STATEMENT OF INTENT

The minority believes that this bill as amended is a bill that creates both economic and medical risk for the people of New Hampshire. The amendment adds a new exemption for vaccine mandates to the current medical and religious exemption. The new exemption would be for right of conscience. Medical professionals testified that any broadening of exemptions creates a reduction in vaccination rates and the risk of infectious disease increases. The new exemption and the likely increase in infectious disease applies to all vaccines, not just COVID-19. The medical professionals also testified that allowing hospital and nursing home employees to opt out of vaccines will put Medicaid and Medicare funding at risk to these institutions. This bill also makes it so that all exemptions must be approved without challenge by the employer. For these reasons, the minority believes this bill should be found inexpedient to legislate.

Rep. Tim Lang introduced the bill. The goal of this bill is to go back to the simple way employers used to deal with requests for exemptions. Rather than requiring medical proof or religious proof to justify your exemption it simply allows the employee to state they desire an exemption and the employer to grant it. Beyond the religious and medical exemption this also allows for a conscientious exemption. Unalienable rights that we have are rights that cannot be taken away. We should not be forced to take a vaccine, especially one that is not preventative, but only possibly lessens the effects of COVID-19.

Rep. Seaworth: You mentioned the employer and employee trying to work out alternatives. I don't see that in the bill

Rep Lang: That is elsewhere in the RSAs with regard to exemptions and alternatives

Rep. Prout: Do you think employers are under pressure from the federal government to force mandates?

Rep Lang: Yes

Rep. Avellani: Why did you choose this section of the law

Rep. Lang: It seemed to be the best place.

Rep. Avellani: Would you be opposed to moving it to another section.

Rep. Lang: No

Rep. Turcotte: In this committee we try not to get in the middle of employee/employer relationships. How can we accomplish this while respecting that?

Rep. Lang: I think we are helping both the employer and employee not getting between them.

Rep. Turcotte: still having trouble reconciling this.

Rep. Lang: Given protecting employer rights or individual rights. I have to side with the individual.

Rep. Sullivan: You reference the need to give up some rights. Would you agree that the framers of the constitution recognized there needed to be a balance.

Rep. Lang: The framers of the NH constitution particularly called out the right of conscious as an inalienable right.

Rep. Maneval: Under this bill could the employer change the job of the employee for objecting to vaccination?

Rep. Lang: Yes, as long as it is a reasonable change. The court would ultimately decide on what is a reasonable change.

Dave Juvet of the BIA testified that he originally was going to testify against this bill, as he felt this might complicate the ability of employers to work with mandates. After talking with Rep. Lang, we are neutral pending more discussion.

Kate Frey of New Futures testified in opposition to the bill. She testified that vaccines are an important part of the fight against COVID-19. She said that conscientious and philosophical exemptions would be too easy to get.

Rep. Hough asked Rep. Lang why clinical sites were included.

Rep. Lang: I was specifically asked by many people to include it. Many medical students need to do clinicals as part of their degree program. and the hospitals control the clinical sites and refused to grant exemptions.

Steve Ahnen of the NH Hospital Assoc. testified against the bill. He stated that the association's hospitals requirement of vaccine is for the health of their patients and employees. He stated that although people with the vaccine can end up in the hospital, they usually aren't as sick. The vast majority of hospital workers support the mandate.

Rep Turcotte: What percentage of hospital workers who have been vaccinated have gotten sick?

Steve Ahnen: I do not know.

Rep. Turcotte: Can you get us that data?

Steve Ahnen: I don't know if I can, but I do know the number is rising.

Rep. Hough: Do hospitals grant exemptions?

Steve Ahnen: Yes

Debby Scire from NH CUC testified against the bill. Vaccination guidelines have been in place long before COVID. This bill would disrupt the present system of granting exemptions.

Ed Groves testified in support of the bill. We keep hearing how safe this is. My 85-year-old father ended up in the hospital after getting the vaccine. You have a chance to make a statement to the rest of the country. We would be in trouble if we fired vaccinated people, but not for firing unvaccinated people. What a hypocrisy with regard to freedom.

Kate Horgan of the NH Assoc. Of Counties testified against the bill.

Rep. Turcotte: Is there any difference between the people with different exemptions?

Kate Horgoun: I can't answer that.

Rep. Maneval: Would employees be afraid to work if this bill resulted in more unvaccinated workers?

Kate Horgoun: I don't know.

Rep. Hough: If you don't do what the government asks will more people die?

Kate Horgoun That is a question for the federal government.

Laura Condon testified in support of the bill. This is a compromise bill. More than ever, we need to compromise. We cannot lose employees due to mandates. Exemptions don't change people's decisions. I'm surprised that any business would impose vaccinations on their employees as they would be liable for harm caused to their employees by the vaccine

*Shaun Thomas of NH nurses' association testified against the bill and submitted written testimony.

Rep. Turcotte By what percentage did the nurses approve this opposing this legislation?

Shaun Thomas: There was no vote.

Gary York testified in support of the bill. The conscientious exemption part of this bill is very important as many people are not eligible for a religious or medical exemption. I am concerned as to what a reasonable accommodation might be required by the employer. Reasonable is subjective. The idea that vaccinated people are safer to work with is untrue. They often show no symptoms when they are positive. Unvaccinated people usually show symptoms and can therefore know when they should not go to work and quarantine. Both my son and daughter who worked in healthcare were fired for refusing to be vaccinated.

Ken Eyring: Objectors to this bill keep saying the vaccines are effective. They are not. They are also not safe. Given those two things everyone should be eligible for an exemption. The doctor who worked on developing the MRNA technology said this should not be used without 5 years of testing. There are many other drugs that are effective and not nearly as dangerous such as Ivermectin. You heard that 90% of nurses in NH are vaccinated. What you didn't hear was now many were forced to be vaccinated on threat of losing their job.

Julie Smith presented a statement from Allison Dyer in support of this bill. Many in her family are in health care and public service and are under threat of losing their job if they don't take the vaccine. People need to be able to get exemptions from these mandates.

Russan Chester testified in support of the bill. The current vaccines still are not approved by the FDA. COVID-19 has forced us in NH to face the fact that we are being pressured by heavy-handed actions of the federal government. This bill will give employers the opportunity to allow the people of NH the freedom they deserve. We need to stand up to the federal government when they threaten us and treat us like children. She pointed out that the people opposing this bill are mostly paid lobbyists. She said a good friend of hers' son who was in the health field died two days after receiving a required booster this past Saturday.

Kendra Goodwin testified in favor of this bill. She knows of several people who have died shortly after receiving the vaccine or boosters one of which was an eight-month pregnant woman. We need to give people the opportunity for exemptions given all the deaths and injuries that have resulted from the mandates.

Julie Sims testified in favor of the bill. Her daughter in college is being discriminated against because she will not take the vaccine.

As a Registered Nurse working in home care in New Hampshire I strongly oppose this bill. In 2019, the American Nurses Association (ANA) updated its Position Statement on Vaccinations to reflect the following:

"ANA does not support any exemptions from immunization other than for medical contraindications. All requests for medical exemption from vaccination should be accompanied by documentation from the appropriate authority to support the request."

"Effective protection of the public health mandates that all individuals receive immunizations against vaccine-preventable diseases according to the best and most current evidence outlined by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP). ANA also believes that it is imperative for everyone to receive immunizations for vaccine-preventable diseases as vaccines are critical to infectious disease prevention and control."

This statement was further updated in November 2021 to include COVID-19 vaccination. "ANA strongly recommends that all registered nurses, health care workers and the public be vaccinated against COVID-19."

I have personal experience with family members who suffered death and physical impairment as a result of not being vaccinated. Two of father-in-law's siblings died in childhood due to Diphtheria, prior to the advent the vaccine to prevent this terrible disease. A sister-in-law suffered polio as a child and never walked again without a pronounced limp, and has been confined to a wheelchair in later live due to the ravages of this disease. Vaccines prevent disease they we do not usually experience in the US, but as the measles outbreaks of the past few years have demonstrated, when sufficient numbers of the general population remain unvaccinated these infections return and result in localize epidemic causing significant mortality and morbidity.

Dear Members of the House Labor, Industrial and Rehabilitative Services:

Thank you for your service to our State.

As a pediatrician who has practiced in our State for over 20 years, I strongly object to HB 1210. As proposed, this bill would require all private employers and colleges and universities to grant requests for a conscientious exemption from employees or students for all vaccines-essentially gutting any requirement.

Such a law would cause significant harm. Vaccines have and continue to be critical in limiting the harm of infectious diseases, and for some vaccines, this benefit is not just for the individual who receives the vaccine, but also for those around them.

For example, a child being treated for leukemia is at high risk for severe illness or death if exposed to chickenpox, which is readily spread via aerosols. As children are now required to be immunized or have documented immunity to chickenpox to attend school, chicken pox is now rare, and it is much safer for the child who is afflicted by leukemia at no fault of their own to attend school.

Vaccines for illnesses that do not pose risk to other students are not required for school attendance such as immunization against Hemophilus influenza or Streptococcus pneumoniae vaccines.

As a physician, I am required by my hospital to have immunity to several pathogens including measles, mumps, rubella, influenza and chickenpox so that I don't pass these viruses on to my patients. These are prudent requirements that protects others.

I understand the desire to not have others "tell us what to do", but government or rules have a role when conflicts of interest arise. John Stuart Mill wrote in his 1859 essay, "On Liberty" that a person should be left as free to pursue his own interests as long as doing so does not harm the interests of others. Gutting vaccine requirements harms others and infringes on their liberty.

Please vote "no" on HB 1210.

Remote Testimony in opposition to HB 1210 The Rev. Reed Loy, Hopkinton

Dear Members of the House,

Thank you for your public service on our behalf. I write in opposition to HB 1210.

CO Status:

I am familiar with the practice of conscientious objection. I have seen a terrific depth of faith, values and commitment expressed through this form of individual testimony, largely because CO status typically requires rigorous defense of one's position, and a demonstrated history of committed practice of the position. Additionally, CO status does not traditionally exempt one from the entire obligation being asked by the community; it instead offers alternative pathways to participation.

