ANALYSIS

This bill expands the use of apprenticeship programs in qualifying for licensure as a cosmetologist, manicurist, or esthetician by the board of barbering, cosmetology, and esthetics.

relative to licensure of applicants for cosmetology, esthetics, and manicuring through apprenticeship programs.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 Cosmetologists; Qualifications; Training RSA 313-A:11, I(c) is repealed and reenacted to read as follows:
- (c) Have received training which shall not exceed 1,500 hours under a licensed cosmetologist or at a licensed cosmetology school through an apprenticeship approved by the board, the department of education, or the federal Department of Labor, or as otherwise permitted under state or federal law;
- 2 Manicurists; Qualifications; Training RSA 313-A:12 is repealed and reenacted to read as follows:
- 313-A:12 Qualifications; Manicurists. A person, to be issued a manicurist's license by the board, shall, in addition to satisfying the requirements of RSA 313-A:11, I(a), (b), and (e):
- I. Have completed a course of at least 300 hours of professional training in manicuring, in a school approved by the board and passed an examination conducted by the board; or
- II. Have completed an apprenticeship approved by the board, the department of education, or the federal Department of Labor, or as otherwise permitted under state or federal law, which shall not exceed 300 hours in a licensed salon under a licensed manicurist, and passed an examination conducted by the board.
 - $3\,$ Estheticians; Qualifications; Training. Amend RSA 313-A:13 to read as follows:
- 18 313-A:13 Qualifications; Estheticians.
 - I. To be issued an esthetics license by the board, an applicant shall, in addition to satisfying the requirements of RSA 313-A:11, I(a), (b), and (e), have completed a course of at least 600 hours of training in a school approved by the board and have passed an examination conducted by the board. An apprenticeship [approved by the board may substitute for the required training. Estheticians who have practiced professionally in this state for a period of at least 3 years prior to July 1, 1989, and who have satisfied the requirements of RSA 313 A:11, I(a), (b), and (c) and the training requirements of this section shall not be required to take the examination provided for in this section to be eligible for licensure under this chapter], which shall not exceed 600 hours, approved by the board, the department of education, or the federal Department of Labor, or as otherwise permitted under state or federal law, may substitute for the required training.
 - II. Credit towards the hours requirement for esthetician training may be given to a licensed cosmetologist or barber for equivalent training in the cosmetology or barber program in a school

- approved by the board upon certification of the training by the school. Credit towards the hours requirement for esthetician training may be given to a licensed massage therapist for massage therapy training deemed equivalent by the board. Cosmetologists licensed by the board may obtain the training hours in subjects required by the board in increments at separate schools but must present certifications to the board for all required hours and curriculum subjects.
 - 4 Apprenticeship Registration. Amend RSA 313-A:24, I to read as follows:

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- I. No person shall enter an apprenticeship or enroll in a school under this chapter unless such person has registered with the board as an apprentice and been issued an apprentice license. The board shall have sole authority to regulate apprentices and apprenticeship under this chapter. The board shall issue an apprentice license to any student receiving instruction within a licensed school [ex] and/or shop to learn barbering, cosmetology, esthetics, or manicuring.
 - 5 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

Amendment to HB 575

1 Amend the bill by replacing section 5 with the following:

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- 5 Contingency. If SB 133-FN of the 2021 legislative session becomes law and amends RSA 313-A:24, then section 4 of this act shall not take effect. If SB 133-FN does not become law then section 4 of this act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
 - 6 Effective Date.
 - I. Section 4 of this act shall take effect as provided in section 5 of this act.
 - II. The remainder of this act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

Summary of testimony presented in support:

Representative Glenn Cordelli

Carroll - District 4

- Representative Cordelli said that HB 575 is a request from a friend of a former Representative and makes several changes to licensing statute.
- Rep. Cordelli said that HB 575:
 - o Amends the qualifications for licensure as a cosmetologist from 1,500 hours of training or 3,000 hours engaged in the practice to 1,500 hours at a licensed school or training with a licensed cosmetologist;

- o Amends the qualifications for licensure for a manicurist to 300 hours at a licensed school or in a salon as an apprentice;
- o Amends the qualifications for licensure for an esthetician to 600 hours at a licensed school or as an apprentice; and
- o Changes the statute governing apprenticeships to allow for people learning in a school and/or in a shop.
- Rep. Cordelli said that the changes are made looking at the requirements for training in
 other areas of statute, including those for driver's education, home inspectors, and family
 mediators. He said that the revisions in HB 575 are reasonable for the current statutes.
- Rep. Cordelli said that SB 133 deals with a similar topic and House Executive Departments
 and Administration is working on SB 133. He said that HB 575's language is important
 because it encourages people in the workforce, provides additional opportunities, and makes
 small steps to open more doors.

Representative Carol McGuire

Merrimack - District 29

- Representative McGuire said that HB 575 and SB 133 are mostly independent of each other.
 She said that House Executive Departments and Administration has an amendment to take the "and/or" language from HB 575 and add it to SB 133, as it is the most efficient way to get fully trained.
- Rep. McGuire said that she also suggested an amendment to say that if both HB 575 and SB 133 are passed and signed into law, the conflicting section of HB 575 would not take effect and SB 133's section would take effect, as SB 133's language was more comprehensive.
- Senator Reagan asked if the amendment dealing with the conflicting statute was already in HB 575 as presented to the Committee.
 - o Rep. McGuire said that it was not, but that she had worked with Senator Carson on Amendment 2021-1209s.
