ANALYSIS

This bill provides that if domestic violence is alleged in a parenting case, the case shall not be assigned to the complex case docket but shall be heard in district or superior court.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- IV. If domestic violence is identified as an issue in any proceeding under this chapter, either between the parties or between one or both parties and a child or children, the case shall not be assigned to the complex case docket or high conflict docket. The case is criminal and shall be
 - 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