In terms of a vaccine mandate, which is a *Public* Health measure addressing a life and death confrontation with disease (US Covid-19 deaths are more than double US military deaths in World War II), I would expect COs to be required to make a rigorous defense indeed. Additionally, if they were granted CO status, I would expect alternative commitment to other responses that assist in public disease safety.

All Vaccines:

To allow CO status for *all* vaccines is demonstrably dangerous to public health. Even small populations of exempt persons, granted seemingly convincing religious exemptions, have imperiled their communities by declining vaccines. As a parent of school children, I would be angry to find that their classmates had been allowed to forego a medically sound, tried and true vaccination, placing all others at greater risk. Some freedoms we practice individually, some freedoms we practice together. Each type can require courage. Vaccines are one of the "communal courage freedoms".

On top of my specific thoughts on CO status and vaccines, I would add this about governance in general (and I certainly address this to members of all parties): I would personally prefer you to spend time in **creative** policy making, rather than making **speculative** laws like this one, which seek to pre-decide a public issue that hasn't even been allowed to unfold yet. There are plenty of clear, urgent perils to the people of NH to fill the day's work, without gaming out ahead of time the potential perils of laws and practices that are fundamentally sound.

I left my job as an RN in September 2021 due to the vaccine mandate at Dartmouth Hitchcock Medical Center (DHMC) rather than take an ineffective and dangerous Covid immunization.

Dear Chairperson Infantine and Members of the House Committee House Committee on Labor, Industrial and Rehabilitative Services:

American Atheists, on behalf of its constituents in New Hampshire, writes in opposition to HB 1210 and 1358, reckless legislation that will needlessly endanger the lives of New Hampshire residents. The nonmedical exemptions created by this legislation will harm efforts to control Covid-19 as well as other preventable diseases. Vaccination is a vital public health issue, and we support vaccination requirements based on public health and medical best practices for the benefit of everyone. In the midst of the Covid-19 pandemic, testing is a key tool in preventing large outbreaks in the workplace which may be especially disruptive to smaller businesses. We urge you to reject these dangerous bills.

American Atheists is a national civil rights organization that works to achieve religious equality for all Americans by protecting what Thomas Jefferson called the "wall of separation" between government and religion created by the First Amendment. We strive to create an environment where atheism and atheists are accepted as members of our nation's communities and where casual bigotry against our community is seen as abhorrent and unacceptable. We promote understanding of atheists through education, outreach, and community-building and work to end the stigma associated with being an atheist in America. As advocates for the health, safety, and well-being of all Americans, American Atheists objects to efforts to subordinate medical care to the religious beliefs of others.

Public health experts believe that no exception should be made to neutral immunization requirements intended to protect public health. Nonmedical exemptions are both unnecessary and dangerous from a medical and public health perspective. Non-essential exemptions to immunization requirements endanger everyone in order to accommodate the religious or philosophical beliefs of a few. Such exemptions are unacceptable from both a public health and

moral perspective. Successful population immunity to disease depends upon a significant level of vaccination, as high as 95% for some diseases. Because some people are unable to receive vaccination for medical reasons, it is therefore irresponsible and dangerous to allow for arbitrary compliance by the rest of the population.

Nonmedical exemptions put individuals at significant risk for contracting debilitating and deadly diseases. For example, children exempt from immunization requirements are more than 35 times more likely to contract measles² and nearly 6 times more likely to contract pertussis,³ compared to immunized children. History illustrates that outbreaks are often common in communities that are unsupportive of vaccinations. Measles is one vaccine-preventable disease that has plagued multiple religious communities known to be either hesitant to vaccinate or completely against vaccination.⁴

Requiring broad religious exemptions to Covid-19 vaccine requirements is no less a risk. This dangerous loophole threatens community health and economic growth alike. Businesses in New Hampshire and across the country have struggled to keep up with the shifting landscape created by the Covid-19 pandemic. HB 1210 deprives businesses of effectively using the single best tool for maintaining a workforce during these difficult times. Moreover, HB 1358 doubles down on the challenges posed to businesses by also requiring nonmedical exemptions to testing without any documentation. If both of these bills pass, New Hampshire workplaces will among the least equipped in the nation to prevent the spread of Covid-19 and the tremendous disruptions in productivity that accompany workplace outbreaks.

In addition to the public health risk and economic burdens, HB 1210 and 1358 create a special privilege for residents of New Hampshire who practice religion. At a time when nearly one in three Americans are religiously unaffiliated,⁵ these bills create a broad loophole that applies only to religious workers. In fact one in ten workers claims that they object to Covid-19 vaccines

based on their religious beliefs.⁶ However, it is difficult to believe that these objections are sincere when no major religious denomination opposes the vaccine, Covid-19 vaccines are substantially similar to other vaccines already obtained by objecting individuals, and a number of religious organizations are handing out exemptions letters in exchange for donations.⁷

Finally, we note that the broad religious exemptions created by this bill are not required by the US Constitution. A number of states, including California, Maine, Mississippi, New York, and West Virginia do not allow for these types of religious exemptions. As the US Supreme Court has made clear, "The right to practice religion freely does not include liberty to expose the community or child to communicable disease, or the latter to ill health or death." Recent circuit court decisions have specifically confirmed that Covid-19 vaccination mandates are not required to have religious exemptions, and these rulings have been left in place by the Supreme Court.

We strongly urge you to reject both HB 1210 and 1358, which would endanger public health by requiring nonmedical exemptions to vaccination and testing requirements during a pandemic. Testimony regarding HB1210, relative to exemptions from vaccine mandates.

House Committee on Labor

January 27, 2022

Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony on House Bill HB1210, directing a private employer, postsecondary institution, or clinical site for educational programs to accept requests from employees or students for exemptions from vaccine mandates. CCSNH has a number of concerns about the impact of this bill on the health and safety of our students.

First, to establish our assumptions related to this bill, it appears that HB1210 relates to any vaccine immunization, not just the COVID-19 vaccine.

While CCSNH colleges do not presently have a general requirement for standard immunizations, we do in specific circumstances. These include students who reside in college housing, allied health students whose program includes clinical placements and direct patient care, and students who participate in intercollegiate sports. This bill would prevent our colleges from exercising care that those populations of students come into their living and learning environments and activities with certain standard immunizations.

A second concern pertains to the effect of HB1210 on the clinical placements of our allied health students. Clinical placements are an essential, and required element in allied health programs. Our students are guests in the hospitals and other healthcare facilities where they train. Our colleges respect and adhere to the immunization requirements of those facilities. The facilities establish policies based on the imperatives of patient care and safety developed within the healthcare profession. We support our clinical partners in the conditions they have seen fit to establish. We are particularly concerned about the impact HB1210 could have on small healthcare facilities, particularly those in rural areas of the state, as Hb1210 could strain their capacity to manage clinical placements. This would hurt our ongoing efforts to increase the healthcare workforce.

The "conscientious objector" language in HB1210 appears to have no threshold to claim an exemption. Decades of medical science have firmly established the importance of an immunized population for public and individual health.

Re: Oppose HB 1210- Absolute, Automatic Religious Exemptions from Vaccination Requirements Are Unconstitutional

Dear Chair Infantine and Vice Chair Seaworth:

On behalf of the New Hampshire members and supporters of Americans United for Separation of Church and State, I write to express our opposition to HB 1210, which would require employers, postsecondary institutions, and clinical education sites to exempt any employee or student who objects from any vaccine requirement because of religious reasons. Federal law already protects the religious rights of employees. Furthermore, the First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution prohibits granting religious exemptions that give absolute deference to employee or student religious beliefs. I therefore urge you to vote HB 1210 inexpedient to legislate.

Federal Law Already Protect Employees' Religious Rights

Title VII of the Civil Rights Act¹ already protects the rights of employees to request religious accommodations. Title VII requires an employer to offer a reasonable accommodation for an employee's or applicant's sincerely held religious belief, observance, and practice, unless an accommodation would impose an "undue hardship" on the employer.²

Title VII allows for a constitutionally appropriate balance between the rights and obligations of the employer and the religious beliefs of the employee. In contrast, this bill requires employers to grant a religious exemption if it is requested. This means that an employer would not be able to consider the burdens, including potential increased costs,

that granting an exemption would pose on their business. For example, a nursing home could not consider whether it would have to hire a new employee to work with residents so that an employee who refuses to be vaccinated does not pose a danger to them.

Employers also have decades of experience applying the law to reasonably accommodate employees' religious practice. Moreover, the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission has released specific guidance regarding religious objections to workplace COVID-19 vaccination requirements. Under Title VII, employers "should assume that a request for religious accommodation is based on sincerely held religious beliefs." Employers can make "a limited factual inquiry or seek additional information" if they have an objective basis for questioning either the religious nature or sincerity of the belief.⁴

This bill, however, could prevent employers from conducting even a limited inquiry into the religious nature or sincerity of the employee's beliefs, like that authorized under Title VII, which is critical to truly protecting religious freedom. Granting accommodations without ensuring that the employee's religious beliefs are sincerely held could lead to abuse of the accommodation process and, ultimately, undermines the system of protections we have in place for religious beliefs and practice in our nation.

Absolute, Automatic Religious Exemptions Are Unconstitutional

Employers, postsecondary institutions, and clinical education sites would also be prohibited from considering the burden that granting all requested religious exemptions would have on the health of other employees or students. This means that fellow employees would face increased chances of exposure to disease, including COVID-19. And a postsecondary institution would still have to grant an exemption to a student even if their roommate is high risk for severe illness or death because of a preexisting medical condition.

