STATEMENT OF INTENT

The minority of the committee expressed the belief that existing criminal threatening laws are adequate to address security concerns at reproductive health care facilities, and noted that no facility has ever implemented the law's provisions in spite of the urgent need expressed by its supporters.

TESTIMONY

*Rep. Kelsey Introduced the bill. Freedom of speech in the NH Constitution should be "inviolably preserved". The buffer zone is intended to prohibit certain speech on public ways. The Supreme Court has been clear that speech that troubles/angers others is the type of speech most in need of protection. NH should repeal this bad law and protect it Q Silber If law is repealed would normal police presence maintain order? A Absolutely. Q Horrigan How did you say this compares the Massachusetts law? A it is very similar. The fact that a zone can be implemented is the constitutional Question, Q How have demonstrators changed their behavior due to COVID-19? A I have been there with them and they are obeying the guidelines. These ae peaceful people who are just there to offer help and assistance. Q Langley-How does this protect the rights of patients who don't care about the information being shared? A Other laws protect the women from harassment.

Rep Jess Edwards Rockingham 4 As legislators we are tasked with upholding everyone's Constitutional rights including both the woman's right to an abortion and the people's right to speak. We have put these law-abiding people in a place where they have no opportunity to correct this restriction. This law has never been used, likely won't be, but we are still restricting the right to freedom of speech. I think it should be repealed out of f fairness.

Dr Oge Young NH Medical Society Opposed The bill was passed in 2014 and defended in 2018. The law protects women who are seeking health care at a place that provides abortion care. Most women present to these clinics for health screening and many for contraception. The huge drop in abortion in NH and nationwide is largely due to wider access to birth control. The last thing we want to do is to limit access to that. Some of my clients come to me because they ae deterred to visit a clinic with these people outside. Roe v Wade was based on ghe privacy of patient/medical provider relationship. Clearly repealing would violate that privacy. Q Silber How do you reconcile your position with the First amendment to the US Constitution? A on the basis of Roe v Wade Q McLean-With no implementation since 2014, why do we need it so urgently? A It hasn't had to be implemented because the law is there. Q Alexander There are other buffer zones in law, around polling places for example. If someone wanted to protest rent, could they stand in the sidewalk next to Planned Parenthood and protest? A I don't know. I would think it would apply to any kind of protest.

Rep Abramson Supports I have heard people saying our buffer zone is Constitutional because it is smaller than the Massachusetts one rued unconstitutional, but the Supreme Court explicitly talked about a 23-foot zone and said that no business could prohibit speech like this. Leaving unconstitutional law in place has been a real problem for the Municipal and County committee. Local ordinances frequently depend on the language of RSAs. Questionable laws increase the legal cost to municipalities.

The buffer zone is only one tool in the clinic tool kit. The law is simply permissive, allowing the creation of a zone of needed. The small area covered maintains the balance required. Some people who stand outside Planned Parenthood Q Sylvia; Laws says the buffer zone "shall e demarcated" isn't that mandatory? A No. Some clinics might need such a zone, others not. Q Berch You said Supreme Court last month allowed a buffer zone in Pittsburgh to stand. Aren't there others? A Yes, several. Not all buffer zones are unconstitutional. Q McLean Why do we need the law without implementation after all this time? A As I said, the buffer zone is only one tool and it takes time to implement. The Manchester facility was recently renovated, and we look forward to ongoing discussions about how to protect women. Q Alexander If the buffer zone is repealed would ghe clinics have other tools to protect clients? A Yes, but that doesn't alter the fact it is an important tool, even if not used.

Beth Jorgenson Supports I go and pray outside the Manchester Planned Parenthood and have for about 10 years. There are usually about 5 or up to 10 people thee. We are very polite, and I've not seen any invasion of anyone's space. If people don't want to talk with us, they just go in and that's fine. My understanding is this buffer zone could force us across the street which is too far away for us to communicate with them.

Althea Ansah SFL UNH Supports The clinics are afraid of those who stand outside and offer alternatives to potential clients. Standing outside a clinic advocating for lives that could be lost at the clinics is no different than standing for black peoples' rights. Black lives matter and they have always mattered, including black babies who are aborted at rates many times higher than other people's babies. Q Horrigan Would say this speech restriction is worse than saying people can't tell others to not get a vaccine? A Comparing getting a vaccine is in my opinion apples to oranges. Q Langley Do you have any sense as to how many women actively ask for information from the people standing outside a clinic? A I can only say I know women who have told me if it weren't for people outside the clinic, they would have had the procedure.

*Eileen Aylars Clinic escort Opposes I have sent pictures of signs, audio and video of people who protest outside the clinic. Recently there has been a group coming on Friday who are loud and invasive. Now, I am the buffer zone; I stand between the patients and the protesters. The quarters are close on the sidewalk entrance to the concord clinic. If this were a bill that limited free speech, I would support it, but the buffer zone is just about protecting women. Across the country here is a lot of vandalism going on to clinics. Q Rice Have the Concord police been called to protect your clients? A yes, the police have been there on multiple occasions, sometimes called by the protestors who didn't like being told move away. Q So if the situation is that bad why haven't there been any arrests? Why not implement a buffer zone? A That's above my pay grade.

Susan Clifton Supports I am a retired nurse and a sidewalk counselor. I've b been going to Planned Parenthood in Manchester for over 15 years. We maintain a peaceful environment on Penacook Street. We offer help to the women, if they refuse, they just walk by.

*Susan Bruce Oppose I will speak about Concord. Here, we have a group that gathers every Friday morning. As you can see in the pictures I sent you, these are not peaceful folk who only pray. The protestors ae obnoxious. They are so loud that neighbors frequently shout out their windows telling them to Shut Up. The harass the women and post videos of their actions. This is not the kind of activity any of you would accept. White Supremacists are closely tied to the pro-life movement.

