#### Rep. Lekas introduced the bill and deferred questions to later speakers.

#### Margaret Byrnes, Executive Director of the NH Municipal Ass'n, spoke in support.

She gave some background: municipalities have been transitioning to electronic records and signatures as a matter of efficiency and cost savings. The pandemic has made the need greater. She said that while the law permitted this, standards were required. The Governor's emergency order gave authorization for this practice. This bill, developed with DOiT would permit municipalities to continue electronic use even after the emergency orders were over and without standards being developed. The bill is permissive both with to municipalities using electronic records and the DOiT developing standards. There was a committee question regarding language: "must" changing to "should" or "may."

#### Shaun Mulholland spoke in support

and said that the opportunity to develop standards has been in place since 9/11. While standards have been developed for state agencies, none have been developed for municipalities, in his opinion, because of a lack of resources. He looked forward to working with DOiT, Secretary of State and DAS to development of standards when resources become available.

# Testimony

Chairperson Carol McGuire and Committee Members House Executive Departments and Administration Committee

RE: HB 302 Relative to the creation and use of electronic records by government agencies

The City worked with DoIT and the NHMA to address some of the wording contained within RSA 294-E. This RSA provides the statutory authority for state, county and municipal governments to utilize electronic signatures and electronic documents. The present language places the responsibility for determining whether and to the extent governmental entities within the state can create and retain electronic documents with DoIT, the Secretary of State's Office and Administrative Services. DoIT in cooperation with the other two agencies have created standards for state agencies however no standards have been created for counties and municipalities.

Some have interpreted the present language to mean that electronic documents cannot be created or retained by governmental entities absent a specific authorization from these state agencies. The conclusion being that county and municipal governments do not have the authority to create and retain electronic documents at the present time. RSA 294-E was passed into law on September 11, 2001. As we approach 20 years no standards have been created that would "authorize" counties and municipalities to create and retain electronic documents. The use of electronic documents and electronic signatures is very common in local government as well as the private sector.

Recently the need for and utilization of electronic documents and electronic signatures has grown dramatically due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Governor Sununu issued Emergency Order #23 on April 1, 2020 which temporarily relieves counties and municipalities from this restriction. As you know this emergency order will only last as long as the emergency lasts.

The proposed changes clarify the authority of counties and municipalities to create electronic documents and utilize electronic signatures. The proposed changes will retain the authority of DoIT, the Secretary of State's Office and Administrative Services to create standards for counties and municipalities. I would urge the committee to recommend the passage of this bill to the full House of Representatives.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 Creation, Retention, Acceptance and Distribution of Electronic Records by Government 1  $\mathbf{2}$ Agencies. Amend RSA 294-E:17 and RSA 294-E:18 to read as follows:

3 294-E:17 Creation and Retention of Electronic Records and Conversion of Written Records by 4Governmental Agencies. The secretary of state in cooperation with the department of information technology and the department of administrative services[, shall determine whether, and the extent  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 to which, may create standards by which a governmental agency [will] may create and retain 7electronic records and convert written records to electronic records.

294-E:18 Acceptance and Distribution of Electronic Records by Governmental Agencies.

9 I. Except as otherwise provided in RSA 294-E:12, VI, the department of information 10technology, in cooperation with the secretary of state and the department of administrative services 11 shall determine whether, and the extent to which, may develop standards by which a 12governmental agency [will] may send and accept electronic records and electronic signatures to and 13from other persons and otherwise create, generate, communicate, store, process, use, and rely upon 14electronic records and electronic signatures. Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to 15prevent municipalities from using electronic records or signatures.

To the extent that a governmental agency uses electronic records and electronic II. 17signatures under paragraph I, the department of information technology, in cooperation with the 18secretary of state and the department of administrative services, giving due consideration to 19security, may *create standards to* specify:

20(a) The manner and format in which the electronic records [must] may be created, 21generated, sent, communicated, received, and stored and the systems established for those purposes;

22(b) If electronic records must be signed by electronic means, the type of electronic 23signature [required], the manner and format in which the electronic signature [must] should be 24affixed to the electronic record, and the identity of, or criteria that [must] should be met by, any 25third party used by a person filing a document to facilitate the process;

26(c) Control processes and procedures as appropriate to ensure adequate preservation, 27disposition, integrity, security, confidentiality, and auditability of electronic records; and

28Any other required attributes for electronic records which are specified for (d) 29corresponding nonelectronic records or reasonably necessary under the circumstances.

- 1 III. Except as otherwise provided in RSA 294-E:12, VI, this chapter does not require a 2 governmental agency of this state to use or permit the use of electronic records or electronic 3 signatures.
