1 1 Repeal Date Changed. Amend 2018, 323:28-29 to read as follows:

2 323:28 Repeal; Effective [2021] 2026. RSA 426-A, relative to produce safety, is repealed.

I. Section 28 of this act shall take effect June 30, [2021] 2026.

II. The remainder of this act shall take effect upon its passage.

6 2 New Section; Produce; Stop Sale. Amend RSA 426-A by inserting after section 6 the following 7 new section:

8 426-A:7 Produce; Stop Sale. When the commissioner or the commissioner's authorized agent 9 has reasonable cause to believe produce is being distributed in violation of any of the provisions of 10 this chapter, or of any of the rules adopted under this chapter, the commissioner or agent may issue 11 and serve a written "stop sale, use or removal" order upon the owner or custodian of any such 12 produce. The produce shall not be sold, used or removed until the provisions of this chapter have 13 been complied with and the produce has been released by the commissioner or the violation has been 14 otherwise disposed of as provided in this chapter by a court of competent jurisdiction.

- HB 226's Section 1 adds a five-year extension to the repeal date of the produce inspection program under RSA 426-A from June 30, 2021 to June 30, 2026. This change was requested by the NH Department of Agriculture, Markets, and Food (DAMF). The produce inspection program is required under the federal Food Safety Modernization Act enacted by the US Department of Agriculture (USDA).
- HB 226's Section 2 creates a new section in RSA 426-A to give the DAMF Commissioner or his agent the ability to issue a "stop sale order" if produce is being sold in violation of produce safety rules under RSA 426-A. Section 2's language closely mirrors DAMF's current statutory authority under RSA 426:7-a on standards for farm products.
