Amendment to HB 434

1 Amend section 2 of the bill by replacing paragraph II with the following:

3 II. The purpose of this act is to ensure, to the maximum extent permitted by the Supremacy
4 Clause, that public funds are not used to subsidize abortion.

6 Amend RSA 132:44 as inserted by section 3 of the bill by replacing it with the following:

8 132:44 Use of School Tuition and Fees for Abortion Prohibited. No part of any tuition or fees
9 paid to a public institution of higher education shall be used in any way to pay for an abortion,
10 provide or perform an abortion, make a referral for abortion, or provide facilities for an abortion.

11

12 Amend RSA 132:48 as inserted by section 3 of the bill by replacing it with the following:

14 132:48 Construction. The scope of this subdivision is limited to those abortions not received by
15 Medicaid recipients and reimbursed or otherwise financed pursuant to the state's Medicaid plan.
16 Nothing in this subdivision shall be construed as creating or endorsing a statutory right, or
17 recognizing a constitutional right, to abortion or to federal or state funds for abortion.

TESTIMONY

***Rep. Sheehan Supports** HB434 does only one thing: it prohibits public funds from funding abortions directly or indirectly. It is an administrative one only so it contains no penalty. HB434 in no way infringes on the right to abortion or adds any regulation of abortion. I have submitted an amendment exempting State Medicaid funds

Rep Plett; HB596 only prohibits funding for convenience abortions. HB434 is a good bill as well and I will let the Judiciary committee decide which should prevail. Q Alexander: Is there a penalty in HB596? A Yes. The penalty funds the fund Q Is ghe sponsor of 434 open to adding a penalty? A No Q Horrigan: Why have this definition of Secular Humanism? A That comes from the US Supreme Court. It is included so all religions are included. Q Can you give a citation for that ? A I will defer to a following speaker

Senator Perkins-????? Opposes both bills Pregnancy is a time of great vulnerability. Many pregnancies are difficult and we don't need politicians in the room shaming them. We should put no barrier between ghe mother and an abortion.

*Elizabeth Canada PPAF Oppose HB434 puts a gag rule on schools including colleges & universities. It would prohibit them from giving students the full range of options available to them when pregnant.

Rep Maureen Mooney Support HB434 I am only speaking on behalf of HB434 and no other. This bill puts our current practice into law. NH is only of only a few states without a law prohibiting abortion funding. This bill gives clarity. The US Supreme Court has explicitly ruled that not funding a legal practice is lawful. Q McLean: What if you have an incarcerated individual who wants an abortion. Would this bill ban transportation of that prisoner as it would use state resources? A I would think hat transportation to a medical facility would be in order. I am unsure about funding. Q Would you be open to an amendment to clarify that? A Yes.

***Rep Amanda Toll** Oppose HB434 Bill would prohibit colleges from providing resources. As a college student I got an abortion which empowered me to complete my education. Later I had a child and I am leading the life I wanted. Having an abortion literally saved the life I wanted. When public funds are limited, the marginalized are impacted the most and would be most harmed by this bill. Legal barriers will not stop abortion.

Dr Julia Mead Oppose State already denies using Medicaid funds for abortion and the Hyde amendment prohibits using federal money. Refusing to give information about the full range of reproductive care violates medical ethics.

Jason Hennessey President NHRTL Supports both bills The issue today is whether we should force the hundreds of thousands of NH citizens with religious or other opposition to abortion violates their rights of conscience.

***Jake Berry** VP Policy New Futures Strongly oppose both bills. We believe reproductive care is extremely important especially for the students who would be impacted by HB434. More broadly these bills undermine the health and well-being of a very large number of people.
Maddie Daniel Nh HS Democrats Oppose both bills Everyone should have full access to this important medical service. Abortions cost up to \$1000. This makes abortion unaffordable for low income people. Over 56% of NH citizens support abortion services and our money should follow.

Tom Walton I would not start my companies in NH today as I did 25 years ago for two reasons: our fertility rate is far below the replacement rate which limits the future work force. I am one of seven children which is the loving sacrifice that children are. Q Horrigan These bills deal only with abortion funding. Do you support raising the minimum wage to help young people move here to raise families? A I recognize the need and adoptive and foster parents are readily available. There is always a choice and abortion is a poor choice for women. Do you have any suggestions as to what we can do to encourage younger people like Family Medical leave, etc.? A Yes, a manufacturing juggernaut would be exactly the prescription for a younger more dynamic economy.

