Rep. Gregg Hough introduced the bill. This bill requires worker's comp to cover adverse reactions to employer mandated vaccinations.

Rep. Turcotte: Why did you just limit this to COVID-19

Rep. Hough: I would welcome an amendment to broaden that to cover any vaccine.

Rep. Turcotte: How could one determine if the adverse reaction was caused by the vaccine?

Rep. Hough: That would ultimately have to be determined by a physician.

Deputy Commissioner of Labor Rudy Odgen commented that that under existing law people can go for worker's comp on an adverse reaction to a vaccine. It might be good to put in a presumptive clause as in the PTSD section for first responders.

Rep Prout: What proof is required to show the vaccine is required by the employer?

Deputy Commissioner Odgen: Even just a recommendation or incentive is considered enough under existing law. It doesn't have to be a mandate.

Rep Sullivan: You referred to adverse reactions. Who determines if it is an adverse reaction or just a coincidence.

Deputy Commissioner Odgen: A medical professional would need to be consulted

Rep. Infantine: Where is the presumptive language found?

Deputy Commissioner Odgen: RSA 281-A:17 is one place. There are several different places similar language appears

Rep. Infantine: to prevent arguments as to whether it was actually an adverse reaction what language would help.

Deputy Commissioner Odgen: The use of Shall would make it more definite.

Rep. Cahill: If 6 months after vaccination someone had a heart attack could that be considered an adverse reaction to the vaccine?

Deputy Commissioner Odgen: There would have to have been some adverse reaction earlier.

Laura Condon testified as to some concerns with the bill. The 14 day requirement for a reaction to be considered an adverse reaction is too short. Perhaps this bill should be modelled after the national vaccine adverse one that provides up to 3 years to submit the case. The insurance companies have noticed an increase in deaths of working age people and these are not COVID deaths. Could they be vaccine related? I am not sure this bill is needed, but if you pursue it, it should be extended to 3 years and also cover disability and death.

***Paula Minnehan of the NH Hospital Association** testified against the bill. He does not think this bill is necessary.

hired, or during an epidemic tells the worker that unless they are vaccinated they cannot work until the epidemic is over.” Larson, *Workers’ Compensation Law*, Section 27.03[2], p.26 (1995). Current law in New Hampshire sets forth the contours of a workplace injury and these statutory principles have been developed over decades of case law. As such, a separate provision just dealing with vaccines is unnecessary.

However, not only is this unnecessary, but we are concerned that the language in the proposed bill is confusing and seems at odds with established NH workers’ compensation law. For example, allowing workers’ compensation benefits for “any trauma...or condition” allegedly caused by the vaccine would seem to open the door to allowing workers to receive benefits for any self-alleged trauma or condition. This would be a large departure from common established law that a claimant prove an actual “personal injury” or “occupational disease” to receive workers’ compensation benefits.

Allowing recovery for “trauma” or “condition” also violates well-established state workers’ compensation law that there can be no workers’ compensation recovery for mere mental stress without an accompanying physical injury. As set forth in section 281-A:2 XI of the workers’ compensation law, “Injury or personal injury does not include diseases or death resulting from stress without physical manifestation...” The ban on recovery for mere mental stress without accompanying physical injury is well-established under workers’ compensation law and is a critical and reasonable requirement to ensure that mental stress claims are legitimate and work-related. Allowing recovery for mere “trauma” could increase costs for New Hampshire employers for non-work-related mental stress claims.

Respectfully, and for the reasons set forth above, APCIA must oppose HB 1352 due to the potentially significant adverse impact on businesses in the state. We would welcome the opportunity to discuss this issue further should there be questions or if additional information is needed.

Dear Chairman Infantine,

The American Property Casualty Insurance Association (APCIA)¹ is a leading national property/casualty trade association representing nearly 60% of the property/casualty market nationwide. We are writing to respectfully express our **opposition to HB 1352**, which would provide that an employee’s adverse reaction to a COVID-19 vaccine would be deemed an occupational disease and thus compensable under workers’ compensation. This legislation could have a negative impact on employers who could potentially see increased workers’ compensation costs as a result.

