RE: House Bill 298 to Add a Member to the Aviation Users Advisory Board

Dear Ms. McGuire and Committee Members:

I am writing to you as Deputy General Counsel of PlaneSense, Inc. and as the Vice Chairman of the Aviation Users Advisory Board ("AUAB") in support of House Bill 298, which if passed will add a much needed board member to the AUAB.

The AUAB is a six (6) member board consisting of a member from the following aviation constituencies as designated by RSA 21-L:8: corporate aviation, airport management, Aviation Association of New Hampshire, Airport Authority, general aviation, and airlines The role of the AUAB is to advise the Governor by advising the Department of Transportation Bureau of Aeronautics ("Bureau") on matters relevant to both private and commercial aviation. The AUAB also acts as an appeals board for appeals from the decisions of the Commissioner on aeronautical matters. As you know, with the advent of unmanned aircraft systems ("UAS") industry has brought with it both benefits and challenges, touching every aspect of American life. This means that both the Bureau and the AUAB need to be able to respond to the changing needs of the State in fostering and regulating this burgeoning industry. The AUAB, however, does not presently have a member from the UAS industry which leaves the AUAB at a disadvantage on such matters.

While the current board has a wealth of aviation experience and expertise, it is unable to adequately address the rapidly growing and evolving UAS industry. Indeed, the Federal Aviation Administration has struggled to keep up with the pace of change as it attempts to regulate the use of UAS in the federal airspace. The issues before the State of New Hampshire include registration, safety and accident response, privacy, and use for governmental, commercial and recreational purposes. The issues include understanding when the State can regulate UAS use and when it cannot. Additionally, the AUAB needs to be adequately prepared to act in its appeals function on UAS issues that my come before it for

adjudication in the future. In order to adequately fulfill its advisory and appeals roles, The AUAB needs a member who is steeped in this new aviation frontier.

For the reasons set forth above, I respectfully request that you support the passage of HB 298.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

- 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
