STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 Availability of Checklist and Voter Information; Municipal Voter History. Amend RSA 654:31,
 2 III to read as follows:
 3 III. Any person may view the data that would be available on the public checklist, as
 - III. Any person may view the data that would be available on the public checklist, as corrected by the supervisors of the checklist, as well as municipal voter history, on the statewide centralized voter registration database maintained by the secretary of state at the state records and archives center during normal business hours, but the person viewing data at the state records and archives center may not print, duplicate, transmit, or alter the data.
 - 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
