**Analysis:** NHADA supports HB 461 for the following reasons:


- HB 461 will allow for greater rider visibility through additional auxiliary lamping

- Additional lamping allows for:
  - Rides to be better seen by other motorists
  - Allowing riders to better see the road
- The NH Motorcyclists Rights Organization represents a critical sector of road users, motorcycle riders, that are concerned with maintaining safe roads.
- As a current member of the Traffic Safety Commission (TSC) NHADA has been involved in many meetings and the topic of motorcycle safety as well as accidents and death are a topic of review. How to decrease those numbers is an important area of focus and we believe that NHMMRO's voice is a critical one.
- Both of these bills passed the House Transportation easily last session.

AN ACT relative to motorcycle auxiliary lamping, and adding the New Hampshire Motorcyclists' Rights Organization to the traffic safety commission.

SPONSORS: Rep. Packard, Rock. 5

**COMMITTEE:** Transportation

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### ANALYSIS

This bill permits motorcycles to have a maximum of 4 auxiliary driving lamps mounted to the front of the motorcycle. This bill also adds a representative of the New Hampshire Motorcyclists' Rights Organization to the traffic safety commission.

### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty One

AN ACT relative to motorcycle auxiliary lamping, and adding the New Hampshire Motorcyclists' Rights Organization to the traffic safety commission.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 Motor Vehicles; Spot Lamps and Auxiliary Lamps. Amend RSA 266:37, II to read as follows:
- II. Except as provided in paragraph II-a, any motor vehicle may be equipped with not to exceed 3 auxiliary driving lamps mounted on the front at a height not less than 12 inches nor more than 42 inches above the level surface upon which the vehicle stands, with such measurements to be made from the ground to the center of the lens, except that vehicles while used in the winter maintenance of ways may be driven with auxiliary head lamps higher than 42 inches above the surface upon which the vehicle stands provided such head lamps shall be aimed so that the top of the beam of light produced by these head lamps does not exceed the height of a horizontal line which is 42 inches high at a distance of 75 feet ahead of the head lamps of said vehicle.
- II-a. Motorcycles as defined in RSA 259:63 may be equipped with not to exceed 4 auxiliary driving lamps mounted on the front of the motorcycle at a height of not more than 42 inches above the level surface upon which the motorcycle stands, with such measurements to be made from the ground to the center of the lens.
- 3 New Subparagraph; Traffic Safety Commission. Amend RSA 21-P:64, I(a) by inserting after subparagraph (14) the following new subparagraph:
- (15) One representative of the New Hampshire Motorcyclists' Rights Organization.
- 4 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