The U.S. Constitution, however, prohibits the government from granting absolute, automatic religious exemptions.⁵ When crafting an exemption, the government "must take

The Free Exercise Clause only applies to burdens imposed by the *government*, and the subject of this bill is vaccination requirements imposed by *private* employers, postsecondary institutions, and clinical education sites. It is worth noting, however, that the Free Exercise Clause does not require the government to offer religious exemptions from its mandatory vaccination laws. *See e.g., Jacobson v. Massachusetts*, 197 U.S. 11, 26 (1905) (rejecting claims that a mandatory vaccination law violated individual liberties and that "[r]eal liberty for all could not exist under the operation of a principle which recognizes the right of each individual person to use his own [liberty], . . . regardless of the injury that may be done to others.); *Prince v. adequate account of the burdens" an accommodation places on nonbeneficiaries⁶ and ensure it is "measured so that it does not override other significant interests."⁷

For example, in *Estate of Thornton v. Caldor*, the Supreme Court, in an 8-1 opinion, struck down a Connecticut law granting employees "an absolute and unqualified right not to work on their Sabbath." In ruling that the law violated the Establishment Clause, the Court focused on the fact that the right not to work was granted "no matter what burden or inconvenience this imposes on the employer or fellow workers." The law provided "no exception," and no account of "the imposition of significant burdens." The "unyielding weighting in favor of Sabbath observers over all other interests contravenes a fundamental principle of the Religion Clauses," and was unconstitutional.

On the other hand, the religious accommodation provisions of Title VII are constitutional. In her concurring opinion in *Caldor*, Justice O'Connor explained that Title VII would pass constitutional muster because it "calls for reasonable rather than absolute accommodation." Indeed, "[u]nlike the Connecticut statute, Title VII does not require absolute deference to the religious practices of the employee, allows for consideration of the hardship to other employees and to the company, and permits an evaluation of whether the employer has attempted to accommodate the employee." 13

Like the bill struck down by the Court in *Caldor*, HB 1210 would give "absolute deference" to employees and students who request a religious exemption. This would put the health and safety of other people—including coworkers, patients, customers, staff, and fellow students—at risk, and impose unjustified burdens on employers, postsecondary institutions, and clinical education sites. Therefore, the bill violates the Constitution.

For these reasons, I urge you to vote HB 1210 inexpedient to legislate. Thank you for your consideration on this important matter.

Dear Representatives of the Labor, Industrial and Rehabilitative Services Committee,

I am writing to inform you of my support of HB1210: Relative to exemptions from vaccine mandates.

I have spent the last four years of my life, and invested close to \$20,000 in pursuing a degree in nursing. I began by taking pre-requisites, passing an entrance exam, applying to a nursing program, being waitlisted, and then actually becoming a nursing school student. I began my journey at Great Bay Community College in a Registered Nursing Program, but transferred to River Valley Community College into a Licensed Practical Nursing Program. I was accepted and transferred into River Valley as a third semester student. I was slated to begin that final semester this past fall, and would have graduated just a month ago.

When I transferred into the program, I was concerned about if students would have to be required to get the COVID-19 vaccine, in order to be allowed into the clinical sites. I was assured that there were no such requirements, and there weren't, up until a few days before the semester began. At that point, we were told by our instructor that we would be required to get the vaccine immediately in order to be allowed into the clinical site in just a few days. The instructor stalled things for a week or two. There were 9 students in my program, and 4 of us did not want to get the vaccine. (The other 3 complied, under duress). The instructor told me that she had no control over what the clinical site was requiring. I called Governor Sununu's Chief of Staff a few times inquiring about this, and was told that the hospital was a private business, and that the Governor had no influence over what they could do, but that the Governor would not be requiring college students at state schools to be vaccinated. I felt, in a round-about-way, that if the state could not provide me with a clinical experience in one of their programs, that the Governor, was in-fact, requiring students to be vaccinated.

I desperately wanted to complete my nursing education. I was hoping that if I could get through this final semester, and take my licensing exam, I would worry about any employee mandates later. My situation was a bit different compared to the other 3 students in my class that were vaccine hesitant. I was recently COVID-19 recovered, within weeks of the start of the semester. At that time, I inquired, and was told by my instructor, that the clinical site (Concord Hospital), would not be considering accommodations or exemptions from students. I could not accept that this was the end and I was being forced out of the program. I took it upon myself to contact human resources at the hospital, explained

my situation, and was told to submit for an exemption, but that there were no guarantees it would be approved. My instructor was not pleased that I had took the initiative on my own behalf to do that, but after I informed her that the hospital would consider it, she contacted them, and it was confirmed.

At the time, I believe protocol was to wait 90 days before getting a vaccine after COVID recovery. I obtained a medical exemption from my Naturopathic Doctor, requesting the 90 days. At that point we were a few days away from needing to be at the clinical site. My instructor told me that it was too late and that there was no way that if I submitted the paperwork that there would be enough time for it to be approved. Even if they did approve it, I would be required to get the vaccine when the 90 days was up. The 90 days fell a few weeks shy of the end of the semester, with just 2 days at the hospital. I begged my instructor to let me front load my clinical hours, or let me complete the last few days of clinical online. I was told that would put my meeting my graduation requirements in jeopardy, as defined by the New Hampshire State Board of Nursing. I had three agencies, the State of NH, the College, and the State Board, all saying different things.

Needless to say, I was told I was not welcome at the clinical site without the vaccination, or exemption. If I was absent from clinical, for any reason, it would be unexcused. An unexcused absence from clinical would result in an administrative failure. I could not risk having an administrative failure on my record because I would not be welcome to return to the program. It was here I realized there was no way I would be able to work around this, and I tried. I tried, hard. After some discord between myself and the Vice President of Academic Affairs, against my will, I was railroaded into succumbing to withdrawing from school. I insisted on, in writing, and received, a deferent for one year.

I hope that I am able to be able to return to school this fall and complete my education, but my education is being held hostage by a vaccination mandate. A mandate is not a law. It is a strong suggestion, and I am strongly resisting, based on my personal opinions. I am an 8 year Marine Corps Veteran. I have a high regard for my freedom. I am not against vaccinations. I am very much against mandates. If we continue with these vaccination mandates, we are no longer living in a free society. Some of the first material that was covered in nursing school was relative to informed consent. These vaccines do not allow for that. They are emergency use only. The only FDA approved vaccine, Comirnaty, is only available in Europe. Even if they were all fully FDA approved, we will not know for 75 years the data that is related to their safety tests. That is not informed consent. Informed consent is being told all of the risks and benefits. In addition, as medical care providers, one of the most important things we do for our patients is to be their advocate. If a patient needs a medical procedure, it is their right to deny

treatment. It is their right to have medical autonomy. Even if you think they are crazy for denying treatment, it is their right, and it is your job to put your personal biases aside, and support that patient's decision. It is unacceptable to deny healthcare workers this very right that they are expected to fight for their patients to have.

My experience is obviously based on education programs that require off-campus clinical sites, but, I am highly opposed to any college student, at state or private institutions, being required to get a vaccine in order to participate in the full college experience. We are on a slippery slope. If we lose our right to medical autonomy, we are no longer living in a free society. I never thought in my lifetime I would witness my freedoms being stripped away. Not in the United States. Not in the Live Free or Die State. Not in a million years. My kids; maybe. My grand-children; most likely. Please vote yes to pass this bill. Let us continue to live in the land of the free. Let us tell our grand-children what mandates were like, not what freedom was like.



Dear Chairman Infantine and Members of the House Labor, Industrial and Rehabilitative Services Committee:

Bi-State Primary Care Association and our members respectfully request HB 1210, relative to exemptions from vaccine mandates, be recommended inexpedient to legislate. Bi-State staff and our members will not attend legislative hearings due to the risk of COVID-19, and we thank you for the opportunity to submit written testimony to your committee electronically. Bi-State and our members write to you in strong opposition of HB 1210.

Bi-State Primary Care Association (Bi-State) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, formed by two health and social service leaders in 1986 to advance access to comprehensive primary care and preventive services for all, with special emphasis on those most in need in New Hampshire and Vermont. Today, Bi-State represents 28 member organizations across both states that provide comprehensive primary care services to over 300,000 patients at 146 locations. Our members include community health centers (CHCs), federally qualified health centers (FQHCs), rural health clinics (RHCs), area health education center programs, and Planned Parenthood of Northern New England. New Hampshire's 13 health centers serve approximately 112,000 patients at locations across the state, including in those districts represented by the members of the Labor, Industrial and Rehabilitative Services Committee.

Bi-State and our members oppose HB 1210 because it will eliminate Granite State employers', including health care organizations', ability to maintain safe workplaces and HB 1210 will needlessly endanger the health and welfare of patients.

Without a vaccine requirement in place, health care organizations are putting the health of their staff and their patients at grave risk, including children, who account for ~53% of COVID-19 cases in New Hampshire on January 26, 2022. The integrated services that health centers offer "all under one roof" include a wide range of pediatric services, family support programs, children's oral health, and childcare to the community. Pediatric patients make up ~25% of health centers' patient population, and many of these young patients are immunocompromised or too young to be vaccinated. Moreover, overall, a high proportion of health center patients are at

high risk of severe illness and hospitalization if they were to get infected with the virus, including pregnant mothers, patients who are experiencing homelessness, individuals with complex chronic illnesses such as diabetes and heart disease, and cancer patients.

In addition to the danger it poses for patients, Bi-State and our members oppose HB 1210 because they must comply with the federal law to operate and serve Granite Staters through Medicare, Medicaid, and state contracts.

On November 4, 2021, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) issued an Interim Final Rule with Comment Period (IFC) requiring that health care workers at Medicare and Medicaid-certified facilities – which include community health centers, federally qualified health centers, and rural health clinics – be vaccinated against COVID-19.² As of January 19, 2022, the CMS vaccine requirement is in effect in all 50 states, Washington D.C., and the territories; and its legal status is not expected to change. The IFC also requires health centers to have a detailed set of policies and procedures relating to the CMS vaccine rules and the rules. These policies and procedures must apply to students in training who are working at health care organizations. Students training to be health care professionals receive hands-on training that includes contact with high-risk patients, including children too young to be vaccinated. Both the Medicare and Medicaid statutes contain several provisions that authorize the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) to impose requirements necessary "in the interest of the health and safety of beneficiaries." CMS contends correctly that, under the Supremacy Clause of the U.S. Constitution, this IFC "preempts inconsistent State and local laws as applied to Medicare- and Medicaid-certified providers and suppliers."

