2 II(a). The appropriations made for the community college system in paragraph XV of section 3 1 and the sums available for these projects shall be expended by the trustees of the community 4 college system of New Hampshire.

5 (b) The appropriations made to the community college system in paragraph XV of 6 section 1 are available for all costs incidental to the completion of the projects enumerated including 7 but not limited to the costs of the services for architects, engineers, and other consultants of such 8 kind and capacity as the community college system board of trustees may, in its discretion, wish to 9 employ on such terms and conditions as the board determines. These moneys shall be spent under 10 the direction of the community college system board of trustees and pursuant to policies adopted by 11 the board of trustees.

12 (c) Any authorization contained in this act which is at variance with the requirements of 13 applicable federal law and regulations shall be controlled by the terms of federal law and 14 regulations.

154 Land Acquisition. Any land acquired under the appropriations made in sections 1 and 2 of 16 this act, if any, as may be acquired under the appropriation shall be purchased by the commissioner 17of the department of administrative services or the commissioner of the department of 18 transportation with the approval of governor and council.

19 5 Bond Authorized. To provide funds for the total of the appropriations of state funds made in 20 sections 1 and 2 of this act, the state treasurer is hereby authorized to borrow upon the credit of the 21 state not exceeding the sum of \$327,900,862 and for said purposes may issue bonds and notes in the  $\mathbf{22}$ names and on behalf of the state of New Hampshire in accordance with the provisions of RSA 6-A.  $\mathbf{23}$ The source of funds are as follows: general fund \$112,552,491, highway fund \$15,995,000, and other 24 funds \$16,288,000.

6 Payments.

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26 I. The payment of principal and interest on bonds and notes issued for the projects in section 27 1 of this act shall be made when due from the general fund of the state.

28 II. The payment of principal and interest on bonds issued for the projects in section 2 of this 29 act shall be made from the highway fund.

30 7 Powers of Governor and Council. The governor and council are hereby authorized and 31 empowered:

32 I. To cooperate with and enter into such agreements with the federal government, or any 33 agency thereof, as they may deem advisable, to secure federal funds for the purposes hereof.

34 II. To accept any federal funds which are, or become available for any project under sections 35 1 and 2 beyond the estimated amounts. The net appropriation of state funds for any project for 36 which such additional federal funds are accepted shall be reduced by the amount of such additional 37 funds, and the amount of bonding authorized by section 5 shall be reduced by the same amount.

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8 Transfers. The individual project appropriations provided in sections 1 and 2 of this act, 1 2 except as provided in section 3 of this act, shall not be transferred or expended for any other purposes; provided that if there is a balance remaining after an individual project, which is fully 3 funded by state funds, is completed, accepted, and final payment made, said balance or any part 4 thereof may be transferred by governor and council, to any other individual project or projects, which 5 are also fully funded by state funds, within the same section and from the same funding source, 6 provided that prior approval of the capital budget overview committee is obtained. 7

8 9 Reduction of Appropriation and Bonding Authority. If the net appropriation of state funds for any project provided for by sections 1 and 2 is determined on the basis of an estimate of anticipated 9 federal, local, or other funds, and if the amount of such funds actually received or available is less 10 than said estimate, then the total authorized cost for such projects and the net appropriation of state 11 funds thereof shall be reduced by the same proportion as the proportion by which federal, local, or 12 13 other funds are reduced. The amount of bonding authorized by section 5 shall be reduced by the amount that the appropriation of state funds is reduced pursuant to this section.  $\mathbf{14}$ 

10 Bureau of Public Works Design and Construction Inspection Services; Davis-Bacon Act 15 Compliance. The appropriations for those projects which are managed by the bureau of public works 16 design and construction, department of administrative services, may be expended to fund temporary 17personnel for the purpose of providing construction inspection services and Davis-Bacon Act 18 19 Compliance services for projects utilizing federal funds, for those projects included in this act.

 $\mathbf{20}$ 11 Capital Projects; University of New Hampshire. Pursuant to 2019, 146:3, 146:6, and 146:8, II 21 the university system board of trustees are authorized to drawdown funds for the capital projects 22 authorized in 2019, 146:3 and expend sums not to exceed \$15,000,000 for the biennium ending June 2330. 2023.