Christine Wiehle One heart Ministries Supports I stand for Life. My mother chose life at age 17 and I want to see our tax dollars move to supporting life not ending it. I work with women in crises and there are many non-profit organizations to support unplanned pregnancies. We should be giving our money to places that offer hope instead of abortion.

***Jeanne Hruska:** ACLU NH Opposes both bills I struggle to understand HB596 language. Public funds are used daily for things with which people disagree. Taxpayers do not get to direct their tax dollars. HB434 is extreme with the very narrow exception language and would have little to no effect on people of means. Instead it denies money to those who need the money the most. Poor people are forced to save the money.

***Kate Maloney** SFL Regional Coordinator Supports both bills We recently did polling that shows strong opposition to public funding of abortions. With no restrictions on abortion, it is important that the State not allow its funds to be used for them. This restriction serves the public good by recognizing the value of human life.

Josie Pinto Opposes both bills WE do not need these bills because we don't have public funding of abortion. I support full public funding of abortion. The current practice is blatant discrimination against poor people. We should be expanding access to abortion for College students.

Louise Spencer Opposes both bills The gag rule will reduce the information available to college students. This is particularly important considering the high level of rape on college campuses. These women need the full range of information about their options. It seems quite unfair that money can be spent at clinics that provide only partial information and not at ones that give it all. I find it disingenuous to say this isn't about abortion.

Stephanie George Opposes Abortion is a safe and legal medical procedure. HB596 would be an excessive government restriction on abortion. WE should not put barriers between women and their health care. The Hyde amendment already prevents abortion funding and every year the state does the same. There is no medical purpose for these bills.

***Chris Sevier** Supports both but prefers If one says abortion doesn't take a human life that is blatantly secular humanist because the science says life begins at conception. Regardless of personal feelings, the State of NH is prohibited from using state money to support this religious belief. Using state money for abortions violates two of the three prongs of the "Lemon test".
Q Simpson: You mention HB596 is similar to other states. Can you point us to them A this bill was developed by numerous legal scholars after the Trump administration rule was provided. As to other states I can get you information about other states who have introduced this language. Q Alexander This seems like a national effort. Are you a practicing attorney? A NH resident? A I am a practicing attorney. NH must follow Federal law. We work with several NH groups so we have aided them. Q

Langley Who determines if an abortion is a convenience abortion? A Convenience abortion is just a term of art also called by other names.

***Alyssa Antman** Opposes Abortion care is important for college students.

Christopher Ager Supports HB434 Oppose HB596 I think this is the path the committee should take. HB434 protects people of conscience from funding things they find morally wrong

Melissa Maye Supports Proverbs 31:8-9. I represent not only churches but women who have been forced into abortion. I support these bills because abortion is immoral and the state has an obligation to fight for life.

Ian Huyett Gen Counsel Cornerstone Support HB434 with propose amendment The proposed amendment will deflect a long constitutional battle. Opponents say the bill prevents something that doesn't happen which is the precise intent. The government can adopt any position and fund that position. But, the state is not required to fund a position it holds. HB434 simply directs how government money is spent and puts no gag on anyone. Q McLean Please ,explain how there is no gag order in HB434 132:47-I A You presume that "participating" would include "referral" but since referral is used in other places in the bill it wouldn't be read into "participating" here

Olivia Balabanas UNH student Opposes HB434 The UNH health center is the only one readily available to students on campus and should be allowed to give students full information and referrals for reproductive health care.

Rep Walt Stapleton Supports both The state has an important interest in protecting its future citizens. Part I Article II of NH Constitution Natural Rights support that assertion. The Hyde amendment has already signaled it will overturn the Hyde amendment which means the State will have to provide that protection for us.

Travis Ohara An unplanned pregnancy impacted my life. At age 15 unplanned pregnancy impacted my life by giving me my daughter and pushing me to complete my education and build a great life with my family.

Leah Cohen Oppose both bills I am outraged . NH is healthcare. The attempt to restrict it during a pandemic are short sighted at best. Is removing an appendix a convenience surgery?

Dr Christine Arsenault Oppose both Emergency access to contraception is critical . Many Teenagers have sex. They need this protection. Pregnancy and birth are major contributors to High School Dropouts and strong indicator of poorer life quality later. Women in low income areas are more likely to have unplanned pregnancy. A lot of young women use emergency contraception. Abortion and emergency contraception are two parts of health care that should be available to all women.

Rep Maria Perez Opposes It hurts to hear guys talking about our bodies. I was sexually assaulted by my own father. How can anyone tell me I have to keep that baby when I have already been abused.