If New Hampshire's community health centers were in violation of state statute, they could be forced to shut the doors to the more than 112,000 Granite Staters who rely upon them for their primary care, substance use disorder treatment, mental health services, and pediatric care.

New Hampshire is suffering from not only our highest numbers of COVID-19 infections, hospitalizations, and deaths, but also extraordinary staffing shortages that are impacting all residents and their ability to access primary and emergency care. Staffing shortages at CHCs are *not* due to vaccine requirements; ~5% of their workforce is currently out sick due solely to illness from COVID-19. This does not include their health care staff who are unable to go to work because they are at home caring for a sick child, nor does it illustrate the incredible strain that working at reduced workforce capacity puts on the rest of their staff.

For these reasons and more, Bi-State Primary Care Association and our members respectfully request the Committee recommend HB 1210 be inexpedient to legislate.

Dear Chairperson Infantine and Members of the House Labor, Industrial and Rehabilitation Services:

I am providing written testimony today in opposition to HB1210

This bill directs a private employer, postsecondary institution, or clinical site for educational programs to accept requests from employees or students for exemptions from vaccine mandates. The bill also prohibits an employer from requiring any medical treatment that has been approved by the Food and Drug Administration only for emergency or experimental use.

I've been an RN for 30 years and I am shocked at the negative and unrealistic reactions from the public on aspects of this pandemic. Many of the bills set forth are in reflection to the emotional response to the scientific efforts to save lives. If we had not warranted Covid vaccines for emergency use, we would have had vastly more deaths. The testing of the vaccines for safety and efficacy was still conducted and just sped up to meet the urgency.

In healthcare we have had medical and religious exemptions for vaccines and will continue to do so. The section I most disagree with in this bill is the "conscientious objector" exemption. The Miriam Webster definition of "conscientious objector" is a person who refuses to serve in the armed forces or bear arms on moral or religious grounds. Since we already have medical and religious exemptions, this is redundant and just gives anyone the opportunity to say no and the employer must comply. That is a disservice to our patients and other employees.

Pub Med has an excellent article explaining the differences and considerations in relation to vaccine mandates and conscientious objector exemptions.

Conscientious Objection to Vaccination - PubMed (nih.gov)

Being involved in patient care, our patients expect their healthcare workers to be vaccinated and to keep them safe, especially those who are immunocompromised. We care for cancer patients, auto-immune patients and with multiple co-morbidities. Herd immunity is key to helping us get out of the worst of this pandemic. Covid will not go away, just as the flu has not completely gone away. We learn to live with it, stay away from others who are sick, and get our yearly flu vaccine. I have been directly involved in oversight of Covid testing and vaccine clinics for the past 2 years. I would like to note that we have seen an increase in first dose vaccine requests.

I personally have a brother who had 2 vaccines and before he got his booster, he contracted Covid. He has a severe lung disease and if he had not been vaccinated, he would have been in the hospital, on a ventilator and most likely died. He had the monoclonal antibodies and is doing much better. I am grateful for the vaccine that has saved so many lives. In the hospital the majority of Covid patients are the unvaccinated. Our healthcare workforce is exhausted. I don't understand why people who refuse the vaccine because they don't trust science still come to the hospital. You either trust us or you don't.

I do not support this bill.

Dear Chairman Infantine,

On behalf of the American Cancer Society Cancer Action Network (ACS CAN), thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony in opposition to HB 1210, an act relative to exemptions from vaccine mandates, and HB 1351, an act prohibiting certain employers from requiring a COVID-19 vaccination as a condition of employment, as we believe both pieces of legislation could place the health of cancer patients at greater risk.

ACS CAN represents millions of patients and cancer survivors and their families nationwide, including the 9560 Granite staters who will be diagnosed with cancer this year. Many cancer patients and their families have been hard hit by the COVID-19 pandemic which has placed cancer patients at substantial risk for severe illness. Cancer treatments – from chemotherapy to immunotherapy to bone marrow transplants – often weaken a patient's immune system, making cancer patients especially vulnerable to communicable illnesses like COVID-19. A survey of cancer patients and survivors last summer found that two-thirds of patients, and many caregivers, were worried about protecting their health from COVID-19. Those worries, combined with disruptions in health care services, have led many cancer patients to delay or forego treatment.

Fortunately, the availability of a COVID-19 vaccine will mean many cancer patients can be protected from the virus and resume their normal treatments safely. But we don't yet know how effective vaccines may be in people being treated for cancer. It is possible that cancer patients – or others with weakened immune systems – may not be fully protected even if they are vaccinated. A recent study from the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society found that one in four blood cancer patients fail to produce detectable antibodies after COVID-19 vaccination. This makes it even more critical that as many healthy people as possible are fully vaccinated in order to protect those who are unable to be vaccinated or for whom the vaccine may be less effective.

The health and safety of people with cancer as well as our staff is our top priority. In order to protect our constituents who are at high risk for the most serious outcomes from COVID-19, the American Cancer Society and ACS CAN are requiring vaccines for all staff, as well as volunteers who interact with cancer patients in our Road to Recovery patient transportation program. Vague and subjective

exemptions from vaccine requirements, like those in HB 1210 and HB 1351, would undermine our ability to protect our constituents who are already facing a life-threatening illness.

The provisions in both HB 1210 and HB 1351 would slow, perhaps even prevent, the protection of cancer patients, even where it is needed most – in health care settings. We urge this committee to reject this legislation.

Testimony in Opposition to HB 1210 re: exemptions from vaccine mandates

Mr. Chairman and members of the Committee. I am Gina Balkus, CEO of the Granite State Home Health & Hospice Association. The Association advocates on behalf of home care, hospice and palliative care providers and the people they serve. We are opposed to HB 1210 because it weakens an employer's ability to enforce important infection control policies they choose to implement.

Home care and hospice agencies were founded on a public health model that focuses on preventing disease and promoting wellness. The health and safety of our employees, patients, clients, and communities are essential parts of our work. We support proven public health strategies to protect those we employ and serve. We oppose regulatory or legislative efforts to limit our ability as organizations to implement public health policies and practices. We also oppose efforts that weaken state regulations or laws related to public health and the common good.

HB 1210 would not prevent employers from having a vaccine mandate policy, such as for flu vaccine or COVID vaccine. However, it would require employers to have exemption policies that are so weak that any vaccine mandate would be useless. A simple written statement would enable an employee to opt out of the mandate.

There is no need for this bill. The federal Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and workplace anti-discrimination laws already require employers to offer exemptions for medical reasons and sincerely held religious beliefs. We encourage agencies to refer to the <u>US Equal Employment Opportunity Commissions guidance on COVID-19</u>. Employers are allowed to request documentation for exemption requests.

HB 1210 introduces a "conscientious objection" exemption. This is an overly broad reason that can mean anything and will essentially take the teeth out of any vaccine mandate policy. The New Hampshire Legislature has rejected conscientious objection exemption clauses in the past. Medicare-certified home care and hospice agencies would be unable to comply with such an exemption because it conflicts with the federal CMS Vaccine Mandate. These agencies must follow federal regulations or face loss of certification..

Health care employers adopt infection control mandates to protect employees, vulnerable patients, and the communities they serve. HB 1210 will weaken those employment policies and proven strategies to safeguard the common good. Home care and hospice agencies urge you to recommend HB 1210 as inexpedient to legislate. Please contact me if you have questions.

I am submitting this testimony in writing rather than in person because of the risk of my acquiring Covid19 if I were to come into the State House and testify.

House Bill 1210 seeks to address a fundamental question that has challenged each generation of Americans since our country's founding: how do we understand and legislate the relationship between the freedom and individual rights of each citizen with the duties and responsibilities each of us bears to respect and care for the welfare of all other citizens and the common good.

I believe hb1210, by allowing a citizen to refuse a mandated vaccine based on conscientious objection, rather than the traditional exemptions of medical contraindication and religious belief, is an extreme and dangerous change in our laws that would cause a high likelihood of the loss of herd immunity against previously rampant viral infections such as mumps, measles, polio and other types of infections and hamstring our current and future response to pandemics. Early in my thirty-five years of practicing family medicine in Concord, I welcomed several families into my practice who were leery of giving mandated vaccine to their babies. I spent considerable time speaking with the new parents about the value and safety of the recommended vaccines and the risk to their child and to other children and adults if their infant remained unvaccinated. The fact that these vaccines were required by most daycares and schools led all of these families to eventually accept the mandated vaccines as an essential part of their child's health care. I can only imagine the social and public health chaos that would be created if numerous families, persuaded by vaccine misinformation and a denial of the value of basic medical science and public health, were to be able to easily refuse mandated immunizations due to the proposals in HB1210.

During most of my medical career, I spent several hours per week working as the Medical Director of three of the largest nursing homes in Concord. I saw first hand the dedication of licensed nurses' aides, nurses, rehabilitation and nutritional professionals, administrators and support staff as they worked to provide comfort and support to

the vulnerable residents under their care. HB 1210 would deny nursing home leaders the authority and responsibility to determine whether a particular vaccine should be mandated for all employees in order to protect the welfare of the residents and fellow caregivers. I believe such a denial of employer authority and responsibility would cause serious harm to nursing home residents and to the function and morale of the nursing home workforce.

In conclusion, there is no escaping the ongoing work our democracy requires of us, to debate and legislate a just, fair and science-based balance, between the freedom and rights of the individual American and the obligations each of us has towards our fellow citizens and the public's health. HB1210 is an extreme piece of legislation that emphasizes individual rights at the expense of basic employer rights and public health standards. Please vote this bill Inexpedient to Legislate.

At The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society, our mission is to cure leukemia, lymphoma, Hodgkin's disease and myeloma, and improve the quality of life of patients and their families. LLS exists to find cures and ensure access to treatments for blood cancer patients.