We believe that creating a separate specific statutory provision to cover adverse reactions to vaccines is simply unnecessary and could result in unintended consequences. As you know, the workers’ compensation system in New Hampshire has operated effectively for over a century, and separate statutory provisions do not currently exist for every workplace injury or disease deeming it to be compensable under workers’ compensation. The definition of “personal injury” adequately covers the scope of workplace injuries covered by workers’ compensation: “‘Injury’ or ‘personal injury’ means accidental injury or death arising out of and in the course of employment, or any occupational disease or resulting death arising out of and in the course of employment.” RSA 281-A:2 XI. No compelling reason justifies overturning a century of practice by now adding new sections to the workers’ compensation law to cover specific injuries.

In fact, it is important to point out that under established law, a worker who was required to receive a vaccine as part of employment and then developed a legitimate disease from the vaccine should be covered. As stated by Professor Larson in his seminal workers’ compensation treatise, injuries resulting from employer-mandated vaccines are compensable under workers’ compensation: “When inoculation is occasioned by the particular conditions of employment, injury resulting from inoculation should be deemed to have occurred in the course of employment. If there is an element of actual compulsion emanating from the employer, the work connection is beyond question, as when the company requires the employee to submit to vaccination by the company’s doctor as soon as the employee is

Many businesses are choosing not to impose any vaccine mandate even if COVID-19 vaccines eventually obtain FDA approval and are made available. This may be very wise avoidance of liability for illness, disability, and death caused by such vaccine mandates. Many people are unaware of the **National Childhood Vaccine Injury Act of 1986** that acknowledged vaccine injury and deaths, provided a compensation program for those who are injured and killed, provided advisory committees, and largely shields vaccine manufacturers and administrators from liability for harm caused by vaccines.

While this federal law may shield vaccine manufacturers and vaccine administrators from liability for harm and death caused by vaccinations, **this federal law does not provide immunity from liability protection for private business, organizations, schools, or associations who may attempt to independently impose their own vaccine requirements, absent any law requiring they do so.** I understand that many may at first think that vaccines are “safe and effective” and mandating their use would protect their employees, customers, patrons, and guests from harm of viral illness, but the science and reality is much more complicated than that simple sales pitch. And as vaccines such as the COVID shots are associated with known and unknown risks, they are not a benign safety device like perhaps a hard hat on a construction site. **Those who independently mandate the use of COVID-19 vaccines will assume the liability for harm that results from such mandates.**

One might think the **PREP Act** provides immunity from liability for all COVID-19 Vaccinators, but that’s not true either. <https://www.phe.gov/emergency/events/COVID19/COVIDvaccinators/Pages/PREP-Act-Immunity-from-Liability-for-COVID-19-Vaccinators.aspx>

While the PREP Act provides immunity from liability for licensed health professionals authorized to administer COVID vaccines and certain other individuals identified by HHS to administer COVID vaccines, no such immunity from liability has been extended to any and all types of businesses who may impose a COVID vaccine mandate. I can’t imagine why any business would want to assume the liability of harm to their employees for these vaccines.

Is this bill even necessary? I see nothing in statute that would prevent the payment of workers compensation claims for all employer workplace mandates, including a vaccine mandate. While vaccine mandates are new requirements, there is no provision that would exclude workers compensation coverage for vaccine injury. This bill, while well intended may in fact limit existing workers compensation coverage.

Inquiry to the NH Insurance Department some months ago yielded a non-committal response, given the newness of this issue it was expected that as employees file claims, if there is any dispute about coverage that the matter would go to a hearing and they would look to statute for guidance. Absent any statute limiting or preventing coverage for a workplace requirement that injures, it seems reasonable to believe these vaccine injury claims would already be covered by workers compensation. And employers who impose these Covid vaccine mandates may **pray that there is workers compensation coverage**, as it certainly would be expected that an injured employee would have a civil case against his/her employer for imposing a vaccine mandate that caused harm, disability, or death.

Again, I cannot imagine why any business would take on the huge liability of COVID vaccine mandates when they could simply encourage their employees to get vaccinated.

So again, I’m not convinced that this bill is needed, but if you are to consider it, at the very least the time frame for filing a claim for injury should be extended to **three years**, the same time frame for filing a claim in

medications, treatments, symptoms, outcome, etc.) (See attached VAERS report on a 15-year old Bedford boy for an example of the detail provided.)

Whereas the death claims from COVID are a simple number proclamation..."two deaths today" with ZERO information, no ability for the family to dispute it, and no mechanism for verification.

But the numbers are worse than reported in VAERS. #1, that is a passive reporting system and even doctors who are required by federal law to report often refuse to do so and there is no financial or criminal penalty for their failure to report...though there should be.

It's not just the passive nature of the VAERS reporting system that reflects much less than accurate numbers, especially with the COVID shots.