Testimony

Hello members of the New Hampshire State Judiciary. My name is Kate Maloney, and I am the New England Regional Coordinator for Students for Life of America. I am here today to represent the Pro-Life interests for the students of New Hampshire. I support HB 434 and HB 596. I strongly urge you to support HB 434 and HB 596. Recently, Students for Life of America's Institute for Pro-Life Advancement released a poll and found that 7 out of 10 Millennials and Gen Z want to VOTE on abortion-related policy. More than 7 out of 10 expressed support for limits on abortion. Almost 5 in 10 do not support forcing all Americans, regardless of their beliefs, to pay for abortions. In a state where abortion access is unlimited and where abortion facilities are not inspected by the department of health, it is in this legislature's best interest to respect the consciences of its taxpayers to ensure that public funds are not used for abortions. New Hampshire has numerous options for women who are facing an unplanned pregnancy, there are Federally Qualified Health Care Centers which outnumber Planned Parenthood's 16 to 1, and outnumber Planned Parenthood services, Pregnancy Help Centers, which offer free ultrasounds, pregnancy tests, and material assistance, and maternity homes that are there to support and enrich the individual, not profit from them. Students for Life has an initiative called Standing with You to provide parents and pregnant and parenting students with information on resources available to them. Having funds allocated for Foster Care and adoption initiatives will build a culture of life in New Hampshire that serves the community, by recognizing the dignity of every human person.

New Hampshire has consistently withheld public funds from abortion and should continue to do so because pregnancy is not a disease cured by abortion, let's be clear if your healthcare kills people on purpose, you're doing it wrong. In conclusion I urge you to support the passage of HB 434, and to continue a legacy of funding life-affirming non-violent healthcare. Thank you for your time.

Dear Members of the House Judiciary Committee,

My name is Dr. Christine Arsnow. I am a pediatrician and Vice President of the New Hampshire Pediatric Society, the state chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics, which represents 242 pediatricians in New Hampshire. My testimony is on behalf of that organization.

I am testifying in opposition to House Bills 434 and 596 because I believe that affordable access to emergency contraception and abortion is a crucial aspect of women's healthcare.

In addition, I would like to state the NH American Academy of Pediatrics opposition to HB622, HB625, HB430, and HB233.

A national report conducted by the CDC National Center for Health Statistics showed that 55% of male and female teens have had sexual intercourse by age 18.¹ As a mother of two young daughters, I understand the temptation to hide from these statistics. While we educate and foster a culture of responsible sexual behavior, we must offer options for women. These bills seek to severely restrict access to abortion and emergency contraception, which would have a negative impact on teenagers.

Teen pregnancy and childbearing bring substantial social and economic costs on teen parents and their children. Pregnancy and birth are significant contributors to high school dropout rates among girls. Only about 50% of teen mothers are able to earn a high school diploma compared to approximately 90% of women who do not give birth during adolescence.² Children born to teenage mothers are more likely to have lower school achievement and to drop out of high school, have more health problems, be incarcerated at some time during adolescence, give birth as a teenager, and face unemployment as young adults.³

Teenage pregnancy disproportionately impacts Black, Hispanic and Native people, and women from low-income backgrounds.⁴ Teens in child welfare systems are at higher risk of teen pregnancy and birth than other groups. Young women living in foster care are more than twice as likely to become pregnant than those not in foster care.⁵ Because women from low-income backgrounds are at higher risk for teen pregnancy, it is crucial to provide affordable emergency contraception and abortion services.

Studies suggest that almost 1 in 4 of women will have had an abortion by the age of 45.⁶ The Hyde Amendment currently bans the use of federal funds for abortion coverage for individuals enrolled in Medicaid,⁷ which means that these procedures must be paid for out of pocket or via state funds for those without private insurance. Taking away state support as this bill suggests would mean that women with low income, including teenagers, would need to pay out of pocket for abortions. At an average cost of over \$500,⁸ this is out of reach for many women.

Emergency contraception is a medication that can prevent pregnancy when used in the days immediately following unprotected intercourse. According to the 2006–2010 National Survey of Family Growth (NSFG) 11% of all sexually active women and nearly 1 in 4 sexually active women

ages 20-24 reported ever using emergency contraception.⁹ About half of these women reported using emergency contraception because of fear of method failure (45%), and half because they had unprotected sex (49%). It is appalling to imagine any young woman would be in a position where she could not access emergency contraception.

Abortion and emergency contraception are two necessary aspects of women's reproductive health that must be available and affordable to all women. The decision to proceed with one of these therapies should be between a woman and her doctor and should not be limited by the government. I strongly oppose this bill.