Jennifer Frizzell NH /Women's Foundation Opposes We believe women should have access to the full range of reproductive health services without harassment or intimidation. The law should be upheld because people should be able to access health services without intimidation. This law a=was carefully crafted to withstand the constitutional issues you have heard about today. When it was being drafted, it was specifically crafted to withstand the challenges to the Massachusetts law. The law allows a lot of flexibility with the UP TO 25-foot language. The law was challenged in federal Court and defended by the Attorney general. While the judge ruled the plaintiffs had not=standing, he did say the law was not facially invalid. US Supreme Court just recently allowed a 15-foot buffer zone to stand in Pittsburgh. As to statutes that all speech or only certain speech, this law prohibits any gathering in the buffer zoned. This law strikes a good balance between the rights of clients and protesters.

Francis Hynes Supports HB430 will repeal an unconstitutional law and restore free speech rights in NH. Most Wednesday's I go to {Planned Parenthood to pray. Each week I wonder if this is the week the police will come to enforce this law which protects only one type of business. Protesting any other type of business can be done freely but protesting abortion providers may be subject to fines and penalties. The law should not protect any single form of business.

Kathleen Yahnian Supports In my experience sidewalk counselors are polit and helpful. Last week a woman approaching Planned Parenthood for abortion changed her mind after fining out there was help for her. We are all volunteers who are there to help women.

*Ian Huyett General Counsel Cornerstone Supports The issue of coming into the lobby would be trespassing or other crime in NH. In the cases we heard about today, the Supreme court didn't actually rule, they simply denied Certiorari. In the NH case, the judge clearly said that if a buffer zone were established, ghe plaintiffs would have standing to challenge it, but didn't then. In ghe Massachusetts case, the court specifically ruled on the restriction of speech. Neither the size nor anything else was used as a basis for the decision. The NH has a carve out for clinic escorts which the Massachusetts law did not, making our law more unconstitutional. Q Sylvia Can you speak to the "Shall demarcate" zones? A Later on the statute says if no zone is created the law has no effect. In my opinion. The strategy is to keep the law on the books to chill speech but not implement it to avoid constitutional challenge. Q Silber Isn't it true that denying Certiorari is not precedent setting? Yes, and the Supreme Court often denies certiorari foo all kinds of reasons. Q McLean Could you explain levels of scrutiny? A Sure. Massachusetts law if the law burdens speech but not all speech If the law is "content discriminatory: then the standard becomes strict scrutiny which is much higher. **Jason Hennessey** President NHRTL Supports This bill has little to do with abortion but a lot about how the government treats citizens exercising their rights. How does it make sense to single out people who are pro-life to quell freedom of speech? Why should a private abortion provider control what people can say on public property? It doesn't make any sense. If this was a real issue some abortion provider would have taken advantage of it, but none has.

Dalia Vidunis Exec Dir Equality Health Center Opposes I totally support free speech, but I don't support people standing 6 inches away from your face and screaming at you. People should be protected as they seek legal medical treatment. The NH police have come to our center 7 times since COVID-19 started because the protestors weren't distancing or wearing masks. They also take pictures without people's permission. These patients, without their permission, have pictures posted in public. Equality has been if business for nearly 50 years. Several months ago, a patient was sitting in her car with partner. She wanted an ultrasound for gestational aging. They were surrounded by protestors with pictures of dismembered fetuses. They called us and we sent out escorts. A second case a woman had fetal anomalies. The protestors screamed at them for him to be a man and called her a murderer. When she entered the clinic, she crumpled. Another case a woman was called a murderer and a loser just for coming into our clinic. We don't know who will be well behaved, so we need the buffer zone to protect clients from these protestors. Q Rice You say we need this to keep people safe. How would repeal put more people in danger? A The issue is sometimes we have protestors who are not well behaved. When this new group showed up, we started an escort service. I have initiated discussion with Concord Police about a buffer zone but have been hindered by the COVID-19 crisis.

*Beth Scaer 40 Days for Life Supports I have been participating in these vigils for many years. We have friendly greetings with the Equality Center staff. The buffer zone law bans even peaceful prayer on the public sidewalk, even waiting for an Uber. These ae unconstitutional restrictions on our freedom of speech.

I am somebody on ghe sidewalk in Concord and Manchester. One day in Manchester we talked with a couple lover the fence and her partner started changing his mind. He was calling her to get her to come out. Planned Parenthood did the abortion before she came out on that same day. Freedom of speech is a right. Which includes ghe freedom to lie,

Jessica Gough Aa lot of the people we heard today call themselves sidewalk counselors. I went to a clinic for birth control and had I not had the support I did, I might not have gone into the clinic. Even with a 25-foot radius people are close enough to talk with clients.

I am writing on behalf of the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG) with deep concern regarding abortion related legislation: HB 622, HB 625, HB 430, HB 434, HB 596, and HB 233. These upcoming bills collectively threaten physicians' ability to provide the most appropriate reproductive medical care to women in New Hampshire.

ACOG opposes any legislation that limits women's access to reproductive health services, including pregnancy termination. Pregnancy termination has been shown time and again to be safe and is a widely accepted medical practice. Thank you for reaching out to the NH ACP chapter and its executive council in regards of the proposed house bills that will ban abortion, curtail insurance coverage and repeal buffer zones.
ACP believes that a woman has the right to make health care decisions about matters that affect her personal, individual health and in the past joined with other physician organizations to oppose bills that interfere with physician-patient relationship and restrict a woman's right to make autonomous decisions in respect of her reproductive health.
In a position paper on "Women's Health Policy in the United States" published in the Annals of Internal Medicine in June of 2018 ACP states that it "believes in respect for the principle of patient autonomy on matters affecting patients' individual health and reproductive decision-making rights, including about types of contraceptive methods they use and whether or not to continue a pregnancy as defined by existing constitutional law. On behalf of the American Medical Association (AMA) and our physician and medical student members, I am writing to express our concern about abortion-related legislation that would interfere with physicians' ability to provide timely reproductive medical care to women in New Hampshire. We believe such legislation represents a troubling legislative intrusion into the practice of medicine.

