AN ACT relative to the definition of "party" for election purposes.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty Two

AN ACT relative to the definition of "party" for election purposes.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 Elections; Definitions; Party. Amend RSA 652:11 to read as follows:
- 2 652:11 Party. "Party" shall mean any political organization which at the preceding state
- 3 general election received at least [4] one percent of the total number of votes cast for any one of the
- 4 following: the office of governor or the offices of United States senators.
- 5 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