This bill that I am introducing does one thing only, it prohibits direct funding of abortions or the termination of a pregnancy.

Specifically, it bars public funds from being spent on abortions, public schools from performing abortions or providing medication to terminate a pregnancy, or public employees from performing abortions within the scope of their employment.

This bill has one exception and that is when the mother's life is endangered.

This bill also prohibits publicly-funded referrals made to facilitate an abortion.

This bill is an administrative measure only and has no penalties. This bill is in no sense about permitting or prohibiting abortions.

This bill will not prohibit Planned Parenthood or other organizations that perform abortions from receiving public funding for other purposes. There is no argument to be made that this bill would have detrimental impact on women's healthcare. There is no reason not to pass this bill unless the General Court insists that abortions be directly financed by tax payers.

This is also a commonsense housekeeping measure. The General Court's budget prohibited state funding for abortions in the fiscal years 2012-2013, 2018-2019 and 2020-2021. This legislation will make it unnecessary to continue rehearsing this same provision.

Please note I have submitted a proposed amendment to this bill, which says that it will not apply to abortions received by Medicaid recipients under the state's Medicaid plan. This bill is a housekeeping state matter, and is not intended as a challenge to the federal Medicaid Act.

I've become aware that the bill could be challenged if that is not made clear. I believe the amendment I've proposed will resolve that.

To The House of Representatives,

My name is Tamara (Tami) Chin. I am a Family Medicine resident physician at Concord Hospital, and I am writing in opposition to HB 434. As a Family Medicine resident, I care for my patients in all walks of life and in all different settings -- I get to see them for their annual physicals, I admit them to the hospital when they're ill, I assist on their elective surgeries, and I deliver their babies. This comes with the ultimate privilege of intimately knowing them through the highs and lows of their lives. I also work with a very specific patient population, most of which are on either financial assistance or on Medicaid. Therefore, anything that diverts public funding away from any type of healthcare service directly affects the people I work so hard everyday to try to protect. Taking government sponsored funding away from abortion services, including emergency contraception, will only create more barriers for the women who need access to these services the most.

It is no secret that poverty puts you at a higher risk for seeking out termination services -- a study by the Guttmacher institute in 2016 concluded that although abortion rates are at an all time low since 1973, they are highly concentrated among impoverished women, and that 73% of women seeking abortion cited financial strain as their motivating factor. Taking away public funding will mean that these women will not be able to afford termination services and will be forced to carry to term a life they cannot safely or adequately care for.

A striking example of what this could mean has actually happened to me recently, although I have many similar stories just from my two short years of taking care of this population. A woman came to our hospital, just having delivered her baby in the ambulance. Toxicology screens of the baby and Mom were positive for multiple substances. I sat with this patient as she expressed to me feelings of self-hatred and disgust as she knew she was not an appropriate parent for this infant, who was now withdrawing to the point of needing oral morphine. She disclosed to me that she had wanted an abortion, but due to a combination of the COVID-19 pandemic and lack of financial means and transportation, she was ultimately unable to.

My fear is if this bill passes, this will become not the exception but the reality. Imagine if this woman had the resources to get herself to a clinic and pay for a Copper IUD, which would not only serve as emergency contraception but also long term contraception while she continues in her recovery journey. Should this bill pass, this woman and many patients like her, including the younger generation who may have to rely on school based clinics for access to birth control, will continue to be forced into traumatic situations that no one should have to face.

Thank you for your time today and for hearing my testimony. My name is Olivia Balabanis, I am a student at UNH, and I am speaking in opposition to HB 434. This is an extreme bill that impedes reproductive health care access for public colleges and universities.

Our UNH wellness center is the only accessible health care provider for many students living on and around campus, myself included. During a time where health care is more difficult to access, this bill would even further harm students by taking that care away.

If HB 434 is passed, the trust the wellness center has established with every student would be diminished, especially when it comes to reproductive health, since medical professionals would no longer be able to relay every option available to patients, at no fault of their own, but rather at the fault of government interference..

My peers and I deserve the right to accurate and thorough healthcare, and this should not be impeded upon by the views of certain politicians.

**Statement by Jeanne Hruska, ACLU-NH Political Director
House Judiciary Committee
House Bills 596 and 434
February 10, 2021**

I submit this testimony on behalf of the American Civil Liberties Union of New Hampshire (ACLU)—a non-partisan, non-profit organization working to protect civil liberties throughout New Hampshire for over 50 years. I appreciate the opportunity to testify today in opposition to both HB596 and HB434.