We know patients are at increased risk of serious illness and death from COVID-19. LLS' own research shows that as many as 1 in 4 blood cancer patients may not be able to mount the same robust antibody response as healthy individuals after being vaccinated against COVID-19, making it even more important for those around them to be vaccinated¹.

Further, higher vaccination rates mean lower hospitalization rates. Good Morning!

Thank you for the opportunity to speak regarding HB 1210, relative to exemptions from vaccine mandates.

I am Deborah Scire, President of the New Hampshire College and University Council.

The NHCUC is a non-profit consortium of public and private institutions of higher education in the state. These institutions are recognized and highly regarded for their outstanding teaching, research, and community service activities. They serve as major centers of activity that are vital to the economic development of the community and the state.

I speak in opposition to House Bill 1210, as it would eliminate the colleges and university's ability to follow the current guidelines established by the American College Health Association which includes required vaccinations like Meningitis, MMR etc. These guidelines have been in place long before COVID and provide our campuses with standards based on established public health principles.

Our colleges have successful processes in place that allow students to request exemptions of vaccines for documented medical reasons or religious beliefs.

Our universities have a long and positive history of managing exemptions from vaccines.

HB 1210 will disrupt the successful practice that is currently in place that could jeopardize the health of the campus community.

Thank you for your time today and I am happy to try and answer any of your questions.

Employers should not be prohibited from requiring COVID19 vaccination. There is increasing pressure to expand existing vaccine exemptions for religious and medical reasons to include those for conscientious objections and natural immunity. Current exemptions are those considered by the CDC and other medical professional groups as "contraindications". Individual companies and other institutions can determine the exemptions they allow, and like many schools, leave the decision up to a medical provider. To date the only clear contraindication is "anaphylaxis" also known as a severe allergic reaction. The number of confirmed allergic reactions is very small 2-5 per million cases. In rare cases a condition called myocarditis has resulted from vaccination but this is a self-limiting condition and the CDC recommends that when symptoms resolve it may safe to continue with the vaccine series. There is also recent evidence that suggests that individuals who are immunocompromised may in fact benefit from the vaccine to strengthen their weakened immune response.

Current limits on religious and medical exemptions have long standing success in maintaining the integrity of immunization science as evidenced by the near nonexistence of vaccine preventable diseases such as measles, mumps, rubella and polio. Prior to the COVID 19 pandemic there was a heightened level of concern related to vaccines including the common myth that vaccines "cause autism." Vaccination was introduced in this country in the early 1800's beginning with smallpox leading to its near eradication until the 1850s when increased misinformation led to decreased vaccine use and reoccurrence of small pox by the 1870s. We know that outbreaks of vaccine-preventable disease often start among persons who refuse vaccination, spread rapidly within unvaccinated populations, and also spread to other subpopulations. We should learn from history and not fall into the same traps of skepticism that have endangered the public's health in earlier times. Vaccine mandates are not new. By the 1950's all 50 states had vaccine mandates for school entry while allowing for limited medical and religious exemptions.

Vaccine refusal by exemption increases the health risk of the individual and health risks to the community. We have made substantial gains and confidence in the science around the COVID 19 pandemic including the body of evidence around vaccines. Rather than expanding exemptions we should be expanding education and information to increase public confidence to influence decision making.

The New Hampshire Nurses Association urges you to oppose HB 1210 and continue to allow employers the right to establish requirements for their own employees to protect the health and safety of those same individuals and all who utilize their services.

Dear Chairperson Infantine and Members of the House Labor, Industrial and Rehabilitative Services Committee:

I am providing this verbal and written testimony today on behalf of the NH Nurses Association in opposition to HB 1210 an act relative to exemptions from vaccine mandates.

This bill:

- directs a private employer, postsecondary institution, or clinical site for educational programs to accept requests from employees or students for exemptions from vaccine mandates.
- prohibits an employer from requiring any medical treatment that has been approved by the Food and Drug Administration only for emergency or experimental use.

Historically, employers and educational institutions have had the right to establish requirements for their employee/students to protect the health and safety of those same individuals and all who utilize their services. The Covid-19 pandemic has exacerbated conflicting beliefs re: individual freedom and public health and safety. While this debate rages on trends in Covid-19 cases have reached an all-time high, with a 7-day moving average of 2,733 (for week ending 1/14/22). The majority of hospitalized patients are unvaccinated. (NH Hospital Assoc, 1/6/22). Hospital resources are strained with caring for Covid-19 patients, delaying care for patients with other conditions (NH Bulletin, 1/5/22).

With the pandemic still raging, further restricting the use of proven interventions such as vaccinations, which are being referenced in this bill as for "emergency or experimental use", to decrease the spread of Covid-19 will prolong the pandemic and result in continuing strain on healthcare resources and preventable illness and death. The Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine has recently received FDA approval and the current CDC recommendations include that anyone >5 yrs. get vaccinated and those eligible be boosted. In a 12/30/21 Amicus Brief From American Public Health Association, Association Of Schools And Programs Of Public Health, 12 Leading Public Health And Health Care Organizations, 30 Deans Of Leading Academic Programs, And 109 Leading Public Health And Health Policy Scholars states

"The science is also clear about the best way to combat COVID-19's spread—vaccines. All the evidence shows that vaccination significantly reduces the likelihood that workers will transmit COVID-19 and infect other workers, especially when combined with regular testing and other mitigation measures. And vaccination drastically reduces the chance of hospitalization and death. For these reasons, numerous employers have already imposed vaccine requirements, which have engendered widespread vaccination uptake and have consistently proven effective."

A vaccination mandate should be job-related and consistent with business necessity. Under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), an employer can have a workplace policy that includes "a requirement that an individual shall not pose a direct threat to the health or safety of individuals in the workplace." This consistent with the OSHA general duty clause that requires employers to provide a work environment that is "free from recognized hazards that are causing or are likely to cause death or serious physical harm."

that. The vaccines approved for use in the United States are safe and highly effective in preventing infection, serious illness, hospitalization and death. Studies have shown that unvaccinated individuals are at a 5-fold higher risk of infection from COVID-19, 10-fold higher risk of hospitalization from COVID-19, and 11-fold higher risk of dying from COVID-19. A recent CDC study showed that receipt of a third vaccine dose was highly effective during both the delta- and omicron-predominant periods at preventing COVID-19-associated emergency department and urgent care visits (94% and 82%, respectively) and preventing COVID-19-associated hospitalizations (94% and 90%, respectively).

Requiring vaccinations of healthcare workers from communicable diseases is not new for hospitals in New Hampshire. Hospitals have required vaccination against several communicable and deadly diseases such as mumps, measles, rubella, chicken pox, diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis and influenza as a condition of employment, with the same type of medical and religious exemptions allowed for COVID-19 vaccines. We believe this is absolutely the right thing to do for the health and safety of our patients, our staff and the citizens of New Hampshire. The vast majority of hospital staff have been vaccinated against COVID-19 or have received exemptions, and we've heard from many healthcare workers who support the vaccine requirement to protect their health and that of their patients.

Again, the New Hampshire Hospital Association is opposed to HB 1210 and urge the Committee to find it inexpedient to legislate. Thank you for the opportunity to share our view with you.

Testimony

Good morning, Mr. Chairman and members of the committee. My name is Steve Ahnen, President of the New Hampshire Hospital Association (NHHA), representing all 26 of the state's community hospitals as well as all specialty hospitals.

The New Hampshire Hospital Association is opposed to HB 1210. This legislation would prevent private employers from requiring vaccines of their employees as a condition of employment without offering exemptions for medical, religious or conscientious objections. HB 1210 would also prevent hospitals that provide clinical rotations for training of a wide variety of clinicians from requiring that those students adhere to the evidence-based policies and protocols that they have established for the health and safety of their patients, workforce and students who are training there. HB 1210 would essentially render moot any requirements that an employer has determined are in the best interests of those they serve by simply saying no to the vaccine requirement on the grounds of a conscientious objection declaration.

The New Hampshire Hospital Association and its member hospitals announced in August of last year a consensus statement in support of requiring our health care workforce to be vaccinated against COVID-19 in order to protect the health and safety of our patients, our staff and our communities. Hospitals have announced their own individual policies and have been implementing them with robust education for their staff about the important benefits of the vaccine. In doing so, hospitals have sought to be flexible and have complied with all relevant state and federal guidelines, including offering medical and religious exemptions.

Hospitals and the tens of thousands of dedicated health care workers who come to work in them every day have been on the front lines of the pandemic for almost two years. The decision to require their employees to be vaccinated against COVID-19 was done to ensure the health and safety of their patients, their workforce and their communities. They have seen first-hand the devastation that COVID-19 can have on their patients, especially those who are unvaccinated. While we have seen more breakthrough cases impacting those who have been vaccinated who are hospitalized, those on the front lines tell us over and over that the patients who are the most severely ill, intubated and in the intensive care unit are those who are unvaccinated.

Hospitals have an inherent responsibility to protect the health and safety of their patients who, by their very nature, are very ill and the COVID-19 vaccine is the most effective way we can do

Testimony of Tom Cronin, Director of Government Relations, UNH/USNH

The University System of New Hampshire does have a policy on required immunizations for students at our residential campuses. These policies, established prior to the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, include the MMR, meningitis, TDAP and chicken pox vaccines. Our policy was developed in accordance with guidance from the American College Health Association and provides a baseline level of required immunization for our campuses where thousands of students live in close proximity. Students have the opportunity to opt-out of these requirements for documented medical reason or sincerely held religious beliefs.

We oppose HB 1210, relative to exemptions from vaccine mandates, because it would require an incredibly low bar for exemptions for all of these vaccinations and undermine the public health of our residential campuses.

Additionally, the proposed legislation specifically calls out "clinical sites for educational programs" and subjects those locations to these same exemption requirements. We are concerned that if this legislation would lead to clinical sites being required to permit different vaccination and public health requirements for our students than they do other employees that it will lead to a further reduction of the already limited number of clinical placements available to our students. These partner sites establish policies based on the needs of their patients, workforces, and unique environments. Our institutions respect those decisions and require our students to abide by those polices. We expect that if our partners are forced to accept different rules as a condition of working with us on these initiatives that we may see fewer sites willing to partner with us, leading to a reduction in the training opportunities our students require to enter their chosen fields.