The AMA believes that all women should have access to reproductive health services, including abortion. The early termination of pregnancy is a safe, established, and accepted medical practice, and the decision whether, when, and how to perform an abortion is a medical matter that should be made between a physician and his or her patient, free of external interference and subject to the physician's clinical judgment, the patient's informed consent, and the standards of good medical practice.

This is a written testimony in opposition to HB 625 and 622.

I have been practicing ob/gyn for the last 17 years in NH. I have had the privilege of delivering babies for all of those years. Delivering babies at Elliot Hospital has allowed me to take care of high risk pregnancies at all gestational ages given our highest level neonatal intensive care unit. In learning about the recent house bills 625 and 622 I have to provide some clinical perspective as to why these bills should not pass. No provider should be have to put the fear of being charged with a felony into her/his decision making when trying to take care of a pregnant patient in the throes of a medical emergency.

Here are scenarios in which passage of these bills would have been detrimental to the care and health of the mother.

A patient presented at 21 weeks after rupture of membranes and was fully dilated. The couple had to process that there was no possible way to stay pregnant for the few weeks necessary for the newborn to survive. Induction of the second stage of labor was needed to facilitate delivery. I cannot imagine if I had to consider that I could be charged with a felony if I could not justify delivery. With delay in her care, she would have had additional physical and emotional pain as well as increased risk of significant infection.

A second patient presented at a gestational age prior to fetal viability with persistent and heavy bleeding that could not be controlled. Delivery by C-section was necessary to preserve the life of the mother. Again, I cannot imagine if I had to consider that I could be charged with a felony if I could not justify if the mother was bleeding enough. Should I have waited until more blood transfusions and blood products were necessary? What if while I waited she progressed to a condition called DIC (disseminated intravascular coagulation) where she may not have survived an otherwise uncomplicated C-section?

In these scenarios, the fetus would not have survived and delaying care would have had detrimental maternal consequences. There are complex, intense and emotional discussions that take place surrounding delivery. Obstetric providers should be able to make appropriate medical decisions with our patients without restrictions formulated by politicians.

Good afternoon. My name is Dr. Oge Young. I am a retired Ob/Gyn after 35 years of practice in Concord, NH. I am a past president of the NHMS, still serving on the General Council to represent NH obstetricians. I remain an Adjunct Professor at the Geisel School of Medicine at Dartmouth, having taught their students for almost 40years.

I am here representing the NHMS and NH women in opposition to HB430- repeal of the "Buffer Zone Law". This statute was made law in 2014. I remember well its passage and successfully defending the law from repeal in 2018. The statute stands simply to protect the privacy of patients and caregivers, while respecting the freedom of speech for those who are opposed to women seeking healthcare at facilities which provide abortions.

Just two points:

- 1) We should understand that less than 5% of women's visits to Planed Parenthood Clinics are for a termination of pregnancy. Most women present for wellness exams, health screenings like mammograms and Pap smears, and importantly, many request contraception to prevent unplanned and unwanted pregnancies. The precipitous drop in the number of abortions performed in NH and this country in recent years has come because of improved access to contraception. We should celebrate this trend and not limit education about and access to birth control by repealing the "Buffer Zone Law."
- 2) The U.S. Supreme Court decision Roe v. Wade handed down 48 years ago, was not determined on the premise to protect women's right of choice. Instead, it was written solely to protect the privacy of the patient-caregiver relationship. Clearly, repealing the "Buffer Zone Law' would jeopardize this sacred privacy, which protects patients and providers, and even those protesting the use of reproductive healthcare facilities.

Protecting Access to Clinics

Background

While the handful of murders of abortion providers and clinic staff have attracted much media attention, family planning clinics report that they frequently experience other serious forms of antiabortion violence. These include bombings, arson and vandalism, as well as violent protests and blockades. In 1994, the federal government enacted the Freedom of Access to Clinic Entrances (FACE) Act, which prohibits intentional property damage and the use of "force or threat of force or...physical obstruction" to "injure, intimidate or interfere with" someone entering a health care facility.

States have taken two approaches designed to protect abortion providers. Some states have enacted laws similar to the federal FACE Act that prohibit specific activities such as vandalism or obstruction at clinics. Other states have limited protests aimed at clinic patients by either creating "buffer" zones around clinics that bar protestors entirely or establishing floating "bubble zones" of several feet around a person who is within a specific distance of a clinic; protesters are prohibited from crossing into that "bubble zone" without

the person's consent. In 2014, the U.S. Supreme Court struck down the Massachusetts law that placed a 35-foot buffer zone around clinic entrances. The impact of this ruling on the New Hampshire law is still to be determined, but the decision did not immediately affect the Court's 2000 ruling that upheld Colorado's floating "bubble zone" law.

Highlights

- 14 states and the District of Columbia prohibit certain specified actions aimed at abortion providers.
 - 12 of the states and the District of Columbia prohibit blocking the entrance to and egress from clinic facilities.
 - 6 of the states and the District of Columbia prohibit threatening or intimidating staff who provide reproductive health services and/or patients entering the clinic.
 - 3 of the states prohibit property damage to facilities providing reproductive health services.
 - 2 of the states and the District of Columbia prohibit telephone harassment of staff who provide reproductive health services.
 - 5 of the states and the District of Columbia prohibit other specified actions, such as creating excessive noise outside the clinic, possessing or having access to a weapon during a demonstration at a medical facility, trespassing, or releasing a substance that produces noxious odor on clinic premises.
- 3 states have established a "bubble zone" around a person within a specific distance of a clinic's entrance or driveway.

Dear Members of the House Judiciary Committee,

My name is Dr. Christine Arsnow. I am a pediatrician and Vice President of the New Hampshire Pediatric Society, the state chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics, which represents 242 pediatricians in New Hampshire. My testimony is on behalf of that organization.

I am testifying in opposition to House Bills 434 and 596 because I believe that affordable access to emergency contraception and abortion is a crucial aspect of women's healthcare.

In addition, I would like to state the NH American Academy of Pediatrics opposition to HB622, HB625, HB430, and HB233.