HB596 is incomprehensible and unworkable, with references to “non-secular shams,” “non-controversial transcultural morality,” and the offensive idea of a “convenience” abortion. It garbles the law and wrongly asserts that public funding for abortion violates the First Amendment. Public funds are used every day for services and undertakings with which members of the public disagree, this includes paying for war, incarceration, and even vaccinations – on which the government is currently spending billions without any infringement on the First Amendment.

It is impossible to know how this bill would operate in practice or how courts might interpret many of its provisions and terms. At a minimum, this bill is likely to result in lengthy and costly litigation as doctors, patients, hospitals, and even the government try to discern its meaning.

The ACLU-NH also opposes HB434 in its entirety. This bill is extreme. It includes a very narrow exception for the “physical” health of the pregnant person. It would only allow funding for abortion services when “the life of the mother is endangered by a physical disorder, physical illness, or physical injury include a life-endangering physical condition caused by or arising from the pregnancy itself.” This is an extremely narrower exception, excluding coverage for people who become pregnant due to rape or incest. And the narrow exception excludes coverage for abortion services necessary for the emotional or psychological health of the mother, or other health considerations as determined by a doctor.¹

This bill would allow public funding for family planning, prenatal care, and for the hefty expenses related to childbirth, and yet would prohibit funding for an equally valid healthcare service. HB434 would have little to no impact on people with financial means. Instead, it discriminates against low-income individuals and singles them out by denying them medical care. Public funding restrictions leave some people little choice but to use money they need for food, rent, clothing, or other necessities to pay for an abortion. Moreover, many low income

people are forced to delay their abortions in an effort to save up the money needed for the medical care, increasing their medical risks.

Moreover, this bill would impose a gag rule on public institutions of higher learning by prohibiting them from using any tuition or fees to make even a referral for abortion. This means a doctor working for a public education institution would be prohibited from providing information about abortion to their patient, including a patient who is pregnant as the result of rape or incest. Patients go to their doctor expecting to be informed of all their options and for the doctor to be honest and forthright with them. This bill would dictate to doctors what type of advice they are allowed to give their patient and would replace the advice and consultation of a doctor with a one-size-fits all opinion of a politician.

For these reasons, the ACLU-NH respectfully urges the members of this committee vote *inexpedient to legislate* on both HB596 and HB434.

Thank you for reaching out to the NH ACP chapter and its executive council in regards of the proposed house bills that will ban abortion, curtail insurance coverage and repeal buffer zones.

ACP believes that a woman has the right to make health care decisions about matters that affect her personal, individual health and in the past joined with other physician organizations to oppose bills that interfere with physician-patient relationship and restrict a woman's right to make autonomous decisions in respect of her reproductive health.

In a position paper on "Women's Health Policy in the United States" published in the Annals of Internal Medicine in June of 2018 ACP states that it "believes in respect for the principle of patient autonomy on matters affecting patients' individual health and reproductive decision-making rights, including about types of contraceptive methods they use and whether or not to continue a pregnancy as defined by existing constitutional law. Accordingly, ACP opposes government restrictions that would erode or abrogate a woman's right to continue or discontinue a pregnancy. Women should have sufficient access to evidence-based family planning and sexual health information and the full range of medically accepted forms of contraception."

On behalf of the American Medical Association (AMA) and our physician and medical student members, I am writing to express our concern about abortion-related legislation that would interfere with physicians' ability to provide timely reproductive medical care to women in New Hampshire. We believe such legislation represents a troubling legislative intrusion into the practice of medicine.

The AMA believes that all women should have access to reproductive health services, including abortion. The early termination of pregnancy is a safe, established, and accepted medical practice, and the decision whether, when, and how to perform an abortion is a medical matter that should be made between a physician and his or her patient, free of external interference and subject to the physician's clinical judgment, the patient's informed consent, and the standards of good medical practice.

Protecting the sanctity of the patient-physician relationship, including defending the freedom of communication and medical decision-making between patients and their physicians, is a core priority for the AMA and a fundamental tenet of high-quality medical care. We view efforts to deny patients access to established and accepted medical services as unacceptable governmental interference into the practice of medicine. We strongly urge you and the members of your committee to reject legislation that would limit timely access to abortion and other reproductive health services.



Dr. Wayne Goldner: Fighting over abortion solves nothing.

ABORTION has taken place for thousands of years, performed by women for women. Abortion battles detract from other significant issues, we need compromise and a framework to move forward.

Some extremists are consumed with making abortion illegal in all cases, occasionally allowing for rape, incest and health of the mother. Other extremists insist on “abortion on demand” without any room for discussion. These are the “illiberal” right and left, those who consider their opinions irrefutable. It’s time for the rest of us to find a middle ground.

