Submission 24of the diagram will enable the state to better prepare, respond, and mitigate potentially dangerous 25conditions should the need arise.

II. Each school shall provide the plan to, and coordinate the plan with, local emergency authorities and with the emergency operations plan in the municipality in which the school is located. Each school shall review its plan at least annually and update the plan, as necessary, and shall submit the updated plan to the [department of education] director of homeland security and emergency management, department of safety by September 1. If after review, the plan is unchanged, the school shall notify the department of safety by September 1 that the plan is unchanged. [The department shall provide a copy of any updated plan to the director of homeland
