World War One is the forgotten War. The last American WW 1 Veteran died in 2010. What happened from 1914 to 1918 shocked the world and changed the world forever.

It was a war like no one had ever imagined. People called it the Great War or the War to End all wars. 30 nations fought. STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty Two

AN ACT declaring November 11 as Remembrance Day.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 New Section; Powers of the Governor and Council in Certain Cases; Observances Proclaimed
 2 by the Governor; Remembrance Day Established. Amend RSA 4 by inserting after section 13-cc the
 3 following new section:
 4 4:13-dd Remembrance Day. In recognition of the Armistice agreement that ended the First
 5 World War, the governor shall annually proclaim November 11 as Remembrance Day. On this day,
 6 the governor shall urge cities and towns to observe this day with appropriate ceremonies and
 7 activities.
- 8 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