For 35 years I practiced obstetrics and gynecology and that included the provision of abortions. No woman ever plans to have an abortion and it is with great emotion and reflection that they choose to terminate their pregnancy. Regardless of their core beliefs prior to their pregnancy, they came for their procedure with carefully thought-out reasoning.

Throughout our nation's history, the rights of women to reproductive care have come under attack by predominantly White male legislators seeking to control women by controlling reproduction. When women’s rights are oppressed, history tells us that they still find birth control and have abortions. What does increase is their death and maiming. Prior to Roe, many city hospitals had wards for abortion complications i.e., Ward K at Philadelphia General Hospital. Much has been written about the horror of these places, the suffering of the women, the destruction of their bodies and the callousness of the authorities.

After the Civil War, with a great need to grow the population, abortion became a political, social and power issue. It included the Storer physicians, a father and son fighting for restricting abortion both for their personal beliefs and on behalf of the newly formed AMA to remove the competition of midwives and women (irregulars). Organized crime became involved in abortions. Also, it was not uncommon for a woman to be raped prior to her abortion. I have had a conversation with a woman who was raped by her Park Avenue doctor on the exam table before he performed her pre-Roe abortion. With restrictive laws, birth rates do not go up but death and harm does.

There has arisen an entire industry and complex socioeconomic relationships over abortion provision and restriction. Much time, energy and money is spent and little

changes. Despite these battles, the abortion and birth rates have both declined in the United States. In 1980, post Roe, abortions peaked at 29.3 abortions per 1,000 women/year age 15-44. In 2017 that was 13.5, the lowest rate ever observed and more than a 50% decrease. Abortions are being done earlier, and more with medical rather than surgical procedures. Laws can't make elective abortions zero. There will be rapes, incest, drugs, alcohol, failed contraception and peer pressure that will cause unintended pregnancies.

Legal abortions can be early, safe and rare. Education and access to affordable long-acting contraceptives are essential. A grade-appropriate, comprehensive health curriculum in schools is shown to decrease unplanned pregnancies as well as sexually transmitted diseases. They do not increase sexual activity. I helped design and teach a health curriculum in my town's schools. Many of those students have commented how effective it was for them. Yet, the schools were picketed by anti-choice groups and as a safety issue I was relieved of my volunteer teaching. Subsequently the curriculum was watered down to meaningless.

Due to restrictive laws, cumbersome regulations and harassment, 89% of counties in the U.S. have no abortion clinics. Women may have to travel hundreds of miles to obtain care. Lack of providers in rural and impoverished areas leave women vulnerable to unplanned pregnancies and untreated STD's. With better access, abortions would be earlier, safer and done medically.

Over the last several decades, availability of long-acting contraceptives has been a liberating development. Medicated and unmedicated IUD's, implants and injections have increased contraceptive efficacy. They are covered by insurance and can be obtained free from some private funds. No longer do women have to depend on taking a daily pill or using condoms. However, there have been several successful lawsuits allowing employers to eliminate birth control from their health insurance i.e., Hobby Lobby. This is a detriment to employee health.

We need a long-lasting solution. Emphasis on education and prevention will decrease abortions, increase the health of women and allow time and resources to be redirected to other pressing issues.

When I joined my practice in 1982, an anti-choice OB/GYN in my town would not speak to me. Over time he realized that his patients may choose abortion. We both learned to understand each other's views and eventually, when a patient opted for a termination, he would send her to me. When I had a patient who preferred an office without abortion services, I sent her to him. We came to an accommodation and so can all of us.

As a college student, I know that my peers who rely most on this care will be most negatively impacted by this poor legislation. Our UNH wellness center is the only accessible health care provider for many students living on and around campus, myself included. Students already facing immense challenges, especially during the pandemic, will be most affected, including those with low-income, LGBTQ+ individuals, and students of color. During a time where health care is more difficult to access, this bill would even further harm students by taking that care away.

As a college student living in New Hampshire full time throughout the year, Health and Wellness at UNH is the only way I can access affordable health care, along with many of my peers, especially since both my parents are small business owners, so my health insurance is never guaranteed. This legislation would permit public funding for only select reproductive health care. It would enable Medicaid to cover family planning, prenatal care, and the hefty expenses related to child birth, but would prohibit funding for abortion care. By singling out abortion for exclusion, this bill attempts to impose the choices of politicians on poor pregnant people and their families.

