 3 2. Removal of Commissioners. The city [manager] council shall have full power to remove
 - 2. Removal of Commissioners. The city [manager] council shall have full power to remove any police commissioner at any time for just cause and after due hearing which cause shall be specified in the order of removal.
 - 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