As drafted, the mandatory exemption allowances of HB 1210 are so broad as to invalidate any effort at optimizing the safety and health of our residential communities from extremely contagious, vaccine preventable diseases. The bill may also create a bottleneck for the next generation of the state's health care workforce. For these reasons we urge the committee to recommend HB 1210 be inexpedient to legislate.

The Department is highly concerned, as if passed HB1210, would ease vaccine requirements for students entering clinical sites and employees working in private health care systems. Reduced rates of vaccination as a result of this bill will unnecessarily threaten the health and safety of individuals working and receiving care in these settings.

The Department is also in opposition to HB 1210 as the language of this bill equates emergency use authorization with experimentation, which is inaccurate. Before the FDA can issue Emergency Use Authorization, the US Health and Human Services Secretary must declare circumstances exist to justify the authorization, which include a public health emergency. In the case of COVID-19 vaccine, three phases of clinical trials were conducted and reviewed for quality, safety and effectiveness before the FDA granted emergency use authorization. That process for emergency use authorization did not cut corners on safety, rather it enabled people to receive the clinically proven protection as soon as it was deemed safe to do so. Hundreds of millions of people in the U.S. alone have received either a COVID-19 vaccine which have undergone the most intensive safety monitoring systems in U.S. history.

The Department's goals, through immunization policy, are to provide public health protection while also appropriately balancing individual choice. Relaxing requirements for immunization will lead to preventable disability and death and result in significant harm to our population. As such, the Department strongly opposes HB 1210.

Immunization is considered one of the most important public health achievements of the last century. Safe and effective immunizations have prevented millions of illnesses, disabilities, and deaths in the United States. Despite this success, vaccine-preventable diseases, such as measles, mumps, whooping cough, and now COVID-19 continue to circulate and result in preventable hospitalizations and deaths every year. Vaccine coverage is not 100% nor are vaccines 100% effective so outbreaks can occur when an unvaccinated person becomes infected and introduces the disease into a community, especially one with low vaccination rates. It is therefore critical that certain requirements for immunization remain in place, such as those that pertain to employment in healthcare settings and those for school and child care entry.

The Department is in opposition to HB 1210 as this bill seeks to direct a private employer, postsecondary institution, or clinical site for educational programs to accept requests from employees or students for exemptions from vaccine mandates on the basis of medical, religious or conscientious objection. As the number of exemptions increases, the risk of vaccine-preventable disease has been found to increase. Currently, the Department's immunization requirements allow for exemptions for medical and religious reasons. The Department is in opposition of the addition of conscientious objection that is, for religious, moral, or philosophical reasons as religious exemptions are already allowable and as expansion of exemptions to include moral or philosophical reasons will decrease vaccination rates placing New Hampshire's most vulnerable residents at increased risk of severe illness and death. This is especially true in healthcare and clinical settings in which employees work directly with individuals with compromised health conditions.

Each year the Department investigates on average 50 outbreaks of influenza each year in New Hampshire, many of which occur in long-term care facilities. We find that many of the facilities with outbreaks have low healthcare personnel influenza vaccination rates. Vaccination of healthcare workers is therefore a critical strategy to prevent introduction of influenza virus into these facilities, where influenza easily spreads resulting in hospitalizations and deaths. Intentionally unvaccinated individuals make up large proportions of cases in outbreaks of disease and they can unwittingly be the starting point of epidemics that may take hold in populations with relatively high vaccination rates. As such, many healthcare facilities require employee vaccination to protect the lives of these very vulnerable patients.

Dear Honorable Representatives,

I am the chairman of the Liberty Defense Fund of New Hampshire, a 501(c)(3) legal advocacy nonprofit organization. Over the past five months our organization has assisted approximately 60 individuals to submit requests for religious accommodation under Title VII of the federal Civil Rights Act of 1964.

This experience has given us a broad view into the religious exemption process at many New Hampshire employers. This bill is necessary because currently it is far too easy for employers who wish to limit or deny exemptions to do so by manipulating the exemption process and their employee's understanding of their rights. Employers, with the assistance of employment law specialists, are quite savvy in their understanding of what constitutes a legally sufficient request for accommodation. Employees are not. Hence this bill is necessary to level the playing field.

There are many ways an employer can exert control of the exemption process to the detriment of employees, but for the sake of brevity I will mention two that are common. First, while an employer may not judge the validity of an employees religious beliefs, an employer may determine whether an employee's stated beliefs compel him or her the refuse an injection. Therefore, a legally sufficient request under Title VII should include a comprehensive description of the employee's religious beliefs and how those beliefs compel the employee to refuse an mRNA injection. In addition, the request should contain a description of how the employee has integrated these beliefs into their daily life, so as to demonstrate the employee's sincerity. Employers often provide simple paper or online forms that leave insufficient space for this information. Furthermore, some employers have refused to accept supplemental submissions outside of online forms, putting employees at a legal disadvantage should the employer deny the request for accommodation.

The second way that employers manipulate the process is by requesting, and indeed suggesting that that it is legally necessary for the employee to provide, a so-called clergy letter supporting the request for accommodation. While many religious leaders are happy to provide such a document, under federal law it is not necessary for a legally cognizable request under Title VII. Indeed, under federal law, it is not necessary for an employee to be part of a religious community at all. However, without the assistance of counsel employees do not understand this. This bill would fix these and many other problems in the current exemption process in the State of New Hampshire.



My husband is a steelworker here in New Hampshire. With the threat of a workplace mandate, he and I prepared to submit a request for a religious exemption.

We were already familiar with the form that one would use for children attending school, but knew that wouldn't be an option. There isn't an established form that exists for adults to use in the workplace.

We began to educate ourselves about what we would need to do instead. We learned that an employee is typically expected to submit a personal letter stating their religious beliefs, and that it could be denied if the employer doubted their sincerity. We were told that this letter should be at least five pages in length to increase our chances of approval.

We are normally a very private family and this felt like an incredible invasion of privacy, but what choice did he have? If he wrote too little would he be accused of not being "religious enough?" His letter turned out to be eight pages. His HR representative knows more about him now than our own pastor.

There needs to be a better process. People should not be expected or required to divulge such personal information to their employer in order to keep their job. Please, fix this.

I urge you to vote HB1210 as 'ought to pass.'

Hi Rep. Turcotte,

There actually was polling, but not in the usual sense that I can provide a percentage. NHNA's "opposed" position was not a decision made by the BOD. Instead, it was made by 120 member and non-member nurses participating in NHNA's Legislative Town Hall Forum (LTHF). NHNA uses a comprehensive inclusive process for determining priority legislative issues and positions, which involves all interested members, and even non-member nurses. NHNA's Commission on Government Affairs together with other members break out into Legislative Action Committees, which, over several meetings, give careful consideration to bills of possible interest to nurses and/or promoting health generally. The Legislative Action Committees present these findings to the larger group attending the LTHF, which, by anonymous survey, determines and ranks all NHNA's priority issues. NHNA invites all members and any non-member nurses subscribing to the email list to participate in the LTHF, and any participating nurse can present any bill or position. None of the 120 participating nurses suggested a position other than "opposed" on HB1210, or HB1351. Instead, after the survey results were compiled, the LTHF ranked opposing HB1210 and HB1351 among NHNA's highest priorities. The BOD itself was not involved in the decision-making process except as individual participants in the LTHF. The reason behind this position like with many of the issues nurses care about most, is patient health and safety. In case of communicable diseases like COVID-19, especially in healthcare settings, workplace health and safety is inextricably linked to patient health and safety.

Dear Mr. Chairman and Members of the House Labor Committee,

We understand this week you may vote on HB1210, directing a private employer, postsecondary institution, or clinical site for educational programs to accept requests from employees or students for exemptions from vaccine mandates. CCSNH has a number of concerns about the impact of this bill on the health and safety of our students, and about the impact on our access to clinical sites for students in nursing and other healthcare programs.

It appears that HB1210 relates to any vaccine/immunization, not just the COVID-19 vaccine. While CCSNH colleges do not presently have a general requirement that all students have standard immunizations, we do require it for specific populations of students. These include students who reside in college housing, health program students whose program includes clinical placements and direct patient care, and students who participate in intercollegiate sports. *This bill would prevent our colleges from exercising care that those populations of students come into their living and learning environments and activities with certain standard immunizations.*

A second concern pertains to the effect of HB1210 on the clinical placements of our allied health students. Clinical placements are an essential, and required element in allied health programs. Clinical placements are not simply occasional tours or "walk-throughs" of hospitals. During clinical, students are working alongside nurses and other providers and engaged directly in patient care. Our students are guests in the hospitals and other healthcare facilities where they train. Our colleges respect and adhere to the immunization requirements of those facilities. The facilities establish policies based on the imperatives of patient care and safety developed within the healthcare profession. We support our clinical partners in the conditions they have established to safeguard patient and provider health. We are particularly concerned about the impact HB1210 could have on small healthcare facilities, particularly those in rural areas of the state, as HB1210 could strain their capacity to manage clinical placements. This would hurt our ongoing efforts to increase the healthcare workforce in New Hampshire.

Finally, the "conscientious objector" language in HB1210 appears to have no threshold to claim an exemption. Decades of medical science have firmly established the importance of an immunized population for public and individual health.

Thank you very much for your consideration of these concerns, and thank you for your service as an elected representative in New Hampshire.

Dear Chairman Infantine and Members of the House Labor, Industrial and Rehabilitative Services Committee:

Bi-State Primary Care Association and our members respectfully request HB 1210, relative to exemptions from vaccine mandates, be recommended inexpedient to legislate. Bi-State staff and our members will not attend legislative hearings due to the risk of COVID-19, and we thank you for the opportunity to submit written testimony to your committee electronically. Bi-State and our members write to you in strong opposition of HB 1210.