26 I. The amount of \$369,417 is hereby lapsed from the unencumbered balances from the 27 following state capital projects:

# Summary of testimony presented:

# Rep. Graham

- Rep. Graham introduced the bill and stated that he did not have much to add since the committee had already heard from all of the agencies and Chris Shea went over the House passed capital budget in detail.
- He did want to note that the House committee is concerned about the amount of money we are spending on IT through bonding. It currently makes up 28% of this capital budget. He said the legislature is bonding software that may not last 20 years.
- He also noted there is the section about projects that should be funded, if possible, if additional federal funds become available. The top three House priorities for those items are the forensic psychiatric hospital, the Littleton campus for the community college and the tramway replacement. He said any other projects that we can bring forward would also be appreciated. Commissioner Goulet mentioned that any multiyear projects we can fund with federal dollars would enable us to do more in future biennia.

Senator Reagan said he shared Rep. Graham's concern about the tremendous cost of what might be temporary software.

Dear Chairman Reagan and Honorable members of the committee

As you begin work this week on the Capital Budget (HB25) I thought I would give you some insight into what the House passed and its differences from the governor's original proposal.


- 1. Before the budget was even printed we deleted \$2.5 million that had been allocated to the Hudson CTE. This money had been provided to Hudson in 2020
- 2. I appointed a sub-committee to scrub the completed projects from prior biennium. By doing this we were able to repurpose approximately \$2.2 million
- 3. We allocated in the footnotes \$1.5 million of this repurposed money for the dredging/expansion of the Turning Basin at Portsmouth Harbor
- 4. At the request of the Adjutant General we added additional monies for the renovation of Readiness Centers statewide
- 5. We added a Coastal Flooding Model project to DES
- 6. We added \$350,000 for roofing and repair projects at our state parks
- 7. Finally, the governor had provided no new capital money to the Community College System. We allocated \$1 million to them for required critical maintenance.
- 8. We reduced a couple of allocations to help fund these additions, most notably Emergency Funding under DAS. We reduced this by \$500,000 since there is a lapse extension for this item of over \$600,000.

The attached annotated Compare Report highlights the majority of these changes, as well as others I have not mentioned. Having talked with Mr. Shea of the LBA, I know he intends to cover this material in his presentation. I will be "in the audience" virtually on Friday if you have any questions about what the House position on HB25.






# New Hampshire Northcoast Corporation (NHN) Who We Are and What We Do

- 42 mile short line railroad (Rollinsford, Somersworth, Rochester, Lebanon, ME (1/2 mile), Milton, Wakefield and Ossipee). Part of old "Conway Branch" of former B&M.
- Connects with Pan-Am (formerly B & M) main line in the south and the rail corridor owned by State of NH to the north.
- Hauling freight for more than 150 years
- Passenger service and Ski Train discontinued in the early1960's.
- 1985 the line was purchased from the B & M by Boston Sand & Gravel Co. and became the NHN (New Hampshire Northcoast Corp.) short line railroad.



# New Hampshire Northcoast Corp. (NHN) Freight Facts

- Biggest freight commodities are concrete sand Ossipee Aggregates Corp., Ossipee and propane - Eastern Propane Co., Rochester; also haul steel, telephone poles and waste oil
- Annual total (100-ton) freight cars: approx. 5,700 cars / 570,000 tons
  - Concrete Sand: approx. 4,800 cars / 480,000 tons
    - 20% tons/yr. to trans-loading facility in North Rochester, NH
    - 80% tons/yr. to concrete plants in Boston, MA
  - Propane: import avg. 800 tanker cars / 80,000 tons/yr.



# NHN Track Maintenance A Public-Private Partnership



• Since the 1980's, NHN has partnered with private businesses, municipalities, the state and the federal governments in the funding of the maintenance and rehabilitation of the NHN track structure.

• NHN spends \$350,000 - \$1,000,000 per year on track repairs.

- 95% of the rails and ties have been replaced since 1985. Rails and ties have a 25 50 year life-span which means a constant replacement cycle.
- NHN has 49 grade crossings (intersecting with 41 public and 8 private roads)
  35 (71%) are signalized.

