#### METHODOLOGY:

This bill requires the supervisors of the checklist, town or city clerk, or election day official to take a photograph of any person who registers using a qualified voter affidavit or sworn statement on the general election day registration form. Such photograph shall be retained in the same manner as qualified voter affidavits pursuant to RSA 33-A:3-a, CXLI(e).

The Department of State indicates this bill would require that a Polaroid style camera and film be purchased by the state for each of 330 polling places. The Department estimates each camera would cost \$80 and film for each camera would cost \$20. Replacement film would cost \$10 for each camera. Total expenditure for FY 2022 is estimated at \$33,000 (330 cameras x \$100 cost per camera including film). Total expenditure for FY 2024 for replacement film is \$3,300 (330 cameras x \$10 for replacement film).

The New Hampshire Municipal Association states this bill could result in a small expenditure if municipal officials do not already have a camera available for such purpose. It is unknown how many municipalities, if any, would be affected, so any additional municipal expenditures are indeterminable. There is no expected impact on municipal revenues.

It is assumed this bill would be effective July 1, 2021.

#### Summary of testimony presented in support:

\*Senator Birdsell introduced the bill for the prime sponsor Representative Betty Gay who was having technical difficulties and submitted written testimony.

#### Summary of testimony presented in opposition:

#### **Representative Timothy Horrigan**

- People that register without an ID is a small number.
- There is not a flood of fictitious people signing up to vote.
- He believes this law is unnecessary.

#### Neutral Information Presented:

#### David Scanlan - Deputy Secretary of State

- He would like to address the fiscal note for the Committee.
- This bill is modeled after the process a voter uses to obtain a ballot.
- Currently if a voter does not have an ID, they will fill out a voter challenge affidavit and have their picture taken at the polling place.
- When that law was enacted in 2012, they purchased Polaroid style cameras for every polling place.
- The fiscal note is in the bill for additional cameras that will be needed at some polling locations.

- In small towns one camera will suffice for both purposes but in larger towns and cities multiple cameras will be needed.
- The total amount is for one camera and film for each polling place in New Hampshire.
- The cameras that are used now are ten years old and the fiscal note reflects the most likely need for replacements soon.
- Senator Birdsell asked if they have thought about going to digital cameras.
  - Mr. Scanlan replied that to his knowledge there was not a consideration for digital. In 2012, there was a debate about using digital cameras and storing a voters digital image. At the time people were not comfortable with that and this bill does not mention the use of digital images.
- Senator Birdsell commented that if they used a digital camera the picture could be printed out and then deleted.
  - $\circ$  Mr. Scanlan replied that is true and it was discussed in 2012.
- Senator Gray asked for clarification if the statute as written does allow for digital images and for printing but the state would have to provide printers and that would be a larger expense.
  - Mr. Scanlan answered that he will have to look back at that statute to recall the specifics but if printers are required at the polling places it would be a significantly higher cost.
- Senator Ward asked how often has it happened in the past that photographs have to be taken.
  - Mr. Scanlan replied that it happens during every election but it is less than one percent. In the last election it was maybe .5 percent.
- Senator Soucy asked what is the need for a person to have their picture taken at registration if the person does not have an acceptable form of ID and is having it taken when they vote.
  - Mr. Scanlan replied that is a good question and he believes it may be because those are two different processes. The act of voter registration is different than a registered voter obtaining a ballot.
- Senator Soucy commented that this would mean the voter is getting photographed twice and she cannot imagine there are many people going to the polls to register to vote and then not casting a ballot.
  - Mr. Scanlan stated that what she is saying makes a lot of sense and there would have to be some coordination between the registration table and the check-in table for obtaining a ballot. In a small polling place, it would be easy to do but in a large polling place it would require a better process.
- Senator Gray commented that it is his understanding that when you are voting you are filling out a challenged voter certification that is kept for 22 months but the information given at the registration table is kept for seven years.
  - Mr. Scanlan stated that he is correct in that understanding.
- Senator Gray commented that it is his understanding that these files are kept in different files and in different locations and asked if he is correct.
  - Mr. Scanlan replied that the Supervisors of the Checklist are responsible for maintaining the registration records and the Town Clerk is responsible for keeping the challenge voter affidavit for obtaining a ballot.
- Senator Gray asked if on the challenged voter form they noted that the picture is attached to the registration form, would he object to that.
  - o Mr. Scanlan replied that they would have no objection with that.

I, Joan Hamblet, Rockingham 31 (Greenland, Newington, North Hampton, Portsmouth Ward 3) oppose HB-523-FN for the following reasons:

There are at least 3 groups of citizens who would be disenfranchised if this bill passes:

- Some citizens subscribe to a religion that prohibits them from having a photo taken of themselves (RSA 659:13-b). Instead, they may verify their identity by submitting an Affidavit of Religious Exemption. Under this bill, they would not be allowed to register or vote.
- 2. A "confidential voter" can be allowed to register and vote if he or she presents a valid protective order (RSA173-B:4) or evidence that he or she is a participant in the address confidentiality program (RSA 7:46). Such a voter might be prohibited from registering and voting under this bill.
- 3. Some citizens who reside in nursing homes do not have a recent form of photo identification. An administrator of the nursing home is allowed, by law, to verify their identity without a photo ID to allow them to register and vote (RSA 654:12, III).

A requirement for photo identification is not reasonable or necessary in all situations. HB 523-FN would wrongfully prevent legitimate voters from voting and would do nothing to make our elections safer.

I urge you to oppose this unfair bill.

Senators Gray, Birdsell, Ward, Soucy and Perkins-Kwoka,

First, my sincere apologies for never getting through this morning on Zoom for the hearing on my bill. I have never attempted to speak on Zoom using my phone with video. It was extremely frustrating to try repeatedly unsuccessfully, unable to get the unmute button to work. Apparently the screen just was malfunctioning. Usually I use my computer, but today I was attending my HHS&EA hearings in the LOB and thought using the phone would spare me carrying the laptop. So both Senator Gray and I had to leave an HHS hearing to go to an Election Law hearing.

Thank you for hearing my testimony, albeit hours later:

My bill, HB 523, requires people who register to vote using a qualified voter affidavit, in lieu of proof of identification and domicile, to have their photo taken to be retained with the affidavit.

I was inspired to submit this bill when a new representative who worked at the November polls told a few of us about an unsettling experience he had. A group of twenty-somethings not recognized by anyone there showed up to register to vote. All of them claimed to have no form of identification. So they were given qualified voter affidavits to complete.

When they got in line to vote, they were told they needed to have their photos taken because they had no ID's. They all refused, claiming they did not have to. They offered no justification. The election officials did not like it, but they allowed them to vote.

After hearing this, I called the SOS office to ask about the legality of allowing that to happen again. I was told the election officials really should have reported the incident. Hence I decided to help get the intended procedure codified in an RSA.

Note: If someone is actually one of those rare individuals whose religious beliefs do not allow photographs, they can still register to vote, but they will need documentation for identity and domicile like the majority of people registering to vote. The Amish are an example of people whose religion forbids photographs.

1 really appreciate Senator Gray's detailed analysis supporting the need for this form of photo identification be retained with the affidavit for the full seven years required.

And I really appreciate his writing the amendment to cover all the bases.

The committee discussion noted how few photos are being taken at the polls. An anecdotal explanation is that the number of voters who now use qualified voter affidavits got much fewer once the photos started being required.

One of the Salem Supervisors of the Checklist told me that she has had people who declined to show ID change their mind when told that they would need a photo. Apparently having the cameras is having a positive effect on voter ID, so much so that we are saving on film!


