Re: Testimony on SB 45

Good morning Honorable Chairman Pearson and Members of the Committee:

For the record, I'm State Senator Bob Giuda, representing Senate District 2, and prime sponsor of Senate Bill 45, relative to the controlled drug prescription health and safety program.

SB 45 as amended by the Senate adds some key data sharing provisions to the Prescription Drug Monitoring Program, or PDMP. Specifically, in Section 1, Roman IV, we add "medical reconciliation" to the definition of services delivered by a dispenser. The CMS definition of the term "medical reconciliation" means "the process of identifying the most accurate list of all medications that the patient is taking, including name, dosage, frequency, and route, by comparing the medical record to an external list of medications obtained from a patient, hospital, or other provider."

Under Roman IV, the bill adds one additional category, "(f)" to those excluded from being considered as dispensers, specifically "a practitioner who neither prescribes nor dispenses and who is not actively working as a pharmacist within a NH licensed pharmacy licensed under RSA 318 or NH health care facility licensed under RSA 151." This excludes non-practicing professionals from gaining access to PDMP data.

In section 4, the bill adds under "(4)" the ability of pharmacy, nursing, physician licensing and other participating boards to use PDMP data in treating impaired members of their professions.

At this point, it's important to speak to why the original bill was amended by the Senate. It was amended to delete any references to PDMP data-sharing with DHHS given that the PDMP is being moved from OPLC to DHHS. Though this makes administrative sense, the Senate has several concerns with the move.

First, DHHS seeks to use PDMP data for Public Health programs and analyses. But the program was never intended to be used for Public Health purposes. It was intended to identify individuals, not to analyze populations. Any such potential expansion of the program's intent merits careful scrutiny by this legislature prior to implementation and will be the subject of future legislation.

Second, the legislature's privacy mandate regarding use of PDMP data was clear and unambiguous and was underscored by the public's overwhelming support for the 2018 CACR that added Article 2-b to our NH Constitution. Clearly, data privacy is of paramount importance to the people of NH. Unfortunately, a DHHS attempt to provide PDMP data to the federal government to garner grant funding was discovered, and prompted the Senate, mindful of the obvious data privacy concerns, to remove DHHS data sharing provisions from this bill and to address it in separate legislation.

This concludes my testimony on SB 45. I ask for the committee's support for this legislation to improve the utility of the PDMP while scrupulously maintaining the privacy of its data. I'm happy to answer any questions.

#### SB 45 – Relative to the Controlled Drug Prescription Health and Safety Program

#### Testimony

Good morning, Chairman, and members of the committee. My name is Paula Minnehan, Senior VP, State Government Relations with the New Hampshire Hospital Association (NHHA), representing all 26 of the state's community hospitals as well as all specialty hospitals.

The NHHA supports SB 45. Specifically, I am testifying on paragraph 2, which amends RSA 318-B:32. This language was included in a bill that Senator Giuda sponsored in 2020 (SB 676) but did not ultimately pass due to the timing of the pandemic impacting the legislative process. We appreciate this legislation being reintroduced this year. The Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP) is an essential tool for practitioners, defined as both prescribers and dispensers, to understand a patient's medication history which can assist them with proper treatments and prescriptions. We believe that the changes put forward in SB 45 will only enhance a practitioner's ability to utilize this crucial information for patient care and safety.

SB 45 is enabling legislation that will allow the Office of Professional Licensure and Certification to enter into agreements or contracts with health care entities to allow practitioners to query and retrieve PDMP information and to save it as part of a patient's electronic medical record. It will be up to the health care entity to ensure that only authorized users have access to PDMP information.

The last section of the bill was included to ensure that there is an opportunity for the patient to know that the PDMP could be utilized as part of the practitioner's process to review a patient's medication history. We believe that this language, consistent with other states' that we reviewed, would provide proper notice to the patient.

NHHA is in support of SB 45 and we ask for your support as well. Thank you for the opportunity to provide our comments.

Good morning, Mr. Chairman, members of the committee:

My name is Lindsey Courtney, Executive Director of the New Hampshire Office of Professional Licensure and Certification, the agency that administers the controlled drug prescription health and safety program, known colloquially as the prescription drug monitoring program, or PDMP.

OPLC is supportive of SB 45. Among other things, section 2 would permit the Office to integrate the PDMP with electronic health systems across the state. One of the most cited barriers to use of the PDMP by practitioners and dispensers is that it interrupts workflow— practitioners and dispensers must, at present, leave the electronic health record to query a separate portal, which takes additional time. By integrating the NH PDMP with EHR systems as other states have done, New Hampshire would promote the use of the PDMP by practitioners and dispensers by eliminating this barrier and providing ease of access within an established workflow. Given the public health crisis currently impacting our state, OPLC supports this legislation as it would encourage and promote use of the PDMP.
