- V. Any vacancy which occurs between the beginning of the filing period and the district
  election shall not be filled by official ballot until the annual district election the following year.
- 5 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

**Bill Analysis:** This bill provides that any vacancies occurring in school district offices between the beginning of the filing period and the election shall not be filled by official ballot until the following year.

#### Summary of testimony presented in support:

## **Representative Rosemarie Rung**

- RSA 671:33 describes how school districts fill vacancies but not how they are filled during vacancies that occur during the filing period.
- Vacancies are defined in RSA 652:12, as people that leave their position, who are in the middle of their term, for reasons of resignation, a move, or death.
- The issue becomes how to fill that position after the filing period has already opened.
- In the town RSA 669:61, it states that once the election is over the new board appoints someone to fill that vacancy until the next election.
- The towns do not allow a candidate to appear on the ballot that is filling after the period is open.
- Last year in Merrimack they had a position open on the school district budget committee after the filling period opened.
- There were people in Merrimack that wanted to appear on the ballot for that position.
- The Secretary of States office advised them to comply with what RSA 669:61 requires.
- What HB 409 does is fill the gap in the school district RSA, so it is consistent with the town RSA and there is no confusion when vacancies occur.
- Senator Birdsell commented that this happened in Hampstead a month ago and asked if this bill would cover vacancies that happen one or two days prior to the election.

- Representative Rung replied that this bill just defines how to fill a vacancy that occurs during the filing period and she believes that one or two days before the election is after the filing period.
- Senator Gray asked if it would be more accurate to say in section V "for position not to be filled during that election"
  - Representative Rung replied when vacancy is used in HB 409 its following the definition of vacancy that is in RSA 652. It does not apply to people whose term is already up.
- Senator Birdsell commented that she thought the bill was referring to the beginning of the filing period to the actual town election.
  - Representative Rung replied that already exists in statute. The vacancy between the filing period and the election is filled by appointment.

## David Scanlan – Deputy Secretary of State

- The bill clarifies the school district statute in a way that they already understand the law to take place.
- The provisions already exist in statute of how to fill a vacancy and HB 409 addresses the timing of when that occurs.
- The corresponding town statute is in RSA 669:61 and the language in HB 409 for the school district will be the same.
- This gives some notice to residents who may want to run for the open position caused by the vacancy.
- Allowing people to sign up for a vacancy that occurs during the filing period invites games to be played in terms of resignations etc.

## Barret Christina – NH School Boards Association

- NHSBA did oppose it in this bill in the House because they were not quite sure of the purpose.
- After speaking with Rep Rung and listening to Deputy Secretary Scanlan they support it

## Pat Heinrich

- She requested this legislation.
- The problem was that there was a vacancy during the filing period, and she was inundated with requests to open the seat and put it on the ballot.
- The person that died was her husband and she is the clerk.
- She spoke to the Secretary of States office for clarification and the schools attorneys who advised her that someone would be appointed after the election according to statute.
- They let the committee fill it after the election and she asked Representative Rung to draft this bill to prevent confusion in the future.
