Speaking to several people, we could not come to a conclusion on what temporary means. We decided to go the Committee route to ascertain what temporary means in voting. During the 2020 elections, the AG made a statement that any college student that was not physically in the state, but attended NH college thru zoom could still do absentee voting in NH.

Question: I asked how could that be. Technically asked, did they have to be physically taking classes. So what term "time frame" for the word "temporary".

Answer, there really isn't one. For an example, you could claim that you own property in NH and a company assigns you to another state, you never return to NH. This study could come up with a time frame for a NH resident. Obviously, there is a carve out for military, but have the committee come up with a firm definition of "temporary".

Question: Rep Muirhead – I actually have two questions. Is this bill in regards to people who are temporarily out of the state or out of residency? Federal law regulates residency for Pres/VP. Is this study at defining only state-wide offices?

Answer: No. Statewide residents. Attempt to define. If your out of state for six months for whatever reason, you have the right to vote, certainly. If you're out of state for 10 YEARS, not putting foot back in state, they should not be able to vote. Need a reasonable time set.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 Committee Established. There is established a committee to study the definition of 2 "temporary" as it pertains to residence in the state for voting purposes.
 - 2 Membership and Compensation.
 - I. The members of the committee shall be as follows:
 - (a) Three members of the house of representatives, appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.
 - (b) Three members of the senate, appointed by the president of the senate.
- 8 II. Members of the committee shall receive mileage at the legislative rate when attending to 9 the duties of the committee.
 - 3 Duties. The committee shall study the definition of "temporary" as it pertains to residence in the state for voting purposes.
 - 4 Chairperson; Quorum. The members of the study committee shall elect a chairperson from among the members. The first meeting of the committee shall be called by the first-named house member. The first meeting of the committee shall be held within 45 days of the effective date of this section. Four members of the committee shall constitute a quorum.
 - 5 Report. The committee shall report its findings and any recommendations for proposed legislation to the speaker of the house of representatives, the president of the senate, the house clerk, the senate clerk, the governor, and the state library on or before November 1, 2021.
 - 6 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
