Summary of testimony presented in support:

Representative Andrew Boulding

- This bill does not create any new rights or expand the right to vote.
- Current law states that a person behind bars can vote by absentee ballot.
- RSAs 654:5 and 607-A:2 address the only time a person's right to vote is taken away, which is when they are actively serving time for a felony conviction.
- A person behind bars awaiting trial or serving time for a misdemeanor is still legally eligible to vote in New Hampshire.
- The issue is that those prisoners may have to purger themselves in order to fill out the absentee ballot application and affidavit.
- Section 2 of the application list reasons you can request an absentee ballot and you must select one.
- There is no option on the application or the affidavit that applies to someone in jail, domiciled in a city or town other than where they are a resident.
- In order to vote this person needs to risk further jail time by providing false information which carries a maximum sentence of one year in jail and a \$2,000 fine.
- This disenfranchises those voters.

- HB 555 will correct this issue by adding a check box to the application form and language to the sworn statement in the affidavit for individuals who are incarcerated pre-trial or serving time for a misdemeanor.
- He spoke with Deputy Secretary of State Scanlan last year and he agreed that this was an issue and they are open to adding this language.
- Senator Gray asked if they could just slightly modify the statement that is already on the form to include these individuals.
 - Rep. Boulding replied that as long as the language on the form made it clear that they were able to vote absentee he agrees that would be a good compromise.
- Senator Gray commented that they have never had a problem with those that are incarcerated for a misdemeanor that he knows of but they will ask the Deputy Secretary of State. He asked if the restriction on voting for those convicted of a felony was enforced even if the individual is on parole.
 - Rep. Boulding commented that his understanding of the law is that the only people prohibited from voting are those that are incarcerated for a felony. He believes that if you out on parole under the supervision of a parole officer you are able to cast a ballot.

Henry Klementowicz – ACLU NH

- The ACLU of NH supports HB 555 for many of the same reasons that Rep. Bouldin testified on.
- In his view this is a housekeeping bill.
- It has long been the law in New Hampshire that only people actively serving a felony sentence of incarceration or people that are convicted of bribery or other election related offenses are disqualified from voting.
- The number of people incarcerated pending trial or incarcerated for a misdemeanor conviction is not small.
- He sees this bill as amending the form to conform with what has already been the law.
- He has no problem with Senator Gray's proposal of working the language into what is already there but he does believe that the language in this bill is pretty clear.

David Scanlan – Deputy Secretary of State

- He is in agreement with all of the previous testimony.
- There is an administrative concern with the bill.
- The space on the form is limited and every time they add language it becomes more difficult to read or to sign.
- He asked the committee to see if they could consolidate some of the language on the affidavit form so that it is clear.
- Senator Gray asked if a person convicted of a felony had to complete their sentence including any parole before they could resume voting.
 - Mr. Scanlan replied that as long as they are not incarcerated they can vote. They cannot run for office until they complete the obligations of their sentence.
