This bill increases the criminal penalty for certain violations of privacy and nonconsensual dissemination of private sexual images.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty One

AN ACT increasing the penalty for certain invasions of privacy.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 Breaches of the Peace; Violation of Privacy. Amend RSA 644:9, I-IV to read as follows:

2 I. A person is guilty of a class A misdemeanor **for a first offense, and a class B felony for**
3 **a second or subsequent offense**, if such person unlawfully and without the consent of the persons
4 entitled to privacy therein, installs or uses:

5 (a) Any device for the purpose of observing, photographing, recording, amplifying,
6 broadcasting, or in any way transmitting images or sounds of the private body parts of a person
7 including the genitalia, buttocks, or female breasts, or a person's body underneath that person's
8 clothing; or

9 (b) In any private place, any device for the purpose of observing, photographing,
10 recording, amplifying or broadcasting, or in any way transmitting images or sounds in such place; or

11 (c) Outside a private place, any device for the purpose of hearing, recording, amplifying,
12 broadcasting, observing, or in any way transmitting images, location, movement, or sounds
13 originating in such place which would not ordinarily be audible, visible, or comprehensible outside
14 such place. ***This subparagraph shall not include a device placed in a non-populated area***
15 ***for the purpose of capturing video or images of wildlife.***

16 II. As used in this section, "private place" means a place where one may reasonably expect to
17 be safe from surveillance including public restrooms, locker rooms, the interior of one's dwelling
18 place, or any place where a person's private body parts including genitalia, buttocks, or female
19 breasts may be exposed.

20 III. A person is guilty of a class [~~A misdemeanor~~] ***B felony*** if that person knowingly
21 disseminates or causes the dissemination of any photograph or video recording of himself or herself
22 engaging in sexual activity with another person without the express consent of the other person or
23 persons who appear in the photograph or videotape. In this paragraph, "disseminate" and "sexual
24 activity" shall have the same meaning as in RSA 649-A:2.

25 III-a. A person is guilty of a ***class A misdemeanor for a first offense, and a class B***
26 ***felony for a second or subsequent offense*** if, for the purpose of arousing or gratifying the person's
27 sexual desire, he or she knowingly views another person, without that person's knowledge or
28 consent, in a place where one would have a reasonable expectation of privacy. For purposes of this
29 paragraph, "views" means looking at another person with the unaided eye or any device intended to
30 improve visual acuity.

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1 IV. A person is guilty of a [~~misdemeanor~~] *class B felony* if such person knowingly enters
2 any residential curtilage, as defined in RSA 627:9, I, or any other private place as defined in
3 paragraph II of this section, without lawful authority and looks into the residential structure
4 thereon or other private place with no legitimate purpose.

5 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect January 1, 2022.

METHODOLOGY:

This bill increases the criminal penalty for certain violations of privacy and nonconsensual dissemination of private sexual images. This bill contains penalties that may have an impact on the New Hampshire judicial and correctional systems. There is no method to determine how many charges would be brought as a result of the changes contained in this bill to determine the fiscal impact on expenditures. However, the entities impacted have provided the potential costs associated with these penalties below.

It should be noted that average case cost estimates for FY 2021 and FY 2022 are based on data that is more than ten years old and does not reflect changes to the courts over that same period of time or the impact these changes may have on processing the various case types. An unspecified misdemeanor can be either class A or class B, with the presumption being a class B misdemeanor.

New Hampshire Fish and Game Department Testimony on HB 200, As Introduced Senate Judiciary Committee April 20, 2021

We write on behalf of the NH Fish and Game Department to express our concern with the language of HB 200 as introduced.

We offer no comment as to the penalty provisions in the bill. We speak only to the language in section I (c) that offers a blanket exemption to "...a device placed in a non-populated area for the purpose of capturing video or images of wildlife." Our concerns are:

a. The devices covered by the exemption are not specified.

The exemption appears to be directed at the traditional "game camera" which is a digital camera, contained in a camouflaged container, which takes motion activated pictures of wildlife, stores them on a digital card, which is retrieved by the camera owner and read on a computer. However, there are more advanced products known as "live action game cameras" which are wireless, or communicate on a cellular network, and which may be networked together with up to 400 additional devices, and which may be operated continuously using solar panels for power. The potential for such devices to capture images of people is therefore much higher, and if the images are communicated over a network, other criminal and privacy laws may apply to that action.

b. The concept of a "non-populated area" is not defined.

It is unclear what lands might fall within this definition. It might be as expansive as any area that is not within the curtilage of a residence (see RSA 627:9, I), or it might be more limited. However, what is the status of a farmer's fields or orchards? What is the status of managed timberland? What is the status of a hiking trail, snowmobile trail, or OHRV trail? All of these are areas where human activity occurs, and where images of people may be obtained, some of which might implicate the remaining language of RSA 644:9.

c. For the purpose of capturing video or images of wildlife.

Is this language in the nature of an affirmative defense to the remaining language of RSA 644:9? That is, if the person placing the device has a purpose to capture images of wildlife, but in fact actually records images of people, does the device owner now have a defense to prosecution under the statute, and does the state now have the burden to show the purpose for the placement of the camera as an element of the underlying offense? What if the person does desire to capture images of wildlife, but knows at the time that images of people are also likely to be captured?

d. Other bills are under consideration on this policy issue.

Please note that HB 474, HB 129, and HB 384, which are pending in this committee also raise issues that may be relevant to this matter because they all relate to personal privacy, and all relate to what data and images may be shared without violating a criminal statute. We also note that the House Fish and Game and Marine Resources Committee has retained HB 490 to work on the use of "Live Action Game Cameras", which are the devices I noted above that have cellular, wireless and networking capabilities. These raise significant concerns with privacy and the use of data and images of people in areas and in places where people may not live, but certainly work and recreate.

I also note that the Farm Bureau has petitioned the Fish and Game Department to adopt rules to prohibit the installation of these types of devices on private property in the absence of notice to landowners and permission from the landowners. Our efforts to resolve the petition have shown that there is a real question regarding the authority of our agency to adopt such rules that affect private property in this way, and that the legislature should consider action to clarify these questions.

For all of these reasons, the department respectfully asks the committee not to report this bill as "Ought to Pass" until this language has been considered carefully. The Department is willing to work with the sponsor and others on this issue in an effort to improve the bill.
