Rep. S. Pearson, sponsor, spoke. He said that the date had passed so the bill was "unnecessary." Rep. McGuire said that she was asked to see whether any areas of licensing, authorized under the Governor's emergency orders, should be placed in statute. She consulted with OPLC and this amendment was the result. The amendment would grant licensure to military personnel as Licensed Nursing Assistants, the lowest level of licensed health care worker. NH licensed EMTs are licensed to work only in organizations. The training of an EMT more than qualifies them to be an LNA. The amendment would permit such licensees to work in other settings. There were questions seeking clarification and ensuring that present EMTs would not be affected or limited by the amendment.

<u>Tom Broderick, legal counsel for the OPLC</u>, said that his office (as an agency; he was not speaking for the nursing board) was in favor of this bill and he noted the chronic shortage of LNAs. He said he has been in contact with Bureau of Fire Standards and Training and Emergency Services of the Dept. of Safety and it was in support of this bill. He answered some technical questions.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty One

AN ACT declaring February 5, 2021 as Apollo 14 Day.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 1 Apollo 14 Day. The governor shall issue a proclamation declaring February 5, 2021 as Apollo 2 14 Day in honor of the 50th anniversary of the Apollo 14 lunar landing which made Derry native 3 Alan B. Shepard, Jr. the 5th person to walk on the Moon. The proclamation shall urge citizens of the 4 state to commemorate the day with appropriate activities.
- 5 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