A national report conducted by the CDC National Center for Health Statistics showed that 55% of male and female teens have had sexual intercourse by age 18.¹ As a mother of two young daughters, I understand the temptation to hide from these statistics. While we educate and foster a culture of responsible sexual behavior, we must offer options for women. These bills seek to severely restrict access to abortion and emergency contraception, which would have a negative impact on teenagers.

Teen pregnancy and childbearing bring substantial social and economic costs on teen parents and their children. Pregnancy and birth are significant contributors to high school dropout rates among girls. Only about 50% of teen mothers are able to earn a high school diploma compared to approximately 90% of women who do not give birth during adolescence. Children born to teenage mothers are more likely to have lower school achievement and to drop out of high school, have more health problems, be incarcerated at some time during adolescence, give birth as a teenager, and face unemployment as young adults.

Teenage pregnancy disproportionately impacts Black, Hispanic and Native people, and women from low-income backgrounds. Teens in child welfare systems are at higher risk of teen pregnancy and birth than other groups. Young women living in foster care are more than twice as likely to become pregnant than those not in foster care. Because women from low-income backgrounds are at higher risk for teen pregnancy, it is crucial to provide affordable emergency contraception and abortion services.

Studies suggest that almost 1 in 4 of women will have had an abortion by the age of 45.⁶ The Hyde Amendment currently bans the use of federal funds for abortion coverage for individuals enrolled in Medicaid,⁷ which means that these procedures must be paid for out of pocket or via state funds for those without private insurance. Taking away state support as this bill suggests would mean that women with low income, including teenagers, would need to pay out of pocket for abortions. At an average cost of over \$500,⁸ this is out of reach for many women.

Emergency contraception is a medication that can prevent pregnancy when used in the days immediately following unprotected intercourse. According to the 2006–2010 National Survey of Family Growth (NSFG) 11% of all sexually active women and nearly 1 in 4 sexually active women

ages 20-24 reported ever using emergency contraception.⁹ About half of these women reported using emergency contraception because of fear of method failure (45%), and half because they had unprotected sex (49%). It is appalling to imagine any young woman would be in a position where she could not access emergency contraception.


Abortion and emergency contraception are two necessary aspects of women's reproductive health that must be available and affordable to all women. The decision to proceed with one of these therapies should be between a woman and her doctor and should not be limited by the government. I strongly oppose this bill.

BACKGROUND

Reproductive health care providers, patients, and facilities are frequently the targets of violence and harassment, ranging from vandalism to threats to deadly attacks. The National Abortion Federation (NAF) has been compiling statistics on incidents of violence and disruption against abortion providers for over 40 years and its 2017 statistics reflected an escalation in the number of reported clinic invasions, obstructions, blockades, and targeted hate mail/harassing phone calls. NAF also recorded a significant increase in activities aimed at disrupting services, intimidating providers and patients, and preventing women from obtaining the health care they need. Recent years have also seen more incidents of violence, with devastating effects: in November 2015, three people were murdered and nine injured when Robert Dear brought an assault-style rifle to a Planned Parenthood health center in Colorado Springs and opened fire. ²

NEW HAMPSHIRE BACKGROUND

Reproductive health centers in New Hampshire have never been free of picketing and protest activity. However, in following national trends, in the past few years the volume and frequency of protests has increased and the escalating harassment and more intense tactics that protestors are willing to use has resulted in increased patient harassment and the increased need for on-site security. Obstructing the driveway entrance, blocking on-street parking spaces, photographing patients and staff and verbal assaults have become *routine* complaints from our patients and their family members. Protestors gather in front of the entrance and create barriers for patients seeking to access the health center and they invade the privacy of those who do not want to engage in dialogue while entering or exiting.

To address these public safety and health center access problems, the NH legislature enacted Senate Bill 319 in 2014, authorizing the establishment of patient safety "buffer" zones of "up to" 25 feet

surrounding the entrances to reproductive health facilities. The law was not mandatory but allows each facility and each community the flexibility to narrowly tailor a zone in accordance with local factors. Just weeks after Senate Bill 319 was signed into law, the U.S. Supreme Court issued a decision in *McCullen vs. Coakley 134 S.Ct 2518* which changed the legal landscape for balancing the competing constitutional rights involved.

NEW HAMPSHIRE'S LAW IS NO LONGER THE SUBJECT OF LITIGATION:

While New Hampshire's law was challenged based on the Supreme Court's decision in McCullen, the US District Court dismissed the challenge to NH's "Buffer Zone" case in 2016. Judge LaPlante ruled that the plaintiffs lacked standing in the Mary Rose Reddy et al v. Joe Foster et al case, clearing the way for thoughtful and deliberate implementation to occur. In 2017, this decision was reaffirmed by the First Circuit Court of Appeals.

NEW HAMPSHIRE'S LAW IS DISTINGUISHABLE FROM THE LAW STRUCK DOWN BY THE US SUPREME COURT

Not all buffer zones are unconstitutional. The Massachusetts Law established a mandatory buffer of 35-feet and treated all facilities in the state in an identical fashion, where NH's law allows for a discretionary buffer, and only enables a health center to create a patient safety zone as the facts and circumstances dictate.

AS RECENTLY AS LAST MONTH, THE UNITED STATES SUPREME COURT LEFT IN PLACE A PITTSBURG BUFFER ZONE.

The Supreme Court recently chose to leave in place a buffer zone law in Pennsylvania. The law had previously been upheld by the Third Circuit Court of Appeals.³

As violence and harassment towards abortion providers and health centers has escalated, Planned Parenthood of Northern New England (PPNNE) has considered how best to protect its patients and staff. The Manchester Health Center has undergone modernizations to the building, including changes to the parking lot, which just wrapped up last month. PPNNE meets regularly with local law enforcement to help explore ways to better protect patient safety and access. We need to continuously reassess every option to consider how best to protect our patients, providers, and staff.

