ANALYSIS

This bill revises the procedure and timeframe for license renewals of allied health professionals, body art practitioners, podiatrists, chiropractors, acupuncturists, and veterinarians.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty One

AN ACT relative to licensure renewal dates for certain governing boards under the office of professional licensure and certification.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 New Section; Office of Professional Licensure and Registration; Renewals. Amend RSA 310-A
2 by inserting after section 1-g the following new section:

3 310-A:1-h License Renewals; Lapse.

4 I. This section shall apply to the following professions administered by the office of
5 professional licensure and certification:

6 (a) Body art establishments and booths regulated under RSA 314-A.

7 (b) Podiatrists regulated under RSA 315.

8 (c) Chiropractors regulated under RSA 316-A.

9 (d) Occupational therapist and occupational therapy assistants regulated under RSA
10 326-C.

11 (e) Respiratory care practitioners regulated under RSA 326-E.

12 (f) Speech-language pathologists and speech-language assistants regulated under RSA
13 326-F.

14 (g) Athletic trainers regulated under RSA 326-G.

15 (h) Recreational therapists regulated under RSA 326-J.

16 (i) Genetic counselors regulated under RSA 326-K.

17 (j) Physical therapists and physical therapist assistants regulated under RSA 328-A.

18 (k) Acupuncturists regulated under RSA 328-G.

19 (l) Veterinarians regulated under RSA 332-B.

20 II. The executive director of the office of professional licensure and certification shall issue
21 initial licenses meeting the eligibility requirements as defined in statute and rules adopted by each
22 individual board to applicants who have completed the application procedure.

23 III. Initial licenses and renewals shall be valid for 2 years, except that timely and complete
24 application for license renewal by eligible applicants shall continue the validity of the licenses being
25 renewed until the board has acted on the renewal application. Licenses issued shall expire on the
26 last day of the month in the month the license was issued.

27 IV. Applicants shall submit completed applications for renewal, the renewal fee, and any
28 supporting documents required for that renewal on or before the last day in the month of renewal.
29 Licenses shall lapse when completed renewal applications, renewal fee, and supporting documents

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1 have not been filed by the last day in the month of renewal, and the holders of a lapsed license are
2 not authorized to practice until the licenses have been reinstated.

3 V. The office of professional licensure and certification shall provide licensees, at least 2
4 months before the date of expiration of their license, with notice of the need to complete their
5 renewal applications. Failure to receive notice shall not relieve any licensee of the obligation to
6 renew their license, comply with the rules of the boards, or comply with this section. Timeliness of
7 submission of renewal applications shall be evidenced by postmark, for applications delivered by
8 hand the by date stamp or other record made at the time of delivery, or for applications submitted
9 electronically the electronic time stamp of submission.

10 VI. During the transition of renewing licenses from their original date of renewal to the date
11 of the licensee's month of licensure pursuant to this section the board will prorate the fees. Prorated
12 fees shall not exceed 11 months.

13 VII. Upon the request of a licensee who is a member of any reserve component of the armed
14 forces of the United States or the national guard and is called to active duty, the office of
15 professional licensure and certification shall place the person's license on inactive status. The
16 license may be reactivated within one year of the licensee's release from active status by payment of
17 the renewal fee and with proof of completion of the most current continuing education requirement
18 unless still within the renewal period.

19 2 Allied Health Professionals; License Renewals. RSA 328-F:19 is repealed and reenacted to
20 read as follows:

21 328-F:19 Renewal. The procedure and timeframe for license renewals for persons licensed by a
22 governing board established in RSA 328-F:4 shall be as described in RSA 310-A:1-h.

23 3 Chiropractic; Renewal Reference Removed. Amend RSA 316-A:14-a to read as follows:

24 316-A:14-a Licenses and Certificates. Each applicant who qualifies under this chapter and who
25 attains a minimum grade of 70 percent upon the examination given under RSA 316-A:13, I shall
26 receive a license from the board as a chiropractor permitted to practice in New Hampshire. The fee
27 for an initial license and for a license renewal shall be \$300. [~~The initial license and renewal~~
28 ~~licenses shall be valid for the terms established under RSA 316-A:19.]~~

29 4 Chiropractic; License Renewals. RSA 316-A:20 is repealed and reenacted to read as follows:

30 316-A:20 Renewal.