Rest assured, this bill will not impact people with financial means but will instead disproportionately harm low-income individuals, singling them out by denying them medical care.

Public funding restrictions leave some people little choice but to use money they need for food, rent, clothing, or other necessities to pay for an abortion. Moreover, many Medicaid-eligible people are forced to delay their abortions in an effort to save up the money needed for the medical care, increasing their medical risks.

This bill is extreme. It includes a very narrow exception for the "physical" health of the pregnant person, excluding emotional and mental health, and includes no exception for people who become pregnant through rape or incest.

Moreover, this bill would impose a gag rule on universities by prohibiting them from using any tuition or fees to even make a referral for abortion or provide training on abortion care. I am writing to urge the NH Senate to vote *inexpedient to legislate* on all five of these bills.

A few notes about each bill follows.

HB625:

- Viability is not the same for every pregnancy. It is not defined by a rigid number. It varies pregnancy to pregnancy, and can even vary depending on the medical facility and what equipment it has. This bill would defy science and medicine by defining viability with an arbitrary number.

HB622

- No ban on abortion is reasonable for a patient who needs it.
- This bill would require invasive medical testing, not because it is medically necessary but because politicians want to dictate how doctors do their jobs.

HB596

- This bill is incomprehensible and completely unworkable. It garbles the law, including wrongly asserting that abortion violates the First Amendment.
- It perpetuates an abundance of false information, including the offensive misconception of “convenience abortions.”

HB434

- This legislation would permit public funding for only select reproductive health care. It would enable Medicaid to cover family planning, prenatal care, and the hefty expenses related to child birth, but would prohibit funding for abortion care. By singling out abortion for exclusion, this bill attempts to impose the choices of politicians on poor pregnant people and their families.
- This bill will not impact people with financial means. Instead, it disproportionately harms low-income individuals and singles them out by denying them medical care.
- Public funding restrictions leave some people little choice but to use money they need for food, rent, clothing, or other necessities to pay for an abortion. Moreover, many Medicaid-eligible people are forced to delay their abortions in an effort to save up the money needed for the medical care, increasing their medical risks.
- This bill is extreme. It includes a very narrow exception for the “physical” health of the pregnant person, excluding emotional and mental health, and includes no exception for people who become pregnant through rape or incest.

HB233

This bill perpetuates myths and misinformation about abortion.

- This bill isn't actually about abortion; it is about hospice care and whether parents should be able to decide how to care for their infant who may have hours or days to live. Here is a [great article](#) about the harm of bills just like this one. As the article notes, if this bill were to become law, doctors would be forced to take babies from their parents and compel them to make futile efforts to save a baby that they know they cannot save. This bill would deny families the ability to make compassionate decisions in these tragic situations.

I feel strongly oppose all of these bills.

I am writing to you today representing myself, to express my opposition to HB 596, HB 434, HB 233, HB 625, HB 622 and HB 430

Most people in New Hampshire support reproductive freedom. A survey taken by Suffolk University during the 2016 Republican Primaries found that 49% of New Hampshire Republicans identified as pro-choice, a higher percentage than those who did not identify as pro-choice. New Hampshire is the “Live Free or Die” state, as such, we should continue to respect the reproductive freedom of our citizens. Abortion is part of evidence based reproductive healthcare. It is safe and legal. It is a decision that should be made by the patient and their doctor. The decision should not be made by the government. Government interference in these decisions only serves to shame and harm pregnant patients. It makes them have to travel out of state, spend more money, and risk harm to themselves. Pregnant patient are autonomous humans who deserve the right to self-determine their healthcare decisions and when to have children. Medical problems that require abortions are many. Patients should not die or become permanently disabled from a pregnancy. ANALYSIS

This bill prohibits the use of public funds for the purpose of performing or assisting in an abortion which is not necessary to save the life of the mother. The bill also prohibits school-based health clinics from distributing drugs classified by the FDA as "emergency contraception".

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty One

AN ACT prohibiting the use of public funds for abortions.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 Title. This act shall be known as the No Public Funds for Abortion Act.

2 Legislative Findings and Purpose.

I. The general court finds that:

(a) When a state appropriates public funds to establish a program, it is entitled to define the limits of that program. *Rust v. Sullivan*, 500 U.S. 173, 194 (1991).

(b) The decision not to fund abortion places no governmental obstacle in the path of a woman who chooses to terminate her pregnancy. *Rust v. Sullivan*, 500 U.S. 173, 201 (1991).

(c) New Hampshire may rationally distinguish between abortion and other medical procedures because "no other procedure involves the purposeful termination of a potential life." *Harris v. McRae*, 448 U.S. 297, 325 (1980).