We Urge the House Judiciary Committee to Maintain a Commitment to Patient Safety and Access and Vote "Inexpedient to Legislate" on HB 430

Thank you for reaching out to the NH ACP chapter and its executive council in regards of the proposed house bills that will ban abortion, curtail insurance coverage and repeal buffer zones.
ACP believes that a woman has the right to make health care decisions about matters that affect her personal, individual health and in the past joined with other physician organizations to oppose bills that interfere with physician-patient relationship and restrict a woman's right to make autonomous decisions in respect of her reproductive health.
In a position paper on "Women's Health Policy in the United States" published in the Annals of Internal Medicine in June of 2018 ACP states that it "believes in respect for the principle of patient autonomy on matters affecting patients' individual health and reproductive decision-making rights, including about types of contraceptive methods they use and whether or not to continue a pregnancy as defined by existing constitutional law. Accordingly, ACP opposes government restrictions that would erode or abrogate a woman's right to continue or discontinue a pregnancy. Women should have sufficient access to evidence-based family planning and sexual health information and the full range of medically accepted forms of contraception."

RE: HB 430 — Sidewalk Free Speech Act

I am here to speak on behalf of Cornerstone in support of HB 430 and to answer any legal questions the Committee may have about the constitutionality of RSA 132:38. In *McCullen v. Coakley*, the Supreme Court found that there is a First Amendment right to one-on-one communication. Nobody disputes that, if an abortion clinic actually demarcated a buffer zone tomorrow, protestors could still stand within sight of the clinic and hold signs. But Americans don't just have a First Amendment right to protest: we have a First Amendment right to engage in peaceful and consensual conversation and leafleting. As the Supreme Court said, these are methods "closely associated with the transmission of ideas."

On a personal note, I've experienced the way that leafleting can transmit ideas. I'm speaking to you on behalf of a Christian organization, but I first started to become interested in Christianity when someone offered me a tract—which is a kind of leaflet—at a time when I considered Christianity to be an unwelcome message. I've seen firsthand the power of these forms of communication to change minds.

After finding that a First Amendment activity was burdened, the Court next found that "the buffer zones burden substantially more speech than necessary" to achieve the state's interests. Harassment or crowding, for example, can be stopped by passing specific laws against harassment or crowding. Likewise, in New Hampshire, if there were truly threats to the safety of patients, then we already have tools like New Hampshire's criminal threatening statute.

Because it was overly broad, the Massachusetts law was unconstitutional. The Court's analysis did not turn on the fact that the buffer zone was permanently in place throughout the clinic's business hours or that it was exactly 35 feet.

Supporters of 132:38 argue that it is different than the Massachusetts law, and they are right—it is worse. This is not a case like Madsen v. Women's Health or Schenck v. Pro-Choice Network, where courts issued injunctions against specific troublesome individuals or groups. In fact, our law in New Hampshire contains a discriminatory carve-out for "patient escort services." The Supreme Court noted that Massachusetts' case was helped by the fact that its law did not contain an express "carve-out for the clinic escorts." If anything, the key difference between these two laws is that our buffer zone law could be subject to strict scrutiny and would be even more likely to be found unconstitutional. I am happy to answer any questions.

Background

The New Hampshire Women's Foundation invests in equality and opportunity for women and girls through research, education, advocacy, and philanthropy. As a grantmaking organization we provide financial support to community organizations including several that provide reproductive health care to women and teens. Our grantees have faced routine protest or patient harassment at their facilities. As an advocacy and research organization we select a handful of bills each year to take a position based on their importance and impact on fundamental rights or access to services. We are here today in opposition to House Bill 430 because we believe that women should have access to the full range of reproductive choices and related health coverage when faced with an unintended pregnancy, including abortion. And we further believe that all people should be able to access reproductive and sexual health care services without harassment or intimidation.

New Hampshire's current Patient Safety law should be upheld for the following reasons:

In NH, Patients Must Be Able To Access Health Care Without Confrontation and Harassment Some abortion protestors have a history of approaching women with aggressive body language or harsh and abusive verbal language. Complaints about this behavior and the fear and intimidation it caused for patients were well documented at the time this law was introduced and deliberated in 2013 and 2014. Patient reports included everything from physical obstruction where protestors would surround vehicles and block the entrance to the health center driveway to verbal harassment that often agitated and upset patients on their way in and out of health care visits. At times the activity is persistent enough to require the hiring of a security guard or off duty police officer which further emphasizes the importance of preserving tools for public safety

New Hampshire's Patient Safety Law is Carefully Crafted for Constitutional Considerations
It is critical that any laws that address patient safety and access to clinics conform with the constitutional precedents in this area. It is indeed the case that the *McCullen vs Coakley* case from the US Supreme Court (striking down a Massachusetts law) was decided in 2014 and it sets some

standards that weren't previously articulated. However, the flexibility provided in RSA 132 still leaves room for it to be implemented in a constitutionally permissible manner. Moreover, just last month the US Supreme Court let stand a 15-feet safety zone surrounding a clinic entrance in Pittsburgh. See *Nikki Bruni, et al v. City of Pittsburgh 592U.S.* _____, 2021. This most recent decision leaves open a path for patient safety zone ordinances to pass muster if they are carefully crafted.

Protecting Women's Health Access Is Especially Important At A Time of Heightened Pandemic Women in New Hampshire are experiencing a higher percentage of COVID-19 cases and deaths during this pandemic and they are also disproportionately experiencing unemployment and loss of earnings. Clearly patients and providers on the frontline need you to legislate with their health in the forefront and that goal is not served by this repeal.

Conclusion

The New Hampshire Women's Foundation respectfully requests that you reject House Bill 430 and the other legislation introduced to restrict reproductive health care. Instead we'd like to urge this legislature to focus your policy priorities on issues that would increase women's access to health and respect and alleviate the many economic, public health and caregiving burdens they are carrying.

I thank you for the opportunity to testify against this legislation and urge you to reject HB 430.

Coming before your committee today is HB430, repealing the prohibition on entering or remaining on a public way or sidewalk adjacent to a reproductive health care facility. I urge the House Finance Committee recommend this bill as "Inexpedient to Legislate" to the full House.