With the COVID shots, the CDC rolled out V-Safe...a cellphone based adverse effect reporting system designed for use by employees, especially healthcare workers. This system has significant flaws:

1. The participant cannot detail their adverse reactions. They must respond to the multiple choice responses pre-provided for them. There is no opportunity in V-Safe for the injured party to provide additional, relevant, and important information. This results in a very deficient system that does not fully reflect the adverse effects and injuries that are experienced.
2. The V-Safe program is separate from VAERS and not included in the VAERS numbers. So when I present you with VAERS numbers, be aware that they do not include those vaccine victims that reported to a different, separate system.
3. Many who report to V-Safe are unaware that this information is not also entered into VAERS.
4. The V-Safe data is hidden from the public and inaccessible, unlike VAERS.

The insurance industry is noticing an increase in death claims this past year in the working age population, not those over age 80.

Earlier this month the life insurance CEO from OneAmerica Life in Indiana reported that deaths are up 40% among people ages 18-64 and most of the claims for deaths being filed are not being classified as covid deaths. What is killing our working age population in such great numbers this past year?

It is unlikely that an employer can legally mandate COVID shots today. But that doesn't stop many from imposing mandates and coercing employees to submit to vaccination.

Vaccines made available under Emergency Use Authorization cannot be mandated per federal law that guides EUA. Only the Pfizer Comirnaty vaccine has FDA approval and it is not even available to the public. Only the EUA authorized formulations are available to the public.

I am a volunteer NH Director of Advocacy for the National Vaccine Information Center. We are a non-profit that provides educational, resource, and advocacy services to support informed consent for vaccines. I have served in this capacity for a decade. www.nvic.org

While it is clear that this bill has good intentions and I very much appreciate the efforts of the sponsors, I have concerns with the bill that as written would actually limit and reduce workers compensation protections already available to employees subject to Covid vaccine mandates who are later injured or killed by these mandatory shots.

Specifically my concerns are:

1. The 14-day limit for an injury claim will deny many any rightful compensation. Having worked with the vaccine injured for many, many years I can attest that many do not immediately recognize the symptoms of vaccine injury. Fourteen days can easily pass before the connection is made. A person may experience back or shoulder pain that they do not recognize as vaccine related and perhaps a symptom of myocarditis until after 14 days...yet they may later suffer a heart attack, serious heart damage, or death. OpenVAERS shows 110 deaths reported on day 28 after vaccination. <https://openvaers.com/covid-data>

Please consider making modest changes to HB1352 and then supporting this bill. Consider changes to:

- 1) Not assign liability in the absence of a mandate
- 2) Not assign liability for trauma (which may include post traumatic stress) without physical manifestation
- 3) Consider removing or modifying proposed 281-A:16-a which includes a 14 day window for adverse reactions.

Worker's compensation provides for compensation of employees who are injured or harmed by conditions inherent in the workplace. This bill would extend this compensation to include harm that arises as a result of a mandated COVID-19 vaccine. In cases where the vaccine is mandated as a condition of employment, the impacts of proven harm - even if rare should be borne by the party that requires the positive action that results in the harm.

However, this bill also requires the employer liability under workers compensation even in cases where no mandate exists when the employer simply "281-A:16-a c)Provides a bonus or other additional compensation to an employee who receives a COVID-19 vaccination. "

This provision is paternalistic and assigns liability in cases where employees considered options and made a choice to receive a vaccine. As written, this could be seen to apply even for cases where an employer provides compensated paid time off to allow employees to voluntarily receive a vaccine in the absence of a mandate.

In addition, the explicit inclusion of trauma will likely be seen to apply to emotional stress. Existing workers compensation language generally excludes such conditions without physical manifestations under RSA 281-A:2 XI. Allowing this provision to extend to trauma that may include emotional stress is likely to be extended and ultimately make workers compensation unworkable for other conditions that result in employee emotional trauma. While I agree this specific case is somewhat unique, the difficulty in objectively measuring harm makes this a troubling provision for future extension.

Finally, it appears that the language which may have been added in proposed 281-A:16-a to strengthen a presumption of harm as a result of the vaccine needlessly limits potential window of harm. Existing language in 281-A:19 provides a 2 year window for notice of injury for other occupational related injuries and while this language would still remain, its not clear that we understand the time window of potential harm sufficiently to limit (or potentially be seen to intend to limit) the presumption of harm to only a 14 day window after the vaccine.