(d) It is permissible for New Hampshire to engage in unequal subsidization of abortion and other medical services to encourage alternative activity deemed in the public interest. *Rust v. Sullivan*, 500 U.S. 173, 201 (1991).

II. The purpose of this act is to ensure that public funds are not used to subsidize abortion.

3 New Subdivision; Public Funding of Abortion Prohibited. Amend RSA 132 by inserting after section 41 the following new subdivision:

Public Funding of Abortion Prohibited

132:42 Definitions. In this subdivision:

I. "Abortion" means the act of using or prescribing any instrument, medicine, drug, or any other substance, device, or means with the intent to terminate the clinically diagnosable pregnancy of a woman with knowledge that the termination by those means will with reasonable likelihood cause the death of the mother's embryo or fetus. Such use, prescription, or means is not an abortion if done with the intent to save the life or preserve the health of the embryo or fetus, remove a dead embryo or fetus caused by spontaneous abortion, or remove an ectopic pregnancy.

II. "Facility" or "health care facility" means any public or private hospital, clinic, center, medical school, medical training institution, health care facility, physician's office, infirmary, dispensary, ambulatory surgical treatment center, or other institution or location wherein medical care is provided to any person.

III. "Public funds" means funds of any kind or character belonging to or in the custody of any institution, board, commission, department, or any other public agency of the state, or belonging to or in the custody of any state official in his or her official capacity.

132:43 Use of Public Funds for Abortion Prohibited.

I. No public funds made available by the state, and distributed or appropriated by any institution, board, commission, department, agency, official, or employee of the state, shall be used in any way to provide, perform, or induce an abortion or assist in the provision or performance of an abortion.

II. No person, agency, organization, or any other party that receives funds authorized or appropriated by the state, may use those funds to perform or provide facilities for abortion or for training to provide or perform abortion.

III. No fund or committee authorized by this state for the special protection of women or children shall be authorized to use or distribute public funds for payment for abortion, abortion referrals, or abortion-related medical or social services.

IV. The limitations in paragraphs I, II, and III shall not apply to an abortion performed when the life of the mother is endangered by a physical disorder, physical illness, or physical injury including a life-endangering physical condition caused by or arising from the pregnancy itself.

132:44 Use of School Tuition and Fees for Abortion Prohibited. No part of any tuition or fees paid to a public institution of higher education shall be used in any way to pay for an abortion, provide or perform an abortion, make a referral for abortion, or provide facilities for an abortion or for training to provide or perform abortion.

132:45 Abortion-Related Activities Prohibited in School-Based Health Clinics. The department of education, school administrative units, and local school districts are prohibited from using state funds to provide or procure an abortion or distribute drugs classified as "emergency contraception" by the FDA.

132:46 State Employees Prohibited from Performing or Participating in Abortions.

I. No person employed by this state, within the scope of such person's employment, may provide, perform, or participate in an abortion.

II. The limitations in this section shall not apply to an abortion performed when the life of the mother is endangered by a physical disorder, physical illness, or physical injury including a life-endangering physical condition caused by or arising from the pregnancy itself.

132:47 Use of Public Facilities and Assets for Abortion Prohibited.

I. No public institution, public facility, public equipment, or other physical asset owned, leased, or controlled by this state shall be used for the purpose of providing, performing, or participating in an abortion.

II. No public institution or facility shall lease, sell, or permit the subleasing of its facilities or property to any physician or healthcare facility for use in the provision or performance of abortion.

III. The limitations in paragraphs I and II shall not apply to an abortion performed when the life of the mother is endangered by a physical disorder, physical illness, or physical injury including a life-endangering physical condition caused by or arising from the pregnancy itself.

132:48 Construction. Nothing in this subdivision shall be construed as creating or recognizing a right to abortion.

Nothing in this subdivision shall be construed as creating or recognizing a right to federal or state funds for abortion.

132:49 Right of Intervention. The general court by joint resolution, may appoint one or more of its members, who sponsored or cosponsored this act in his or her official capacity, to intervene as a matter of right in any case in which the constitutionality of this law is challenged.

132:50 Severability. Any provision of the subdivision held to be invalid or unenforceable by its terms, or as applied to any person or circumstance, shall be construed so as to give it the maximum effect permitted by law, unless such holding shall be one of utter invalidity or unenforceability in which event such provision shall be deemed severable herefrom and shall not affect the remainder hereof or the application of such provision to other persons not similarly situated or to other, dissimilar circumstances.

4 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