Manchester is home to one of New Hampshire's five Planned Parenthood Health Centers. Planned Parenthood provides high quality, affordable health care to the residents of Manchester and the surrounding communities. The Health Center has a great relationship with the City and with our Police Department's community policing division.

New Hampshire's buffer zone law, which passed with bipartisan support in 2014, protects the patients at health centers while also protecting First Amendment rights. The Planned Parenthood here in Manchester underwent recent renovations, and while they are not currently utilizing this buffer zone law, it is a necessary tool moving forward to ensure that patient, providers, and volunteers have a small area of separation for their privacy and safety.

I am Eileen Ehlers from Hooksett. I speak today representing myself: I am a former State Representative, a concerned NH resident, and a volunteer escort at Equality Health Center in Concord. I stand in opposition to HB 430.

Equality Health Center offers reproductive health services, and the building is located on Main St a few blocks south of The State House. The stairway entrance to the building is at the public sidewalk. Patients park at metered spaces on the street; there is no patient parking lot.

As we know the RSA which established a 25-foot buffer around abortion provider clinics has never been enacted. It is a worthwhile safety net for our entire community and should not be repealed. There may be a time health care providers choose to use it. For now, at the center where I volunteer, I and a few other people are the only buffer between patients and those who want to deny them the medical care they seek.

I have been an escort for many years, which includes periods in which my services are not needed. My responsibility is to wait outside for the arrival of patients, to walk with them to the door, and to facilitate the security protocol to enter the building. There have been periods of time when escorts were not needed; demonstrators stood on the corner praying. They were out of the way of pedestrians, and they did not approach nor interrupt the patients. After many months of this respectful and easy coexistence, the situation changed. More than two years ago, I was informed that a different group of protesters was congregating at the base of the center stairway creating a situation which intimidated the patients. They were shouting at them and shoving items into their hands. This protest group has been coming every Friday morning for the past 2 years, and so have I.

The escort team morphs; sometimes only my husband and I are there, sometimes we have a team of 5 or 6, sometimes the clinic director stands outside with us. The protest group also changes in number, but always coalesces around one organizer who is the leader and spokesman for the group. They number from 2 up to 10 people. Sometimes they have children with them.

Remember, for the past year we have been in a public health emergency situation. We have a city and state mask and social distancing mandate. The protesters usually do not wear masks...it is inconsistent among their group. They do not distance themselves from one another, nor from us, the clients, nor from community pedestrians. It is common for people coming down the sidewalk to walk behind parked cars onto the street to avoid the protesters. The police have instructed them to mask up and keep distance. They do not always comply. When they stand on the sidewalk they are less than 6 feet from the stairway. Anyone walking by is just a couple of feet from them.

The protesters used to set up 2 tables, a large stand umbrella, and even a dog bed and feeding bowls for the leader's dog. They do double duty out there: targeting the women patients with their loud and aggressive protest against them for seeking abortion, and evangelizing pedestrians by handing out religious pamphlets. Then they began setting up sandwich board signs on the sidewalk with graphic images and shaming messages. Finally the city code enforcement office and police came and ordered the encampment and signs to be removed, as violations of ADA - they were crowding the sidewalk. All the paraphernalia forced us to within inches of the unmasked and yelling protesters as we walked patients in.

The lead protester yells at the women, shouting cruel words, and inaccuracies about the work of the center, shaming them about their legal choice. There is no one-on-one conversation; the women are going to a scheduled doctor's appointment and have no desire to discuss their private and legal personal health situation with a strange man. The yelling is meant to harass, shame, intimidate. He imposes his religious judgments. He wears a body cam, taking audio/video of everyone who walks by him. Where else does this happen when people go see their doctor? Does it happen to you?

Escorts are there as a safety barrier - for everyone's safety. There have been occasions when we escorts have had to step in to de-escalate potential violence when a male partner of a patient and the protesters clash. The city police have responded to the scene many times; sometimes with multiple cruisers and several officers. In January Concord had a significant snowfall, and the snow banks created an even narrower sidewalk passage than usual. On that day I had already escorted an interpreter inside the building, and a few minutes lates the non-English speaking patient arrived. I walked her past the group of male protesters, who began yelling at her, and encroaching into our limited physical space. She looked at me with sheer terror in her eyes...I put my arm around her shoulders and hurried her

along...she was shaking with fear. That was a blatant violation of the the national FACE Act in place since 1994 (Freedom of Access to Clinic Entrances Act) - which forbids any actions or speech to make a representative of the clinic or a patient fear for their safety.

I hold high value for our First Amendment: I have march, protested, and demonstrated for more than 50 yrs. The protesters have a right to speak; they are NOT guaranteed a right to be heard. If a woman chooses to walk past them, the continued yelling and harassing is just wrong. I respect the different points of view about abortion. I respect everyone's right to their religious beliefs or lack thereof. None of that is my concern. Women's civil rights are my concern. The safety of the community is my concern, and it should not be politicized. This bill is not about abortion, it is about protecting everyone's rights and keeping everyone safe.

Protest. And access the health care you choose. Both are our rights, and both can occur safely and simultaneously in our community. I will be a human buffer to ensure women are not attacked, shamed, bullied. I am taking a personal risk. I network with escorts around the country, and I hear about bomb threats, broken windows, assaults. The Equality Health Center has had 2 arson attacks in years past. There are traveling groups of anti-choice protesters who go to many states and commit violent acts. In this time of heightened tensions around the country, I know that on any day the Equality Health Center could be a target of violence as many similar facilities are being targeted now. If and when those threats are brought to light, a buffer zone could provide level of safety that I and the other escorts cannot. The role of government is to provide for the general welfare and liberty. Protesting from 25' away is not unreasonable. It is not the loss of free speech.