Bi-State Primary Care Association (Bi-State) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, formed by two health and social service leaders in 1986 to advance access to comprehensive primary care and preventive services for all, with special emphasis on those most in need in New Hampshire and Vermont. Today, Bi-State represents 28 member organizations across both states that provide comprehensive primary care services to over 300,000 patients at 146 locations. Our members include community health centers (CHCs), federally qualified health centers (FQHCs), rural health clinics (RHCs), area health education center programs, and Planned Parenthood of Northern New England. New Hampshire's 13 health centers serve approximately 112,000 patients at locations across the state, including in those districts represented by the members of the Labor, Industrial and Rehabilitative Services Committee.

Bi-State and our members oppose HB 1210 because it will eliminate Granite State employers', including health care organizations', ability to maintain safe workplaces and HB 1210 will needlessly endanger the health and welfare of patients.

Without a vaccine requirement in place, health care organizations are putting the health of their staff and their patients at grave risk, including children, who account for ~53% of COVID-19 cases in New Hampshire on January 26, 2022. The integrated services that health centers offer "all under one roof" include a wide range of pediatric services, family support programs, children's oral health, and childcare to the community. Pediatric patients make up ~25% of health centers' patient population, and many of these young patients are immunocompromised or too young to be vaccinated. Moreover, overall, a high proportion of health center patients are at

Dear Representative:

I am writing to you to express the Business & Industry's opposition to HB 1210. At the time of the public hearing, I testified that BIA was neutral pending discussions between us and the Prime Sponsor of the legislation, Representative Lang, regarding whether the language of his bill (and amendment) would create a conflict for those employers under federal vaccine mandate requirements.

Representative Lang believes it does not create a conflict. However, following our discussion with Representative Lang (which also included employment attorneys who are experts on federal and state employment law), it became clear that we respectfully disagree.

The points our employment attorneys made are:

The federal law concept of "conscientious objection" is principally embodied in the Military Selective Service Act. It provides an exemption from engaging in wartime activities and service in the military for individuals who have a "firm, fixed, and sincere objection to participation in war in any form or the bearing of arms, by reason of religious training and/or belief." I am not aware of any other body of federal law that addresses the specific term "conscientious objection" outside of the right to object to participation in wartime and military activities.

The term "conscientious objection" also is sometimes loosely used to describe rights that certain health care systems and providers (who receive federal funds) who refuse to perform certain medical procedures, such as abortions, forced sterilizations, assisted suicide, etc. However, I am not aware that those federal laws or regulations define that as "conscientious objection," though the term "conscience" is sometimes used. Rather, BIA believes that those rights flow largely from religious rights under the First Amendment.

The closest federal law we could find to this situation is 8 U.S.C. section 1182(g)(2)(C). That statute permits the U.S. Attorney General to waive the requirement that an alien have obtained certain vaccines in order to receive a visa or be admitted to the country if "the requirement of such vaccination would be contrary to the alien's religious belief or moral convictions." However, that federal law does not use the term "conscientious objection." Moreover, that law distinguishes between "religious belief" and "moral convictions" as different concepts and different bases for a vaccination waiver.

This has led BIA to believe that the overwhelming weight of federal law identifies the concept of "conscientious objection" as applying only to military service. Moreover, even if the federal law right to object based on conscience does extend beyond that context, that concept would be defined to include specific aspect of conscience, such as religious belief and moral convictions. The fact that the federal

Vaccinations protect individuals and the community from the risk of severe illness and have essentially eradicated deadly diseases. They also protect those who can't get vaccinated, including infants, or people with weakened immune systems. The COVID-19 vaccine has played a significant role in changing the course of this pandemic. Time and time again, public health experts have said that widespread vaccination, including booster shots, is the best way to lessen the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic and ultimately build herd immunity. Based on that public health science and advice from medical experts, some employers, postsecondary institutions, and other entities have made decisions to mandate vaccines for the health and safety of their employees and students they serve. The freedom to make these decisions should be left up to those entities.

College and university campuses are at higher risk for outbreaks of other communicable diseases due to students attending classes or living in close quarters, increasingly geographically diverse student populations and a higher prevalence of certain diseases among younger populations. This is why most colleges and universities require the hepatitis B, meningococcal vaccines and other diseases commonly covered by routine childhood vaccinations like measles, mumps, rubella, tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis. ¹ Hundreds of these institutions are also requiring COVID-19 vaccines and boosters in order to return to the traditional college experience. ²

HB 1210 proposes to allow any employee or student to request a conscientious exemption for all vaccine mandates. If passed, this amendment would tie the hands of businesses, schools and

Dear Chairperson, Infantine and Members of the House Labor, Industrial and Rehabilitative Services Committee;

I am providing this written testimony today on behalf of the NH Nurses Association in opposition to HB 1210 an act relative to exemptions from vaccine mandates.

This bill;

- directs a private employer, postsecondary institution, or clinical site for educational programs to accept requests from employees or students for exemptions from vaccine mandates.
- prohibits an employer from requiring any medical treatment that has been approved by the Food and Drug Administration only for emergency or experimental use.

Historically, employers and educational institutions have had the right to establish requirements for their employee/students to protect the health and safety of those same individuals and all who utilize their services. The Covid-19 pandemic has exacerbated conflicting beliefs re: individual freedom and public health and safety. While this debate rages on trends in Covid-19 cases reached an all-time high in mid-January, long after we thought the pandemic would have waned in our area. Unfortunately, the majority of those hospitalized were unvaccinated.

Recent attempts to further broaden vaccine exemptions and loosen restrictions on the use of proven interventions such as vaccinations, which are being referenced in this bill as for "emergency or experimental use," to decrease the spread of Covid-19 will continue to prolong the pandemic and result in continued surges resulting in strains on healthcare resources and preventable illness and death.

In a 12/30/21 Amicus Brief from American Public Health Association, Association Of Schools And Programs Of Public Health, 12 Leading Public Health And Health Care Organizations, 30 Deans Of Leading Academic Programs, And 109 Leading Public Health And Health Policy Scholars states

"The science is also clear about the best way to combat COVID-19's spread—vaccines. All the evidence shows that vaccination significantly reduces the likelihood that workers will transmit COVID-19 and infect other workers, especially when combined with regular testing and other mitigation measures. And vaccination drastically reduces the chance of hospitalization and death. For these reasons, numerous employers have already imposed vaccine requirements, which have engendered widespread vaccination uptake and have consistently proven effective."

A vaccination mandate should be job-related and consistent with business necessity. Under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), an employer can have a workplace policy that includes "a requirement that an individual shall not pose a direct threat to the health or safety of individuals in the workplace." As your committee is aware this is consistent with the OSHA general duty clause that

requires employers to provide a work environment that is "free from recognized hazards that are causing or are likely to cause death or serious physical harm."

The increasing pressure to expand existing vaccine exemptions for religious and medical reasons to include those for conscientious objections and natural immunity endangers the public's health. Current exemptions are those considered by the CDC and other medical professional groups as "contraindications," Currently individual companies and other institutions can determine the exemptions they allow this bill while seeking to expand individual rights infringes on those rights of the public who have contraindications as defined as, "anaphylaxis" also known as a severe allergic reaction. of which the number of confirmed allergic reactions is very small, 2-5 per million cases. In rare cases a condition called myocarditis has resulted from vaccination, but this is a self-limiting condition, and the CDC recommends that when symptoms resolve it may safe to continue with the vaccine series. There is also recent evidence that suggests that individuals who are immunocompromised may in fact benefit from the vaccine to strengthen their weakened immune response.

As for "sincerely held" religious exemptions, this already exists. "Employers must keep employees safe from the virus, and must, under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and Title VII of the Civil Rights Act, offer exemptions to individuals with either a disability or "sincerely held" religious belief that prevents them from getting the vaccine. This does not have to be further defines by allowing "conscientious objector status."

Current limits on religious and medical exemptions have long standing success in maintaining the integrity of immunization science as evidenced by the near nonexistence of vaccine preventable diseases such as measles, mumps, rubella and polio. Prior to the COVID 19 pandemic there was a heightened level of concern related to vaccines including the common myth that vaccines "cause autism." Vaccination was introduced in this country in the early 1800's beginning with smallpox leading to its near eradication until the 1850s when increased misinformation led to decreased vaccine use and reoccurrence of smallpox by the 1870s. We know that outbreaks of vaccine-preventable disease often start among persons who refuse vaccination, spread rapidly within unvaccinated populations, and also spread to other subpopulations. We should learn from history and not fall into the same traps of skepticism that have endangered the public's health in earlier times. Vaccine mandates are not new. By the 1950's all 50 states had vaccine mandates for school entry while allowing for limited medical and religious exemptions.

Vaccine refusal broadened by allowing conscientious objection exemption only increases the health risk of the individual and health risks to the community. We have made substantial gains and confidence in the science around the COVID 19 pandemic including the body of evidence around vaccines. Rather than expanding exemptions we should be expanding education and information to increase public confidence to influence decision making.

Dear Committee Members,

As a 45-year resident of NH and someone who votes in every election and as a retired public health nurse with almost 40 years of community and public health experience in the Granite State, I oppose HB 1210. This law would not only put individual workers and college students at risk, but could increase risks to children, older citizens, and other vulnerable populations in the wider community. Work settings and college campuses provide an enclosed community that promotes the spread vaccine preventable diseases and could result in serious consequences including hospitalization and death. Vaccines are one of the top 10 public health success stories in our country. If public health professionals recommend vaccination of certain cohorts (whether a school population or work setting) and if the employer or college requires vaccination for the safety of everyone in that setting, then the only exemption should be for a medical contraindication (a fairly rare occurrence) or a religious exemption (even rarer, as almost all major religions have no opposition to vaccination). contractor regulation specifically permits an exception for health conditions and religious beliefs, but not for moral or other conscience reasons, is a strong indication that the federal contractor regulations permit only health and religious exemptions, not exemptions based on moral beliefs or other conscience bases.

