ANALYSIS

This bill:

I. Changes the term of a charity gaming license from 12 months from issue to annually expiring on December 31.

II. Expands the definition of charitable organization for the purpose of issuing charitable gaming, bingo, and Lucky 7 licenses.

III. Corrects incorrect references to the lottery commission.

IV. Changes the definition of deal in reference to Lucky 7.

operate games of chance for 10 days, which 10 days need not be consecutive.



Summary of testimony presented:

Sen. Giuda

- This was requested by the Lottery Commission to makes some administrative changes.
- The changes include: term of license to expire on Dec. 31st, expands definition of charitable organizations for issuing charitable gaming and Lucky 7 licenses, changes definition of a deal in reference to Lucky 7.

Rick Newman

Represents NH Charitable Gaming Operators Association.

- This is a housekeeping bill of technical corrections.
- The criteria change relative to what kind of charities qualify for games of chance and Lucky 7 makes them the same for both types of gaming.
- It corrects drafting errors in the parimutuel statute.
- It changes the definition of a deal, removing reference to the word bag, relative to Lucky 7.

Sen. Hennessey asked what the list of bona fide members is on line 24 of the bill.

Mr. Newman said that has been on the books for long time and he thinks they do have a list of bona fide members. When little leagues use games of chance, the Lottery Commission requires a list of members, so they give the board of directors. A VFW, for example, would have members.

Sen. Hennessey said the bill indicates it is new wording.

Mr. Newman said that is because the criteria of a charity is being changed.

Sen. Rosenwald noted that in sections 2 and 3 there is distinction made between religious organizations and church organizations. She asked what the difference is and if "church" excludes others like synagogues.

Valerie King

- Mr. Newman is correct that the Lottery Commission is hoping to make the definition of charitable organization consistent across all game types.
- They want to vet a charity once for all game types. That is purpose of this. That is also why it appears as new text. In order to make it the same they had to add it to one or subtract it from another.
- If the legislature wants to remove those requirements that is fine, they just want consistency.
- With regard to Sen. Rosenwald's question, she believes it is an IRS designation, and all religious entities would qualify.

Sen. Rosenwald asked why it references both religious and church organizations. Ms. King said she cannot answer that as it is old language. She thinks it came from IRS titles.

Sen. Giuda said he would suspect it might be an actual church vs. Knights of Columbus for example.

Sen. Rosenwald wondered if church is too narrow a word to use.

Sen. Giuda agreed and suggested that "houses of worship" would be better.

Ms. King asked that the committee be consistent if it changes that definition.