• Since 1990, NHN has continuously upgraded all signalized crossings using federal programs administered by NHDOT and funding assistance from businesses and municipalities







- Repair of 20-year-old major washout north of the Ossipee sand pit
- This washout repair opened up hundreds of acres of private land for potential rail customers and economic development in Ossipee

# Washout Repair 2015 TIGER Grant








# **NHN Track Maintenance & Costs**

• NHN maintains: 247,000 ties, 84 linear miles of rail, 49 crossings, over 100 culverts, several bridges and retaining walls, and 42 miles of rail bed and ballast

- The 13,500 replacement ties installed in the prior 2018 and 2020 State/NHN funded projects represented only 5.5% of NHN's total ties.
- Tie and steel costs fluctuate; quality goes down life expectancy is less.
- Unexpected major repairs are borne entirely by the railroad:
- 2014 sinkhole in the retaining wall along Salmon Falls in Somersworth shut down that section of the line for 5 weeks (freight had to be unloaded onto trucks in Rochester, and then transferred back to rail cars in south Somersworth)
   Cost: Emergency repair - \$260,000 in direct repair costs to NHN






# 2021 NHN Capital Request Bridge and Culvert Repairs Only


- In September 2020, NHN was awarded a \$4.5 million federal CRISI grant through the USDOT and the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) for critical infrastructure, including rail, tie and ballast replacement, crossing upgrades, increasing off-track propane car storage capacity and addressing the single most dangerous of NHN's 33 bridges -- the underpass on Haven Hill Road in Rochester with a height of only 11 feet. This bridge has been struck dozens of times through the years, most recently on November 20, 2020 (see photos).
- NHN's share of the 4-year CRISI grant project is \$2,000,000 with \$100,000 contribution from its largest customer, Eastern Propane. This project will constrain both NHN's maintenance budget and schedule over the next four years.
- However, the deterioration of NHN's 32 other bridges requires urgent attention in the immediate and short-term time-frame (see photos), according to the USDOT required annual bridge inspections. This money would also address the worst of the ninety-two 160-year old granite box culverts, which are also inspected regularly (see photos).
- Similar to the 2019 Capital Budget appropriation to NHDOT for bridge repairs on the State-owned rail lines, NHN is respectfully requesting matching state funding to exclusively address bridge and culvert repairs beginning with the 2021 capital appropriations cycle.

# History of the State public-private partnership funding of the Coos County Rail Project rail replacement (31.2 miles beginning in 2009)

- The Senate Capital Budget Committee and the House Public Works Committee started funding the rail rehabilitation in 2010 with an appropriation of \$850,000 that required a public-private partnership 20% match from the railroad as required by NH statute.
- Beginning with FY2016-2017, the Senate Capital Budget Committee agreed with the House Public Works Committee to increase the rail rehabilitation public-private match policy to 50%, an increase from the original 20%. The Senate Capital Budget and the House Public Works Committee provided in FY2016-2017: \$1,500,00, in FY2018-2019: \$1,000,000 and in FY2020-2021: \$900,000. Each of the last three Capital appropriations required a dollar a dollar-for-dollar match leveraging \$3,400,000 in private contribution. In 2010, the private sector contribution was \$170,000 for a total of \$3,570,000 by the St. Lawrence Atlantic Railroad.
- Finish line is 7.6 miles in Northumberland & Stratford. The current appropriation in HB 25 will move the project to the finish line by 1.6 +/-.

## Conditions placed on funding

- The railroad operator shall make commitments to continue service and maintenance on the lines appropriate at the classification level to which the lines had been rehabilitated.
- A lien on the improved property shall be created in favor of the State in an amount which equals all, or the pro rata share, of the improvements made. The lien shall expire 10 years from the date the improvements are completed; provided that the lien shall be recorded in the Registry of Deeds of the county or counties in which the improved property is situated and shall not supersede any lien created by a mortgage affecting such property. The lien shall only expire if the line upon which the improvements have been made is operated and maintained for normal use for a period of 10 years subsequent to the completion of the improvements.
- Railroads in the private sector contributed to the General Fund in FY2020. \$306,293 was collected by DRA in 2020 (unaudited), with \$91,689 distributed to municipalities (source: DRA presentation to House Ways and Means Committee 1-26-21). A similar amount +/- is contributed to fund rail rehabilitation of state-owned rail lines.