Rep. Lang is correct that the Federal Contractor Guidance does not appear to require documentation of the disability or religious grounds for the accommodation request. However, if the employee does not have a valid disability or religious condition, they are not "legally entitled" to the accommodation. Therefore, employers protect themselves by requiring such documentation. Further, absence of an express requirement for documentation does not mean that an employer can grant an accommodation request on any grounds.

It is important to recognize that the CMS rule specifically requires employers that are subject to the CMS mandate to collect and evaluate requests for accommodation, including "the tracking and secure documentation of information provided by those staff who have requested exemption". So, even if the Federal Contractor Guidance can be interpreted to allow an accommodation for conscientious objectors (which we do not believe it does), those employers in NH that are subject to the CMS mandate (hospitals, nursing homes, health clinics, etc.).

In summary, BIA is opposing HB 1210 because we believe it is bad public policy to put constraints on private sector employers to implement health and safety measures in the workplace they deem necessary to protect their employees and customers. We further believe that this proposal will create significant conflicts for employers in New Hampshire who are currently under (or soon could be under) federal vaccine mandates.

Thank you for your consideration of BIA's concerns as you deliberate on HB 1210.

I am writing to you to express the Business & Industry's opposition to HB 1210. At the time of the public hearing, I testified that BIA was neutral pending discussions between us and the Prime Sponsor of the legislation, Representative Lang, regarding whether the language of his bill (and amendment) would create a conflict for those employers under federal vaccine mandate requirements.

Representative Lang believes it does not create a conflict. However, following our discussion with Representative Lang (which also included employment attorneys who are experts on federal and state employment law), it became clear that we respectfully disagree.

The points our employment attorneys made are:

The federal law concept of "conscientious objection" is principally embodied in the Military Selective Service Act. It provides an exemption from engaging in wartime activities and service in the military for individuals who have a "firm, fixed, and sincere objection to participation in war in any form or the bearing of arms, by reason of religious training and/or belief." I am not aware of any other body of federal law that addresses the specific term "conscientious objection" outside of the right to object to participation in wartime and military activities.

The term "conscientious objection" also is sometimes loosely used to describe rights that certain health care systems and providers (who receive federal funds) who refuse to perform certain medical procedures, such as abortions, forced sterilizations, assisted suicide, etc. However, I am not aware that those federal laws or regulations define that as "conscientious objection," though the term "conscience" is sometimes used. Rather, BIA believes that those rights flow largely from religious rights under the First Amendment.

The closest federal law we could find to this situation is 8 U.S.C. section 1182(g)(2)(C). That statute permits the U.S. Attorney General to waive the requirement that an alien have obtained certain vaccines in order to receive a visa or be admitted to the country if "the requirement of such vaccination would be contrary to the alien's religious belief or moral convictions." However, that federal law does not use the term "conscientious objection." Moreover, that law distinguishes between "religious belief" and "moral convictions" as different concepts and different bases for a vaccination waiver.

This has led BIA to believe that the overwhelming weight of federal law identifies the concept of "conscientious objection" as applying only to military service. Moreover, even if the federal law right to object based on conscience does extend beyond that context, that concept would be defined to include specific aspect of conscience, such as religious belief and moral convictions. The fact that the federal

high risk of severe illness and hospitalization if they were to get infected with the virus, including pregnant mothers, patients who are experiencing homelessness, individuals with complex chronic illnesses such as diabetes and heart disease, and cancer patients.

In addition to the danger it poses for patients, Bi-State and our members oppose HB 1210 because they must comply with the federal law to operate and serve Granite Staters through Medicare, Medicaid, and state contracts.

On November 4, 2021, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) issued an Interim Final Rule with Comment Period (IFC) requiring that health care workers at Medicare and Medicaid-certified facilities — which include community health centers, federally qualified health centers, and rural health clinics — be vaccinated against COVID-19.² As of January 19, 2022, the CMS vaccine requirement is in effect in all 50 states, Washington D.C., and the territories; and its legal status is not expected to change. The IFC also requires health centers to have a detailed set of policies and procedures relating to the CMS vaccine rules. These policies and procedures must apply to students in training who are working at health care organizations. Students training to be health care professionals receive hands-on training that includes contact with high-risk patients, including children too young to be vaccinated. Both the Medicare and Medicaid statutes contain several provisions that authorize the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) to impose requirements necessary "in the interest of the health and safety of beneficiaries." CMS contends correctly that, under the Supremacy Clause of the U.S. Constitution, this IFC "preempts inconsistent State and local laws as applied to Medicare- and Medicaid-certified providers and suppliers."

If New Hampshire's community health centers were in violation of state statute, they could be forced to shut the doors to the more than 112,000 Granite Staters who rely upon them for their primary care, substance use disorder treatment, mental health services, and pediatric care.

New Hampshire is suffering from not only our highest numbers of COVID-19 infections, hospitalizations, and deaths, but also extraordinary staffing shortages that are impacting all residents and their ability to access primary and emergency care. Staffing shortages at CHCs are not due to vaccine requirements; ~5% of their workforce is currently out sick due solely to illness from COVID-19. This does not include their health care staff who are unable to go to work because they are at home caring for a sick child, nor does it illustrate the incredible strain that working at reduced workforce capacity puts on the rest of their staff.

For these reasons and more, Bi-State Primary Care Association and our members respectfully request the Committee recommend HB 1210 be inexpedient to legislate.

Dear Chairman Infantine and Members of the House Labor, Industrial and Rehabilitative Services Committee:

Bi-State Primary Care Association and our members respectfully request HB 1210, relative to exemptions from vaccine mandates, be recommended inexpedient to legislate. Bi-State staff and our members will not attend legislative hearings due to the risk of COVID-19, and we thank you for the opportunity to submit written testimony to your committee electronically. Bi-State and our members write to you in strong opposition of HB 1210.

Bi-State Primary Care Association (Bi-State) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, formed by two health and social service leaders in 1986 to advance access to comprehensive primary care and preventive services for all, with special emphasis on those most in need in New Hampshire and Vermont. Today, Bi-State represents 28 member organizations across both states that provide comprehensive primary care services to over 300,000 patients at 146 locations. Our members include community health centers (CHCs), federally qualified health centers (FQHCs), rural health clinics (RHCs), area health education center programs, and Planned Parenthood of Northern New England. New Hampshire's 13 health centers serve approximately 112,000 patients at locations across the state, including in those districts represented by the members of the Labor, Industrial and Rehabilitative Services Committee.

Bi-State and our members oppose HB 1210 because it will eliminate Granite State employers', including health care organizations', ability to maintain safe workplaces and HB 1210 will needlessly endanger the health and welfare of patients.

Without a vaccine requirement in place, health care organizations are putting the health of their staff and their patients at grave risk, including children, who account for ~53% of COVID-19 cases in New Hampshire on January 26, 2022. The integrated services that health centers offer "all under one roof" include a wide range of pediatric services, family support programs, children's oral health, and childcare to the community. Pediatric patients make up ~25% of health centers' patient population, and many of these young patients are immunocompromised or too young to be vaccinated. Moreover, overall, a high proportion of health center patients are at

educational programs and limit their ability to enforce public health policies. Medical exemptions are a necessary component to vaccine policies. However, an objection based on conscientious or philosophical reasons- essentially allowing an easy opt out to anyone- would reverse the progress New Hampshire has made in defeating this pandemic and other previously eradicated diseases.

According to the Infectious Disease Society of America, studies demonstrate that the easier it is to receive an exemption, the higher the rate of exemptions in a particular state. As the number of exemptions increases, the risk of vaccine-preventable disease also increases. Therefore, states should make every effort to minimize the number of its citizens exempted from immunization mandates. Exemptions increase health costs by the need to investigate and control avoidable outbreaks; costs that are paid by state and federal taxpayers—the overwhelming majority of whom have chosen to be vaccinated.³

State government should not prevent a private entity from making choices based on public health and safety concerns, especially during a public health pandemic. New Futures strongly urges the committee members to vote against HB 1210.

Dear Chair Infantine and Members of the Committee:

New Futures appreciates the opportunity to testify in opposition to HB 1210, relative to exemptions from vaccine mandates. New Futures is a nonpartisan, nonprofit organization that advocates, educates, and collaborates to improve the health and wellness of all New Hampshire residents. In this role, we work extensively with policy makers, health care providers and communities to improve overall public health and health equity across the Granite State. New Futures supports public health policy measures that decrease illness and disease, including vaccines and programs that ensure equitable and broad distribution of vaccines, and other evidence-based disease reducing treatments and prophylactic courses of action.

HB 1210 directs a private employer, postsecondary institution, or clinical site for educational programs to accept requests from employees or students for exemptions from vaccine mandates. Vaccinations protect individuals and the community from the risk of severe illness and have essentially eradicated deadly diseases. They also protect those who can't get vaccinated, including infants, or people with weakened immune systems. The COVID-19 vaccine has played a significant role in changing the course of this pandemic. Time and time again, public health experts have said that widespread vaccination, including booster shots, is the best way to lessen the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic and ultimately build herd immunity. Based on that public health science and advice from medical experts, some employers, postsecondary institutions, and other entities have made decisions to mandate vaccines for the health and safety of their employees and students they serve. The freedom to make these decisions should be left up to those entities.

College and university campuses are at higher risk for outbreaks of other communicable diseases due to students attending classes or living in close quarters, increasingly geographically diverse student populations and a higher prevalence of certain diseases among younger populations. This is why most colleges and universities require the hepatitis B, meningococcal vaccines and other diseases commonly covered by routine childhood vaccinations like measles, mumps, rubella, tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis. ¹ Hundreds of these institutions are also requiring COVID-19 vaccines and boosters in order to return to the traditional college experience. ²

HB 1210 proposes to allow any employee or student to request a conscientious exemption for all vaccine mandates. If passed, this amendment would tie the hands of businesses, schools and

This bill directs a private employer, postsecondary institution, or clinical site for educational programs to accept requests from employees or students for exemptions from vaccine mandates.