New Hampshire relies heavily on CHCs to provide an array of health care services that the State itself is unable to provide. For example, the State of New Hampshire relies on nonprofit organizations like the FQHCs to provide health care services to pregnant women and children through a Title V block grant. Additionally, Bi-State and the health centers work with the State to ensure access to medication-assisted treatment for pregnant and postpartum patients. How would the State provide these services otherwise? Where would the 112,000 health center patients turn for their health care needs?

New Hampshire is suffering from not only our highest numbers of COVID-19 infections, hospitalizations, and deaths, but also extraordinary staffing shortages that are impacting all residents and their ability to access primary and emergency care. Staffing shortages at CHCs are *not* due to vaccine requirements; ~5% of their workforce is currently out sick due solely to illness from COVID-19. This does not include their health care staff who are unable to go to work because they are at home caring for a sick child, nor does it illustrate the incredible strain that working at reduced workforce capacity puts on the rest of their staff.

Without a vaccine requirement or mitigation measures for those who are unvaccinated and receive accommodations in place, health care organizations are putting the health of their staff and their patients at grave risk, including children, who account for ~53% of COVID-19 cases in New Hampshire on January 26, 2022.¹ The integrated services that health centers offer "all under one roof" include a wide range of pediatric services, family support programs, children's oral health care, and childcare to the community. Pediatric patients make up ~25% of health centers' patient population, and many of these young patients are immunocompromised or too young to be vaccinated. Moreover, overall, a high proportion of health center patients are at high risk of severe illness and hospitalization if they were to get infected with the virus, including pregnant mothers, patients who are experiencing homelessness, individuals with complex chronic illnesses such as diabetes and heart disease, and cancer patients.

In addition to the danger it poses for patients, Bi-State and our members oppose HB 1352 because they must comply with the federal law to operate and serve Granite Staters through Medicare, Medicaid, and state contracts.

On November 4, 2021, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) issued an Interim Final Rule with Comment Period (IFC) requiring that health care workers at Medicare and Medicaid-certified facilities – which include community health centers, federally qualified health centers, and rural health clinics – be vaccinated against COVID-19.² As of January 19, 2022, the CMS vaccine requirement is in effect in all 50 states, Washington D.C., and the territories; and its legal status is not expected to change. The IFC also requires health centers to have a detailed set of policies and procedures relating to the CMS vaccine rules. These policies and procedures must apply to students in training who are working at health care organizations. Students training to be health care professionals receive hands-on training that includes contact with high-risk patients, including children too young to be vaccinated. Both the Medicare and Medicaid statutes contain several provisions that authorize the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) to impose requirements necessary "in the interest of the health and safety of beneficiaries." CMS contends correctly that, under the Supremacy Clause of the U.S. Constitution, this IFC "preempts inconsistent State and local laws as applied to Medicare- and Medicaid-certified providers and suppliers."

If New Hampshire's community health centers were in violation of state statute, they could be forced to shut the doors to the more than 112,000 Granite Staters who rely upon them for their primary care, substance use disorder treatment, mental health services, and pediatric care.

Testimony

Good afternoon, Mr. Chairman, and members of the committee. My name is Paula Minnehan, Senior Vice President, State Government Relations with the New Hampshire Hospital Association (NHHA), representing all 26 of the state's community hospitals as well as all specialty hospitals.

The NHHA has concerns with HB 1352. The bill before you would provide that an adverse reaction to an employer-mandated COVID-19 vaccination shall be deemed to be an occupational disease for the purpose of determining eligibility for workers' compensation.

We question if this bill is even necessary. It is our understanding that current law already allows for an individual to file a worker's compensation claim if they had an adverse reaction to a employer-required vaccine. What is confusing about this bill is I. (b) and I. (c). Why would an employee file a worker's compensation claim if an employer "imposes additional requirementswho declines to receive a COVID-19 vaccination or "provides a bonus.....to an employee who receives a COVID-19 vaccination".

The definition of "adverse reaction" is also challenging as it states that the "....adverse reaction occurs within 14 days of administration of the vaccination." It is unclear why the bill states "within 14 days of administration of the vaccination".

We believe this bill is not necessary because an employee can already file a worker's compensation claim under I. (a) of the bill. The rest of the bill is confusing and not relevant to worker's compensation.

For these reasons we do not support HB 1352-FN, and we urge the committee to find this bill Inexpedient to Legislate. Thank you for the opportunity to provide our comments on HB 1352-FN.
