Summary of Testimony Presented:

Representative Steven Smith, Sullivan 11

- Rep. Smith said, this bill passed in a 19-0 vote in the House committee vote and passed the House on the consent calendar.
- Rep. Smith said, this bill was created go along with the Move Over Law for when motor vehicles must go around stopped maintenance or emergency vehicles on the road. We forgot to update the statute when this was done. So, with the way the law is now, if you go over the center line, you can get a ticket. There are currently two conflicting statutes. This bill will add the exemption to RSA 265(37) motorist duties.
- Rep. Smith said, most police officers have said if they see a driver cross the center line for the purpose of passing a stopped vehicle, they won't write the ticket, but this bill ensures that the ticket will not be written. The only exception being if all four wheels of a vehicle cross over the line for no good reason, or the driver does not reduce their speed, then you will still get a ticket.
- Sen. Watters said, why is it called the Chapman Act?
 - Rep. Smith said he did not know the answer. Rep. Smith said, I refiled the version of the bill that Rep. Flanagan had last time. We didn't get to it last year.

- Sen. Watters said, we generally don't name acts in NH. Looking at the underlying statute, where it lists pedestrians and vehicles you're supposed to pull over for, should we consider adding language for a motorized wheelchair?
 - Rep. Smith said, that seems okay to me. I can't speak for the Chair of (House) Transportation. I can imagine stripping the name out of the bill. I'm not a fan of names in bills. Including wheelchairs seems like a good idea.

Bill Lambert, State Traffic Engineer, NHDOT

- Mr. Lambert testified in support of the bill and said that he was at the hearing to any answer questions.
- Sen. Watters asked, what is the appropriate term of art for including motorized wheelchairs in 265(37)(a)(1)?
 - Mr. Lambert said he did not have an answer at this time. Mr. Lambert said, Nashua is interested in having powered scooters that are not man-powered included in this bill. Maybe a more inclusive term would be better.

Representative Tom Walsh, Merrimack 24

- Rep. Walsh testified in support of this bill.
- Rep. Walsh said he is the Chair of House Transportation Committee.
- Rep. Walsh said he supports the wheelchair amendment and supports an amendment to remove the constituent's name as the act name.

19 structure of charitable gaming in New Hampshire and determine to what degree those
20 recommendations have been addressed, including but not limited to recommendations relating to
21 oversight, enforcement, control measures, technology and staffing.

22 III. Study the amounts and distribution of revenues generated by each charitable gaming
23 operator to the state and to the charities served by that operator, including all costs borne by the
24 operator and charities.

25 IV. Study the methods used by charitable gaming operators to select the charities that will
26 be given dates at the operators' facilities, including the methods used when there is a "wait list" at
27 the facilities.

28 4 Chairperson; Quorum. The members of the study committee shall elect a chairperson from
29 among the members. The first meeting of the committee shall be called by the first-named senate

16 2 Legislation. The general court hereby enacts the following legislation:

19 1 New Subdivision; Commission to Study Workplace Safety in Health Care Settings. Amend
20 RSA 126-A by inserting after section 88 the following new subdivision:

23 I. There is established a commission to study workplace safety in health care settings.

24 (a) The members of the commission shall be as follows:

25 (1) One member of the senate, appointed by the president of the senate.

26 (2) Two members of the house of representatives, appointed by the speaker of the
27 house of representatives.

28 (3) One member appointed by the chief justice of the New Hampshire supreme court.

29 (4) The commissioner of the department of health and human services, or designee.

30 (5) The commissioner of the department of safety, or designee.

31 (6) The commissioner of the department of labor, or designee.

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- 1 (7) The attorney general, or designee.
- 2 (8) The president of the State Employees Association, SEIU Local 1984, or designee.
- 3 (9) A member of the New Hampshire Hospital Association, appointed by the
- 4 association.
- 5 (10) A member of the New Hampshire Nurses Association, appointed by the
- 6 association.
- 7 (11) A member of Granite State Home Health and Hospice Association, appointed by
- 8 the association.
- 9 (12) A member of the New Hampshire Health Care Association, appointed by the
- 10 association.
- 11 (13) A member of the New Hampshire Medical Society, appointed by the society.
- 12 (14) The director of the American Civil Liberties Union of New Hampshire, or
- 13 designee.
- 14 (15) A member of NAMI-New Hampshire, appointed by that organization.
- 15 (16) A member of the New Hampshire Association of Residential Care Homes
- 16 (NHARCH), appointed by the association.
- 17 (17) A member of the American College of Emergency Physicians, appointed by that
- 18 organization.
- 19 (18) The long-term care ombudsman, or designee.
- 20 (19) A member from a nonprofit social services organization representing the patient
- 21 perspective, appointed by the president of the senate.
- 22 (b) Legislative members of the commission shall receive mileage at the legislative rate
- 23 when attending to the duties of the commission.
- 24 II.(a) The commission shall:
- 25 (1) Review past history of incidents of violence in the health care workplace that
- 26 have been instigated by the public, including patients, against health care workers.
- 27 (2) Explore barriers to reporting incidences.
- 28 (3) Explore creating a culture that supports reporting by reviewing of best practices.
- 29 (4) Determine a structure for reporting incidences and effective mechanisms for
- 30 responding to incidences.
- 31 (5) Identify education and other strategies to identify risks, increase and reduce
- 32 vulnerabilities in order to prevent workplace violence.
- 33 (6) Review other states' workplace safety policies.
- 34 (7) Review current statutes regarding penalties for assaulting a health care worker
- 35 and consider changes to the statutes.
- 36 (8) Consider other matters the commission deems relevant to its study.
- 37 (b) The commission may solicit input from any person or entity the commission deems

2 III. The members of the commission shall elect a chairperson from among the members.
3 The first meeting of the commission shall be called by the senate member. The first meeting of the

5 commission shall constitute a quorum.

6 IV. The commission shall make a report with its findings and any recommendations for
7 proposed legislation on or before November 1, 2022 to the president of the senate, the speaker of the
8 house of representatives, the senate clerk, the house clerk, the governor, and the state library.

9 2 Repeal. RSA 126-A:89, relative to commission to study workplace safety in health care
10 settings, is repealed.

11 3 Effective Date.

12 I. Section 2 of part I of this act shall take effect November 1, 2022.

13 II. The remainder of part I of this act shall take effect upon its passage.

15 Establishing a commission to study payments in lieu of taxes.

16 1 New Section; Persons and Property Taxable; Commission to Study Payments in Lieu of Taxes.
