Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 New Paragraph; Use of Cannabis for Therapeutic Purposes; Alternative Treatment Centers; 2 Amend RSA 126-X:8 by inserting after paragraph XVIII the following new Requirements. 3 paragraph: 4 XIX. An alternative treatment center may acquire, and may use in the manufacture of cannabis concentrate and cannabis infused products, hemp-derived cannabidiol, or CBD, isolate that 5 6 is not produced by an alterative treatment center in New Hampshire. All such CBD isolate, and all 7 cannabis concentrate and cannabis infused products manufactured from such CBD isolate, shall be 8 tested for contaminants and cannabinoid profile in accordance with this chapter and department 9 rules.

2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
