# Summary of testimony presented in support: Representative Klein Knight

- A couple months ago there was a homeless encampment surrounding some state grounds for several days in Manchester.
- Covid has exacerbated the homelessness problem in the state.
- A decision was made to remove these displaced individuals from the grounds. but there was no plan in place to house them.
- Law enforcement arrived and had a plan to protect the property, but no plan for the people.
- Witnessed State Police come to facilitate the building of a fence around the property.
- People were told 'if the fence reaches your belongings, we are throwing them awav.'

- There was no clear plan for reuniting these people with any of their belongings including things like medications, social security cards, and all their worldly possessions.
- Shared her experience of trying to help these individuals move things, while State Police stood around and laughed.
- We need a system to reunite people with things like their medication or their social security cards.
- This will facilitate a discussion about developing state protocols for when we need to protect state property, but also need to respect the dignity and humanity of those who have fallen on hard circumstances.
- NH is wasting taxpayer money housing homeless people via the incarceration process.
- Senator Carson asked if advanced warning was given to the individuals staying on the property.
  - o The individuals were told they were going to have to leave. It seemed that times kept changing and that they were looking for a way to clear it out when the least amount of people were there, so they wouldn't have witnesses. How people were treated by police was very distributing.
