of Merrimack in Hillsborough County, district #21. I am a co-sponsor of **HB 256** AN ACT adding members from Londonderry to the commission to investigate and analyze the environmental and public health impacts relating to releases of perfluorinated chemicals into the air, soil, and groundwater in Merrimack, Bedford, and Litchfield. I am **in support** of this bill.

On December 8, 2020, Speaker Dick Hinch appointed me to the Commission on the Environmental and Public Health Impacts of Perfluorinated Chemicals pursuant to RSA 126-A:79-a (hereinafter "Commission"). The Commission meets monthly to discuss and receive updates relative to the serious issue of pollutants in Merrimack and surrounding towns.

Effective governmental problem-solving revolves around bringing all interested parties together to the table to find solutions. Currently on the Commission there is explicit representation for the affected towns of Merrimack, Litchfield and Bedford, but we are missing Londonderry. Londonderry has bona fide evidence of pollutants in its environment; therefore, earning itself direct representation on the Commission.

Allowing Londonderry to have representation is even more critical now during times of increasing reliance on online meetings whereby audience members and observers cannot participate or interact with panelists nor be in the same physical room. Therefore, allowing Londonderry to have official membership allows the town critical participatory privileges at meetings.
