STATEMENT OF INTENT

Under the provisions of this bill, state and local government officials will be under order to not enforce federal gun laws. Over the years, on many topics, both democrat and republican attorneys general have opined that New Hampshire law enforcement should not be enforcing federal laws. This is a simple concept, state and local police are hired, trained, and compensated with state and local tax dollars. It makes no sense to divert those scant resources to enforce federal laws that, if they are to be enforced, should properly be enforced by federal law enforcement officers. This bill is wholly consistent with U.S. Supreme Court rulings. In 1997 the Supreme Court ruled in Printz v. United States that Congress cannot make states enforce the federal Brady gun control law which attempted to require local Sheriffs or police to carry out gun background checks. And the Printz case was not an outlier, in the late 1800s, some northern states, such as Pennsylvania, passed personal liberty laws which made it illegal for citizens of the commonwealth to help enforce the Fugitive Slave Act. Likewise, in the eighteenth century, Virginia and Kentucky threatened to nullify the Alien & Sedition Acts of 1798, which essentially jailed people for criticizing government officials. American states have a long history of pushing back against federal mandates and federal oversight. This bill is consistent with that history.

9	159-E:1 Federal Statutes, Regulations, and Presidential Executive Orders Relating to the Right
10	to Keep and Bear Arms. Pursuant to the general court's authority under Part II, Article 5 of the
11	New Hampshire Constitution, the state of New Hampshire, a political subdivision of this state, or
12	any person acting under the color of state, county, or municipal law shall be prohibited from using
13	any personnel or financial resources to enforce, administer, or cooperate with any law, act, rule,
14	order, or regulation of the United States Government or Executive Order of the President of the
15	United States that is inconsistent with any law of this state regarding the regulation of firearms,
16	ammunition, magazines or the ammunition feeding devices, firearm components, firearms supplies,
17	or knives. Silence in the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated pertaining to a matter
18	regulated by federal law shall be construed as an inconsistency for the purposes of this chapter.
19	159-E:2 Application. In light of the long-standing practice of cooperation between federal, state,
20	and local law enforcement agencies, nothing in this chapter shall prevent a state, county, or local
21	official from cooperating with or rendering aid or assistance to federal officials in any circumstance
22	where there is reasonable suspicion to believe that a person who is the subject of an investigation for
23	violation of federal firearms law covered by RSA 159-E:1 also has committed, is committing, or is
24	about to commit a violation of New Hampshire law or a violation of a federal law, regulation, order,
25	or practice not covered by RSA 159-E:1. Nothing in this chapter shall prevent a state, county, or
26	local official from providing authorized federal officials, upon their request, with official state,
27	county, or local records that are available to the public or which constitute criminal history records
28	maintained by an agency of state, county, or local government, or taking any other action necessary
29	to fulfill or comply with the state's obligations under the National Crime Prevention and Privacy

Dear Chairman Abbas and Committee Members:

May this find you all well. I am writing today as both a resident of Bedford, NH and as the New Hampshire State Director for Gun Owners of America, a national organization with over two million individual members and supporters. We strongly support HB 1178 which will prohibit state and local police from enforcing federal firearms laws.

If HB 1178 is enacted into law, state and local government officials will be under order to NOT enforce federal gun laws. Over the years, on many topics, both Democrat and Republican attorneys general have opined that New Hampshire law enforcement should not be enforcing federal laws. This is a simple concept, given that state and local police are hired, trained and compensated with state and local tax dollars. It makes no sense to divert those scant resources to enforce federal laws that, if they are to be enforced, should properly be enforced by federal law enforcement officers.

This is not a new idea and would not be the first time that a state law has been used to combat tyrannical federal laws. In the 1800s, some northern states, such as Pennsylvania, passed Personal Liberty Laws which made it illegal for citizens of the Commonwealth to help enforce the Fugitive Slave Act.

HB 1178 is wholly consistent with U.S. Supreme Court rulings. In 1997 the Supreme Court ruled in *Printz v. United States* that Congress cannot make states enforce the federal Brady gun control law which attempted to require local Sheriffs or police to carry out gun background checks.

And in the 2012 challenge to Obamacare, *NFIB vs. Sebelius*, the Supreme Court held: "Congress has no authority to order the States to regulate according to its instructions. ... or risk losing all Medicaid funding."

American states have historically fought back against all forms of government tyranny, and enacting HB 1178 will go a long way towards protecting our Constitutional Right to Bear Arms – a right that is guaranteed by the New Hampshire Constitution.

On behalf of the two million members and supporters of Gun Owners of America, I am urging you to vote HB 1178 "ought to pass" without any amendments or changes.

I respectfully request that this letter be included in the official records of HB 1178.

ANALYSIS

This bill prohibits the state of New Hampshire, a political subdivision of this state, or any person acting under the color of state, county, or municipal law from using any personnel or financial resources to enforce, administer, or cooperate with any law, act, rule, order, or regulation of the United States Government or Executive Order of the President of the United States that is inconsistent with any law of this state regarding the regulation of firearms, ammunition, magazines or the ammunition feeding devices, firearm components, firearms supplies, or knives.

Pursuant to the general court's authority under Part II, Article 5 of the 9 New Hampshire Constitution, the state of New Hampshire, a political subdivision of this state, or 10 any person acting under the color of state, county, or municipal law shall be prohibited from using 11any personnel or financial resources to enforce, administer, or cooperate with any law, act, rule, 12order, or regulation of the United States Government or Executive Order of the President of the United States that is inconsistent with any law of this state regarding the regulation of firearms, 1314ammunition, magazines or the ammunition feeding devices, firearm components, firearms supplies, or knives. Silence in the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated pertaining to a matter 1516regulated by federal law shall be construed as an inconsistency for the purposes of this chapter. 17159-E:2 Severability. If any provision of this chapter or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the 18

chapter which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end theprovisions of this chapter are declared to be severable.
