PURPOSE of HB 476 This bill allows election officials, who must staff multiple polling places in a town or a ward, to appoint multiple election officials from anywhere in that town or ward rather than only from the district where they will be working.

It is challenging enough to find well-trained election officials, but when a town or ward has multiple polling places, it is almost impossible to find these people whose domiciles are evenly distributed throughout the town. This change allows people to work in voting districts other than their own but still within their own town or ward as prescribed by law for their domicile.
