Summary of testimony presented:

Representative Glenn Cordelli - Carrol, District 4

- Representative Cordelli introduced HB 442.
- Worked on this bill with NHDOE. It amends statute on reporting requirements.
- A problem with current statute is that it doesn't include charter schools in various areas.

- Failing to comply with financial reporting for two consecutive years would result in the Commissioner revoking a school's charter.
- The amended section corrects the unintended effect on non-public schools having to provide salary information of staff.
- This bill modifies the provision on statistical reports.
- Focus on charter schools and failures to report required information, such as financial reports, to NHDOE.
- There have been instances where NHDOE has had to chase districts down for the submission of information that is required by law; as a result, the department has even been put at risk of not fulfilling their statutory requirements due to lack of receipt of this important information.
- This year, one charter school did not provide financials which resulted in their revocation.
- This bill would prevent any prolonged period where NHDOE wasn't getting what they need from school districts.

Caitlin Davis – Division Director, NH Department of Education

- Representative Cordelli sponsored this bill on their behalf.
- There is a need to clarify law surrounding NHDOE's authority when it comes to reporting requirements.
- This bill does not expand or add any new reporting requirements for any schools in the state. It only clarifies their authority if a school has failed to submit data after numerous requests from the department.
- Specifically, submissions related to DOE25, which is an important and comprehensive document.
- The department has only ever had to hold funds once.
- There have been cases of chartered public schools that have failed to fulfill their reporting requirements.
- The department still had to supply funding away. This puts NHDOE in an awkward situation.
- Of the 30 charter schools in our state, NHDOE has only had to use this leverage twice.
- They hope to never have to use it.
- They notify schools months before reporting is due.
- This bill would be another tool for the department to encourage the provision of reports, or funds will be held.
- Senator Kahn asked Ms. Davis if we require audit reports from public chartered schools and is the same penalty in place under this statute.
 - Ms. Davis said this bill is specific to statistical reports only. Charter schools are required, under charter school law, to submit financial audits.
 - On the other hand, NHDOE could look at a school's inconsistent financial reporting history when they're requesting reauthorization.
 - The same is true of district public schools where they would not hold funding for this specific reason.
