1. Rep. McGuire, sponsor, introduced the bill and said it was a request of OPLC.

This bill would make license terms 2 years instead of one; would have licenses expire in the birth month; and give the Director the authority to set fees for the various boards. The boards would retain their authority in their technical areas. She said this was a matter of efficiency.

2. Tina Kelley, representing OPLC,

Ms. Kelley said that this bill would standardize renewal dates and she discussed some mechanical aspects of the bill such as the prorating of hours required for continuing professional development. **Question** - There was a question as to whether the boards agreed with the provisions of this bill. **Ms. Kelley answered,** Yes regarding the allied health professions. She did not know about the other boards, but said that no authority was being taken from any of them.

ANALYSIS

This bill revises the procedure and timeframe for license renewals of allied health professionals, body art practitioners, podiatrists, chiropractors, acupuncturists, and veterinarians.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 New Section; Office of Professional Licensure and Registration; Renewals. Amend RSA 310-A 2 by inserting after section 1-g the following new section: 3 310-A:1-h License Renewals; Lapse. 4 This section shall apply to the following professions administered by the office of 5 professional licensure and certification: 6 (a) Body art establishments and booths regulated under RSA 314-A. 7 (b) Podiatrists regulated under RSA 315. 8 (c) Chiropractors regulated under RSA 316-A. 9 (d) Occupational therapist and occupational therapy assistants regulated under RSA 10 326-C. (e) Respiratory care practitioners regulated under RSA 326-E. 11 12 (f) Speech-language pathologists and speech-language assistants regulated under RSA 13 326-F. 14 (g) Athletic trainers regulated under RSA 326-G. 15 (h) Recreational therapists regulated under RSA 326-J. 16 (i) Genetic counselors regulated under RSA 326-K. 17 (j) Physical therapists and physical therapist assistants regulated under RSA 328-A. 18 (k) Acupuncturists regulated under RSA 328-G. 19 (l) Veterinarians regulated under RSA 332-B. 20 II. The executive director of the office of professional licensure and certification shall issue 21initial licenses meeting the eligibility requirements as defined in statute and rules adopted by each 22 individual board to applicants who have completed the application procedure. 23 III. Initial licenses and renewals shall be valid for 2 years, except that timely and complete 24 application for license renewal by eligible applicants shall continue the validity of the licenses being 25 renewed until the board has acted on the renewal application. Licenses issued shall expire on the 26 last day of the month in the month the license was issued.

IV. Applicants shall submit completed applications for renewal, the renewal fee, and any

supporting documents required for that renewal on or before the last day in the month of renewal.

Licenses shall lapse when completed renewal applications, renewal fee, and supporting documents

have not been filed by the last day in the month of renewal, and the holders of a lapsed license are not authorized to practice until the licenses have been reinstated.

- V. The office of professional licensure and certification shall provide licensees, at least 2 months before the date of expiration of their license, with notice of the need to complete their renewal applications. Failure to receive notice shall not relieve any licensee of the obligation to renew their license, comply with the rules of the boards, or comply with this section. Timeliness of submission of renewal applications shall be evidenced by postmark, for applications delivered by hand the by date stamp or other record made at the time of delivery, or for applications submitted electronically the electronic time stamp of submission.
- VI. During the transition of renewing licenses from their original date of renewal to the date of the licensee's month of licensure pursuant to this section the board will prorate the fees. Prorated fees shall not exceed 11 months.
- VII. Upon the request of a licensee who is a member of any reserve component of the armed forces of the United States or the national guard and is called to active duty, the office of professional licensure and certification shall place the person's license on inactive status. The license may be reactivated within one year of the licensee's release from active status by payment of the renewal fee and with proof of completion of the most current continuing education requirement unless still within the renewal period.
- 2 Allied Health Professionals; License Renewals. RSA 328-F:19 is repealed and reenacted to read as follows:
 - 328-F:19 Renewal. The procedure and timeframe for license renewals for persons licensed by a governing board established in RSA 328-F:4 shall be as described in RSA 310-A:1-h.
 - 3 Chiropractic; Renewal Reference Removed. Amend RSA 316-A:14-a to read as follows:
 - 316-A:14-a Licenses and Certificates. Each applicant who qualifies under this chapter and who attains a minimum grade of 70 percent upon the examination given under RSA 316-A:13, I shall receive a license from the board as a chiropractor permitted to practice in New Hampshire. The fee for an initial license and for a license renewal shall be \$300. [The initial license and renewal licenses shall be valid for the terms established under RSA 316-A:19.]
 - 4 Chiropractic; License Renewals. RSA 316-A:20 is repealed and reenacted to read as follows: 316-A:20 Renewal.
 - I. The procedure and timeframe for license renewals shall be as described in RSA 310-A:1-h.
 - II. Each applicant for renewal shall submit satisfactory evidence that the applicant has completed at least 20 hours of continuing education approved by or conducted by the International Chiropractors Association, or the American Chiropractic Association, or the New Hampshire board of chiropractic examiners, or any state-chartered chiropractic school or college, within one year prior to the date of renewal.

METHODOLOGY:

This bill would change the license renewal cycle for certain professions regulated by the Office of Professional Licensure from an every other year (odd or even) basis to 2 years from date of license issuance. This change will not affect the total amount collected but will redistribute the funds throughout each year. Partial license periods under current law allow for between 5 and 20 months. The bill allows for proration of licenses issued for more than 2 years during the transition period, which will not affect revenue from these transitioned licenses. However, some individuals would be required to renew their license and pay the \$110 renewal fee even without having a full 2 years of licensure. Late fees would be eliminated but early reinstatement fee s would continue. The OPLC is unable to determine how licensing revenue and late fees would be impacted on an annual basis as licensing applications and late fees vary from year to year but total fees collected as a result of these proposed changes should not vary by any significant amount.

It is assumed this bill will not take effect until FY 2022.