I hope you all took the time to view the pictures I emailed to you so you could see the proximity of protesters to the stairway into the health center; the protesters encroaching into unsafe closeness of the standing escorts, the crowding of the sidewalk, the lack of masks, the graphic signs. Patients are running a gauntlet of intimidation. I hope you listened to the audio of the yelling man, who tried to bully the male partner of a patient. I hope you read the links I sent you - the documented accounts of escalating violence at abortion provider clinics. I hope you will vote Inexpedient to Legislate on HB430.

My personal experience as the Lead Greeter/Volunteer Supervisor at the Planned Parenthood Manchester location for 8 years is as follows:

I've seeing a concerning uptick in more aggressive protesting individuals at this location. I am in support The first amendment and of anyone who thinks that they might be able to help patients who use Planned Parenthood's abortion services. However, I find that over the years additional negative actors and more aggressive protesters arriving on the sidewalks who are truly causing fear towards these patients and any one coming in with them as a support system, As well as staff as well as staff and volunteers. The screaming, chanting and threats are very aggressive and in direct contrast to the people who usually walk the sidewalks every week praying and trying to offer their support to these people. They can be a Nuisance towards staff, volunteers, patience and their supportive friends or family, but the level of fear reported is worrisome. There's a direct difference between these two groups. I am writing to oppose HB 622, HB 625, HB 430, HB 434, HB 596, HB 233

These are all bills about restricting abortions, repealing the buffer zone and prohibiting funding for abortions. I have been an obstetrician gynecologist for 28 years. I am currently on faculty at The Geisel School of Medicine at Dartmouth and on staff at Dartmouth-Hitchcock Medical Center.

Abortion is part of evidence based reproductive healthcare. It is safe and legal. It is a decision that should be made by the patient and their doctor. The decision should not be made by the government. Government interference in these decisions only serves to shame and harm pregnant patients. It makes them have to travel out of state, spend more money, and risk harm to themselves. Pregnant patient are autonomous humans who deserve the right to self-determine their healthcare decisions and when to have children. Medical problems that require abortions are many. Patients should not die or become permanently disabled from a pregnancy. No matter what one's individual values are around the sanctity of human life, there is a complexity to medical decision-making that should not be placed in the hands of those who have not trained in medicine. We need to protect pregnant patients not put up barriers to care.

Further three of these bills criminalize performing an abortion in these cases. Dear Members of the House Judiciary Committee,

My name is Dr. Christine Arsnow. I am a pediatrician and Vice President of the New Hampshire Pediatric Society, the state chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics, which represents 242 pediatricians in New Hampshire. My testimony is on behalf of that organization.

I am testifying in opposition to House Bills 434 and 596 because I believe that affordable access to emergency contraception and abortion is a crucial aspect of women's healthcare.

In addition, I would like to state the NH American Academy of Pediatrics opposition to HB622, HB625, HB430, and HB233.

A national report conducted by the CDC National Center for Health Statistics showed that 55% of male and female teens have had sexual intercourse by age 18.¹ As a mother of two young daughters, I understand the temptation to hide from these statistics. While we educate and foster a culture of responsible sexual behavior, we must offer options for women. These bills seek to severely restrict access to abortion and emergency contraception, which would have a negative impact on teenagers.

Teen pregnancy and childbearing bring substantial social and economic costs on teen parents and their children. Pregnancy and birth are significant contributors to high school dropout rates among girls. Only about 50% of teen mothers are able to earn a high school diploma compared to approximately 90% of women who do not give birth during adolescence. Children born to teenage mothers are more likely to have lower school achievement and to drop out of high school, have more health problems, be incarcerated at some time during adolescence, give birth as a teenager, and face unemployment as young adults.

Teenage pregnancy disproportionately impacts Black, Hispanic and Native people, and women from low-income backgrounds. Teens in child welfare systems are at higher risk of teen pregnancy and birth than other groups. Young women living in foster care are more than twice as likely to become pregnant than those not in foster care. Because women from low-income backgrounds are at higher risk for teen pregnancy, it is crucial to provide affordable emergency contraception and abortion services.

Studies suggest that almost 1 in 4 of women will have had an abortion by the age of 45.⁶ The Hyde Amendment currently bans the use of federal funds for abortion coverage for individuals enrolled in Medicaid,⁷ which means that these procedures must be paid for out of pocket or via state funds for those without private insurance. Taking away state support as this bill suggests would mean that women with low income, including teenagers, would need to pay out of pocket for abortions. At an average cost of over \$500,⁸ this is out of reach for many women.

Emergency contraception is a medication that can prevent pregnancy when used in the days immediately following unprotected intercourse. According to the 2006–2010 National Survey of Family Growth (NSFG) 11% of all sexually active women and nearly 1 in 4 sexually active women

ages 20-24 reported ever using emergency contraception.⁹ About half of these women reported using emergency contraception because of fear of method failure (45%), and half because they had unprotected sex (49%). It is appalling to imagine any young woman would be in a position where she could not access emergency contraception.


Abortion and emergency contraception are two necessary aspects of women's reproductive health that must be available and affordable to all women. The decision to proceed with one of these therapies should be between a woman and her doctor and should not be limited by the government. I strongly oppose this bill.

On behalf of the New Hampshire Psychiatric Society and our members, I am writing to express our concern about and strong opposition to abortion-related legislation that would interfere with physicians' ability to provide timely reproductive medical care to women in New Hampshire. We stand firmly with our colleagues from the New Hampshire Medical Society and our state's other medical societies and believe that such legislation would be detrimental to the practice of medicine in our state.

The New Hampshire Psychiatric Society agrees with the stance of the American Medical Association that all women should have access to reproductive health services, and that this ought to include abortion. The early termination of pregnancy is a safe, established, and accepted medical practice. Physicians should play a key role in helping their patients choose whether, when, and how to perform an abortion without stigma. Furthermore, inability to access adequate reproductive medical care can be extremely detrimental to a woman's physical and mental health. As physicians who care deeply for the patients that we serve, we believe that efforts to deny access to established and accepted medical services as unacceptable. We strongly urge you and the members of your committee to protect the rights and health of our citizens and reject legislation that would limit timely access to abortion and other reproductive health services.

