Summary of testimony presented in support:

Senator Sharon Carson

Senate District 14

• Senator Carson introduced HB 567 on behalf of Representative Stephen Pearson, who was not present at the time.

Senator Suzanne Prentiss

Senate District 5

- Senator Prentiss said that she supported HB 567.
- Senator Prentiss said that during the COVID-19 pandemic, an Emergency Order put

provisions in place to allow people with comparable skills to serve as licensed nursing assistants (LNAs). She said that HB 567 codifies that provision.

- Senator Prentiss said that HB 567 made sense, as it put military personnel in a position for a job opportunity.
- Senator Prentiss said that HB 567 was smart for the workforce and smart for healthcare.
- Senator Carson said that HB 567 identifies specific military occupational specialty codes for the Army and Air Force but noted that those codes change over time. She said that the General Court will need to be aware that whenever the Army or Air Force reorganize their codes, the statute will need to be changed.
 - Senator Prentiss said that that was a good point and that she would work with Rep. Pearson on an amendment to neutralize the language so that it lives over time.

Representative Stephen Pearson

Rockingham – District 6

- Representative Pearson said that the LNA situation is dire and was dire before the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Rep. Pearson said that the military designation shows that those individuals have undergone training with standards above and beyond the LNA standards and HB 567 would allow them to take the LNA exam without going through the typical training.
- Senator Carson reiterated her comments about the potential for change in the military codes referenced in HB 567. She asked if there was a different way to identify those occupational specialties without referencing the specific code, which may change. She said that she would work with Senator Prentiss on an amendment.
 - Rep. Pearson said that the intent is not to pigeonhole the language into a highly technical specification. He said that if the language needs to be loosened, it needs to be loosened. He said that he does not want the statute to need to be constantly amended.
- Senator Carson asked why HB 567 only references Army and Air Force personnel, when the Marine Corps, Navy, and Coast Guard also have similar personnel.
 - Rep. Pearson said that there is no reason why additional service members were left out of HB 567. He said that there was a misunderstanding that the codes used in HB 567 were applicable across the armed services.
