The sponsor felt that there was a need for this legislation because requests for this type of information are often denied, and that making the requirement explicit would address the issue. However, transparency watchdogs including New Hampshire Right to Know, were opposed to the bill because it takes the broad language in the existing statute and markedly narrows it down. The concern, therefore, is that the bill may have the unintended consequence of reducing transparency in other areas in the future.

Right to Know law applies to all public bodies and I know of no other provision specific to particular organizations. Other law requires curricula materials and gthe other items listed be made available to parents and they could be available to everyone.

Q Wuelper: do you know of times/places where requests for these items have been problematic? Ans: Yes. Since the anti-discrimination law last year there have been many requests for these types of materials and more related like teacher training.

Q Horrigan: Would this apply also to Charter schools?

Ans: Yes, charter schools are included both in the definitions of public schools and the one of public body.

Laurie Ortolano RTKNH Support/Oppose We don't think specific lists of documents should be part of RSA 91-A. I have attached a couple of RSAs which delineate the records that are public along with other record requirements. With the broad definitions in 91-A, schools are already included and creating a complete list would be impossible. I don't think curricula are as widely available as they should be. Sometimes the curricula are approved without being physically present at the approving meeting so I do think we could be clearer, but not in 91-A.

HB1147 ORTOLAND

Dear Honorable Members of the Judiciary Committee;

My name is Laurie Ortolano. I live in Nashua. I am the Vice President of Right to Know New Hampshire (RTKNH) and we are opposed to HB 1147, amending the RSA to list specific school records as governmental records under the right to know law. HB 1603 FN is a similar bill that was heard at 9:00 am by this committee.

The RSA 91-A definition of a governmental record encompasses, in broad terms, the specific language that has been added with this bill. The broad language defining records should not be juxtaposed with a list of specific school records as called out in this amendment for curricula, reading lists and student survey dates and questions. If the legislature starts adding specific records, RSA 91-A could become pages of listed public documents.

While school records are listed in this amendment, every other municipal office could request the list of their records be included. RSA 33-a, is the municipal disposition and retention schedule. This document provides a list of specific documents and document types to be maintained for a specific time period.

Relative to school documents, RSA 189:29-a delineates records retention and disposition as it applies to School Boards, superintendents, teachers and truant officers. Boards are responsible for setting policy directing Superintendents to establish retention schedules for all official school records. It is unclear why a state level record retention document does not exists for school records.

A governmental record is defined by RSA 91-A as:

Governmental records" means any information created, accepted, or obtained by, or on behalf of, any public body, or a quorum or majority thereof, or any public agency in furtherance of its official function. Without limiting the foregoing, the term "governmental records" includes any written communication or other information, whether in paper, electronic, or other physical form, received by a quorum or majority of a public body in furtherance of its official function, whether at a meeting or outside a meeting of the body. The term "governmental records" shall also include the term "public records."

and public bodies include, by definition, any school district or SAU.

Specific exemptions defined in RSA 91-A:5 provide the restrictions that apply to records for non-disclosure.

Please keep the language for public documents in the broadest possible terms and oppose HB1147.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty Two

AN ACT relative to governmental records available upon request.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

Access to Governmental Records and Meetings; Minutes and Records Available for Public
Inspection; Inclusion of School Curricula, Reading Lists, and Student Survey Dates and Questions.
Amend RSA 91-A:4, IV(a) to read as follows:

4 IV.(a) Each public body or agency shall, upon request for any governmental record

5 reasonably described, including school curricula, reading lists, and student survey dates and

6 *questions*, make available for inspection and copying any such governmental record within its files

7 when such records are immediately available for such release.

8 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
