House Bill 1443 is a bill AN ACT proclaiming the first Monday of March as COVID-19 Victims and Survivors Memorial Day.

Today we are mourning, in fact everyday we are mourning. New Hampshire has lost 2,260 citizens since March 3, 2020. It's been less than two years since this global pandemic has claimed 904,144 American lives.

We have experienced national, statewide, community and familial traumas due to the devastation of COVID-19. In our collective efforts to save lives we have foregone some of the ways we traditionally mourn our dead. Funerals, celebrations of life, wakes, sitting shiva, being together to honor those who have passed have all been transformed by our collective efforts to stop the spread of this virus.

A day of memorial is a formal and annual acknowledgement of the reality of that trauma. In 2015 the Funeral and Memorial Information Council commissioned a Harris Poll of American adults over the age of 20 and found that 82% of those surveyed said that a service was helpful in paying tribute to or commemorating the life of a friend or family member and 72% believed services of commemoration were an important part of that healing process.

We honor those who are taken in tragedy with memorials, it helps us heal, it helps us collectively grieve and collectively remember. Respectfully I ask that you find HB 1443 Ought To Pass

- I. SARS-CoV-2 (COVID-19) is an easily transmissible viral illness that has created a global pandemic which has had catastrophic effects on human life, our country, our state, our communities, our schools, our nursing homes, our assisted living communities, our hospitals, our businesses, our places of worship, and our economy.
- II. COVID-19 has taken over a thousand lives in New Hampshire, sickened and hospitalized thousands more, and continues to affect many of its victims with long-term neurological damage, cardiorespiratory damage, and/or lingering side effects that impact their quality of life.
- III. Each life lost or changed forever by COVID-19 represents an incalculable loss to the individuals and families directly affected as well as to their friends and their communities.
- IV. Every New Hampshire resident who has lived through COVID-19 has been affected physically, emotionally, economically, or in some other way by the pandemic.
- V. The month of March is the same month the first confirmed case of COVID-19 was detected in New Hampshire in 2020.
- 2 New Section; COVID-19 Victims and Survivors Memorial Day. Amend RSA 4 by inserting after section 4:13-cc the following new section:
 - 4:13-dd COVID-19 Victims and Survivors Memorial Day.
- I. The governor shall proclaim the first Monday in March of each year as COVID-19 Victims and Survivors Memorial Day.
- II. The proclamation issued by the governor shall call on the people of New Hampshire to observe the day with appropriate ceremonies and activities and shall urge all state agencies and academic institutions, and interested organizations, groups, and individuals, to fly the flag of the United States at half-staff on the first Monday in March in honor of the individuals who died or whose lives were otherwise impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 25 3 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