HB622/HB625

Dear Reps. Walter Stapleton and Beth Folsom,

Reproductive healthcare is essential healthcare. I am entering the field of medicine in order to ensure reproductive justice for everyone: that is, the right to both have a child and to not have a child. No one should be able to make this decision on behalf of someone else: it is up to each individual alone, with the guidance of their healthcare providers. I believe that good physicians understand that the decision to have a child is extremely complex and multifaceted; it takes into account a person's life circumstances including finances, housing, social support, job security, past and current medical history, and so much more. All of these factors go into the decision and/or ability to have a child, and it is unethical and unfair of our society to force pregnant individuals to have a baby without first being able to address all of these other concerns. How can we tell a person to have a baby if we cannot, as a society, guarantee that they will have a job in 6 months, or childcare? How can we tell a person to have a baby if we cannot guarantee that they will have a complication-free, safe pregnancy?

Furthermore, abortion access is a health equity problem: removing access to abortion disproportionately affects low-income populations with minimal access to care and sexual education; it also disproportionately affects communities of color. We know that removing access to safe, legal abortions does not decrease the number of abortions, it just forces pregnant people to find alternative, unsafe methods of abortion. Thus, removing access to abortion will only harm low-income individuals and communities of color further as they will either be forced to risk their health through unsafe methods of abortion or be forced into having children that they cannot or will not be able to provide for.

Denying physicians of the right to provide reproductive healthcare to their patients through abortions is unethical. The criminal penalties and punishments laid out by HB 622 and HB 625 discourage physicians from practicing patient-centered health care: these regulations prevent physicians from listening to their patients and trusting that patients know what is best for themselves. Physicians may have medical knowledge, but this knowledge is futile unless they meet their patients where they are in their lives and understand their patients' health in the context of their socioeconomic status, mental and physical health, and social support. Additionally, we know that banning safe and legal abortions does not actually reduce the number of abortions but rather forces individuals to seek out unsafe and risky methods of abortion. Thus, banning physicians from providing abortion in a safe manner will only cause more medical problems to arise later on, create unnecessary healthcare costs, and increase rates of morbidity and mortality among pregnant people. By continuing to allow physicians to provide legal abortions, we can avoid these undue risks and keep patients safe and healthy.

Dear Rep. Niki Kelsey,

In my experience, I have never met nor heard from anyone who has said that the decision to have an abortion was easy. It is difficult, and it's not something people actively seek out. Usually, it is a decision of circumstances. People may choose to have an abortion because they do not have the financial security, stable housing, or social/family support to care for a child; they may also be forced to have an abortion out of necessity for their own health and wellbeing if the pregnancy is putting their life at risk. Furthermore, individuals may not be ready for a child, and it would not be fair or right to force the child into the world at this time. The decision to have an abortion is not an easy one; but it is one that is only up to the pregnant patient and their healthcare provider, based on what is best for them and their partner.

As a volunteer for Planned Parenthood NYC, I witnessed firsthand the harassment that patients faced on their way to the health care clinic from anti-abortion protestors. Protestors would spend hours on end standing outside of the clinic, screaming at clinic visitors and intruding on their personal space. The protestors made it difficult for patients to reach the door of the clinic, and they drew attention to the clinic with their loud screams. Most importantly, the protestors embarrassed the patients and shamed them for making a personal decision that they did not understand, nor did they try to; the protestors did not know the circumstances leading to the patient's decision to have an abortion and they lacked empathy and compassion for the many different reasons that an individual could choose an abortion. The choice to have a child or to not have a child is up to each and every individual alone, with guidance from their healthcare provider. Allowing protestors to stand on sidewalks next to reproductive healthcare facilities is unethical and causes undue shame and trauma on individuals who are already in the midst of making difficult and confusing life decisions. I believe wholeheartedly in the right to protect patients from harassment on their way to health care visits, including health care visits regarding their reproductive health and wellbeing.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty One

AN ACT repealing the prohibition on entering or remaining on a public way or sidewalk adjacent to a reproductive health care facility.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 Short Title. This act shall be known as "The Sidewalk Free Speech Act."
- 2 Findings and Purpose. The general court finds that:
- I. The exercise of a person's right to free speech is a first amendment activity, and one which the New Hampshire Bill of Rights is especially zealous in protecting. N.H. Const. Part 1 Art. 22 (Stating that "Free speech... ought... to be inviolably preserved."). The right to free speech protects viewpoints which are controversial, unpopular, and offensive or otherwise inconvenient.
- II. RSA 132:37 through RSA 132:40 would infringe upon free speech.
- III. The United States Supreme Court has observed that "one-on-one communication' is 'the most effective, fundamental, and perhaps economical avenue of political discourse.'... 'handing out leaflets in the advocacy of a politically controversial viewpoint... is the essence of First Amendment expression'; '[n]o form of speech is entitled to greater constitutional protection.'... When the government makes it more difficult to engage in these modes of communication, it imposes an especially significant First Amendment burden." *McCullen v. Coakley*, 573 U.S. 464, 488-489 (2014) (citing *Meyer v. Grant*, 486 U.S. 414, 424, (1988); *McIntyre v. Ohio Elections Comm'n*, 514 U.S. 334, 347 (1995)).

- IV. RSA 132:37 through RSA 132:40, if ever implemented through the demarcation of a buffer zone, would be subject to immediate constitutional challenge. Reddy v. Foster, (stating that plaintiffs will have standing to challenge the constitutionality of the law once an abortion clinic "demarcate[s] a zone.").
- V. If subject to constitutional challenge, RSA 132:37 through RSA 132:40 is likely to be, and ought to be, struck down under either the federal or state Bills of Rights. *McCullen v. Coakley*, 573 U.S. 464 (2014) (correctly invalidating Massachusetts buffer zones under the First Amendment).
- VI. RSA 132:37 through RSA 132:40 has served no public purpose.
- 3 Repeal. RSA 132:37-40, relative to access to reproductive health care facilities, are repealed.
- 4 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
