“Those who cannot remember the past are condemned to repeat it.”  
That’s why we need to observe Remembrance Day.

World War One is the forgotten War. The last American WW 1 Veteran died in 2010. What happened from 1914 to 1918 shocked the world and changed the world forever.

It was a war like no one had ever imagined. People called it the Great War or the War to End all wars. 30 nations fought. Military tactics of the 19<sup>th</sup> century met the military technology of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Millions died. 2 million German Soldiers, 1.1 million British, 1.4 million French, 1.8 million Russians. These countries lost an entire generation. The US lost 117,000.

Great Empires fell. The Russian, The Austro-Hungarian and the Ottoman empire were shattered. And a slew of new nations emerged or re-emerged. Poland, Czechoslovakia, Yugoslavia, Finland, to name some. And the peoples of the middle east were no longer under Ottoman Rule.

There is so much more to tell. Communism, nationalism, Fashisism. Suffice it to say that many of the world’s problems, even today, have their roots in World war One and its aftermath.

November 11 used to be called Armistice Day in the USA, On the 11<sup>th</sup> hour of the 11<sup>th</sup> day of the 11<sup>th</sup> month of 1918 the guns went silent. In 1954 the holiday was changed to Veterans day, to honor all veterans and that is as it should be. But we should also remember Remembrance Day to denote a time when the world changed cataclysmically and we do not become “Those who did not learn history and are doomed to repeat it.” But, as Americans, just as <sup>we</sup> celebrate July 4<sup>th</sup> as our nation’s birthday, let us at least remember the time the United States of America became an adult

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

*In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty Two*

AN ACT                    declaring November 11 as Remembrance Day.

*Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:*

1            1 New Section; Powers of the Governor and Council in Certain Cases; Observances Proclaimed  
2 by the Governor; Remembrance Day Established. Amend RSA 4 by inserting after section 13-cc the  
3 following new section:

4            4:13-dd Remembrance Day. In recognition of the Armistice agreement that ended the First  
5 World War, the governor shall annually proclaim November 11 as Remembrance Day. On this day,  
6 the governor shall urge cities and towns to observe this day with appropriate ceremonies and  
7 activities.

8            2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
