AN ACT

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 Committee Established. There is established a committee to study and make recommendations relative to tuition and transportation funding of career technical education.
 - 2 Membership and Compensation.
 - I. The members of the committee shall be as follows:
 - (a) Seven members of the house of representatives, appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives, 2 of whom shall be members of the standing committee having jurisdiction over education, and 2 of whom shall be members of the standing committee with jurisdiction over finance.
 - (b) Two members of the senate, appointed by the president of the senate.
- II. Members of the committee shall receive mileage at the legislative rate when attending to the duties of the committee.
- 3 Duties. The committee shall:
- I. Evaluate and make recommendations regarding the successes and shortcomings of the tuition and transportation funding formula relative to career and technical education;
- II. Assess and make recommendation for providing funding reimbursement for students who attend CTE within their own school district;
- III. Identify policy and funding strategies to increase student access to career technical education; and
 - IV. Consider other policy and funding issues, as the committee may deem necessary.
 - 4 Chairperson; Quorum. The members of the study committee shall elect a chairperson from among the members. The first meeting of the committee shall be called by the first-named house member. The first meeting of the committee shall be held within 45 days of the effective date of this section. Five members of the committee shall constitute a quorum.
 - 5 Report. The committee shall report its findings and any recommendations for proposed legislation to the speaker of the house of representatives, the president of the senate, the house clerk, the senate clerk, the governor, and the state library on or before November 1, 2022.
 - 6 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

 - II. Assess and make recommendation for providing funding reimbursement for students who attend CTE within their own school district;
 - III. Identify policy and funding strategies to increase student access to career technical education; and
 - IV. Consider other policy and funding issues, as the committee may deem necessary.
 - 11:4 Chairperson; Quorum. The members of the study committee shall elect a chairperson from among the members. The first meeting of the committee shall be called by the first-named house member. The first meeting of the committee shall be held within 45 days of the effective date of this section. Five members of the committee shall constitute a quorum.
 - 11:5 Report. The committee shall report its findings and any recommendations for proposed legislation to the speaker of the house of representatives, the president of the senate, the house clerk, the senate clerk, the governor, and the state library on or before November 1, 2022.
 - 11:6 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Summary of testimony presented:

Representative Rick Ladd - Grafton, District 4

- Representative Ladd introduced HB 304.
- This bill's intent has been an item of discussion for years.
- When looking at the delivery of an adequate education, you are looking at approximately 14 indicators identified in statute.
- Three of those indicators deal directly with CTE.
- The inspiration for this legislation is due to the fact that we know communities throughout our state receive absolutely no tuition money, by way of this funding pool, for CTE.

- School districts with CTE centers in their districts are of focus seeing that they receive no funding all while CTE centers are within their districts, Manchester is a good example.
- There is roughly \$9 million dollars allocated for transportation and tuition reimbursement.
- The transportation costs are always the first to be taken care of, which are based upon ten cents, per mile, per student. This adds up to roughly \$680,000.
- The remaining monies is split up for tuition purposes. This is based on the 25% paid by local community and 75% of what is remaining of the \$9 million. These numbers are often prorated.
- Tuition costs vary greatly throughout the state, they are based more on operational costs of CTE centers.
- There are even CTE centers in bordering places in VT that serve NH students.
- Over the last year, there has been great discussion as to whether CTE centers should be referenced as categorical revenue and become a part of the adequacy formula.
- We need to start addressing how we will serve these districts who receive no funding.
- For instance, Manchester must absorb those costs. Huge problem in how we fund.
- Only 14% of our high school population participates in CTE programs. That is low.
- Comparatively based on population, 59% of Delaware high school students participate in CTE programs.
- CTE centers should not be compared to vocational programs of the past, i.e. birdhouse making.
- CTE centers are highly skilled and technically driven.
- The House's recommendation on this bill was unanimous.
- Senator Kahn asked Representative Ladd about committee membership.
 Representative Ladd said he hopes to see folks with expertise and know-how on the committee.