31 I. The procedure and timeframe for license renewals shall be as described in RSA 310-A:1-h.

32 II. Each applicant for renewal shall submit satisfactory evidence that the applicant has
33 completed at least 20 hours of continuing education approved by or conducted by the International
34 Chiropractors Association, or the American Chiropractic Association, or the New Hampshire board of
35 chiropractic examiners, or any state-chartered chiropractic school or college, within one year prior to
36 the date of renewal.

37 5 Repeals; Chiropractic. The following are repealed:

13 ~~paid within 90 days of the expiration date.~~] Any failure, neglect, or refusal on the part of any person
14 licensed by the board to renew the license as provided in RSA 315:11 or this section shall
15 automatically result in the lapse of the license. Licenses lapsed under this section [~~for nonpayment~~
16 ~~within 90 days]~~ shall not be reinstated except upon *application and* payment of a reinstatement
17 fee as established in rules adopted by the [~~board~~] *office of professional licensure and*
18 *certification*, and a showing of such evidence of professional competence as the board may
19 reasonably require.

20 9 Podiatry; Reinstatement. Amend RSA 315:13-a to read as follows:

21 315:13-a Reinstatement. Any person who has not renewed his or her license [~~within 90 days of~~
22 ~~the expiration date]~~ shall only have his or her license restored upon the filing of a reinstatement
23 application, accompanied by the reinstatement fee as established by the [~~board~~] *office of*
24 *professional licensure and certification*, proof of satisfaction of continuing podiatric education
25 requirements established by RSA 315:4, V, and such other evidence of professional competence as
26 the board may reasonably require.

METHODOLOGY:

This bill would change the license renewal cycle for certain professions regulated by the Office of Professional Licensure from an every other year (odd or even) basis to 2 years from date of license issuance. This change will not affect the total amount collected but will redistribute the funds throughout each year. Partial license periods under current law allow for between 5 and 20 months. The bill allows for proration of licenses issued for more than 2 years during the transition period, which will not affect revenue from these transitioned licenses. However, some individuals would be required to renew their license and pay the \$110 renewal fee even without having a full 2 years of licensure. Late fees would be eliminated but early reinstatement fees would continue. The OPLC is unable to determine how licensing revenue and late fees would be impacted on an annual basis as licensing applications and late fees vary from year to year but total fees collected as a result of these proposed changes should not vary by any significant amount.

It is assumed this bill will not take effect until FY 2022.

Bill Analysis: This bill revises the procedure and timeframe for license renewals of allied health professionals, body art practitioners, podiatrists, chiropractors, acupuncturists, and veterinarians.

Who supports the bill: Representative Carol McGuire (Merrimack – District 29), Tina Kelley (the Office of Professional Licensure and Certification), and Representative Tony Lekas (Hillsborough – District 37).

Summary of testimony presented in support:

Representative Carol McGuire

Merrimack – District 29

- Representative McGuire said that HB 94 is a request of the Office of Professional Licensure and Certification (OPLC).
- Rep. McGuire said that HB 94 changes some of the renewal dates for certain licenses from a specific date to two years after the license was issued.
- Rep. McGuire said the changes in HB 94 would be convenient for OPLC administrative staff, oversight board staff, and the licensed professionals by making the renewal date at a notable

time. She also said that there would be no need to prorate continued education, as the new renewal dates would be in line with the continued education timeline.

- Rep. McGuire said that some OPLC boards were strongly in favor of HB 94, some were reluctantly in favor, but none were opposed.
- Rep. McGuire said that HB 94 passed House Executive Departments and Administration unanimously and passed the House on the Consent Calendar.

Tina Kelley

OPLC

- Ms. Kelley said that OPLC supports HB 94.
- Ms. Kelley said that renewals are currently done in either June or December. Due to the increasing number of licensed professionals in New Hampshire, this creates a surge that is unmanageable for OPLC staff. She said that HB 94 would standardize renewal dates and spread them out across the year.
- Ms. Kelley said that there will be extensive time to transition to the new renewal system with a one-time prorated fee.
- Senator Reagan asked how many boards already operated on the two-year renewal system and how many still needed to be moved over.
 - Ms. Kelley said that HB 94 was the start of the transition. She said that a couple of boards may already be on a two-year renewal system but she was not certain.
